BOISE, Idaho (AP) — The fifth bishop of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Boise, the Most Rev. James J. Byrne, S.T.D., will be installed here Wednesday.

The new leader of Idaho's Catholics will arrive by airplane Monday and be presented on the steps of St. John's Cathedral shortly afterward.

Following his installation, a banquet and a civic reception will be held in his honor. The Most Rev. Edward D. Howard, D.D., archbishop of Portland, Ore., will install Bishop Byrne.

Top Party Candidates Chart Campaign Plans

Democrats Adlai Stevenson and Estes Kefauver charted campaign strategy Saturday and Vice President Nixon did some preliminary planning on the Republican campaign, noting that "the other side is starting early."

Stevenson and Kefauver got together at Stevenson's Libertyville, Ill., farm preliminary to embarking next week on a series of face-to-face conferences with Democratic leaders in 24 states.

When the two men greeted men, Stevenson took a crack at Nixon, saying:

"I don't know whether President Eisenhower wanted Nixon as his running mate again. . . But certainly the Republican bosses wanted him on the ticket and he was put on."

"In Sen. Kefauver's case, it was just the opposite and he was chosen in a fair and open convention."

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Ike's Game Off But Mood Still Happy

PEBBLE BEACH, Calif. (AP) — President Eisenhower, pictured by his doctor as "looking right," played the Cypress Point golf course in fog and mist Saturday—and muttered "that's a louse" when he got off a bad shot.

The President was in a happy and relaxed mood and he stayed that way even after taking a two-over-par six on the 418-yard first hole.

This was the second full day of Eisenhower's vacation at the exclusive Cypress Point club on the Pacific Ocean shore after his nomination for a second term in the Politics continued to take a back seat here as the President got off to an early start on the golf course.

"How has he been feeling?" a newsman asked the White House physician, Maj. Gen. Howard M. Snyder.

"Look at him," Snyder replied. "He's looking right as far as I can see. He came in without being fatigued after 18 holes yesterday, and that's all right."

This was the first time the President has played a full 18-holes since he underwent emergency abdominal surgery June 9.

And Saturday was the first time newsmen were allowed to watch Eisenhower golf since the operation. His game was a bit rusty but he appeared to be swinging with as much gusto as ever and there was no indication of any discomfort.

The President also played 18 holes Saturday. There was no immediate word as to his score.

Rescued Flier Recovering

LA GRANDE, Ore. (AP) — A pilot injured in a plane crash that killed his wife in a wilderness canyon northeast of here was recovering in a hospital here Saturday.

The doctor who is treating Vernon Enger, 34, of Vancouver, Wash., and Portland, called him a "remarkably tough fellow."

Enger's wife, Ruth, 32, died outright early Sunday as Enger piloted his plane toward Idaho on a weekend flight. Enger was trapped in the wreckage a day before he cut his way out with pocket knife.

Unable to walk, he crawled to gather wood and started fires that eventually led to his rescue Friday. A search for the couple did not start until the plane was reported missing Wednesday. They had filed no flight plan.

Enger, who lives in Vancouver, has three children. He operates a garage and a service station in Portland.

25-Day Strike Of Aluminum Plants Ends

WASHINGTON (AP) — Union and company negotiators Saturday night announced the end of the 25 day strike by 9,000 workers of the Reynolds Metals Co.

Charles J. Smith, chief negotiator for the United Steel Workers, and Frank Weikel, director of labor relations for Reynolds, said in a joint statement the workers could return to their jobs Monday or as soon thereafter as the plants are ready to resume production.

The new contract calls for 45.6 cents per hour package increase over a three year period.

Smith said the three-year contract is virtually the same as the contract recently negotiated with the Aluminum Company of America (Alcoa).

It calls for an immediate 9 1/2 cents an hour increase across the board. Beginning Aug. 1, 1957, there will be a further across-the-board increase of 7 cents per hour and 5 cents an hour increase Aug. 1, 1958.

Affected by the strike, which began Aug. 1, were Reynolds plants at Troutdale, Ore.; Phoenix, Ariz.; McCook, Ill.; LaGrange, Ark.; Jones Mill, Ark.; Arkadelphia, Ark.; Hurricane Creek, Ark.; Bauxite, Ark., and Corpus Christi, Tex.

Billion Dollar Surplus for U. S. Treasury Predicted

WASHINGTON (AP) — A well-placed source said Saturday the government may be in a position soon to forecast a budget surplus of "something under a billion dollars" for June 30, 1957.

This would be well under the nearly two billion indicated by some congressional sources but about double the 435-million-dollar surplus President Eisenhower figured on in his budget message to Congress last January.

The administration is revising its income and spending estimates next week. The administration source said he would be "surprised if the mid-year revision will indicate a surplus of as much as a billion dollars."

There was a surplus of \$1,541,357,066 on last June 30, the end of fiscal 1956. It was used to reduce the national debt.

Two things now appear certain: both income and spending will be higher than for the 1956 fiscal year.

With personal income at a new high and corporation profits running close to the record pace of last year, the government's take appears certain to set new record. For the first time it may top 70 billion dollars. This would be nearly two billion higher than the \$68,141,000,000 chalked up in the 1956 fiscal year.

At the same time, spending is expected to move up sharply for the second straight year. Final figures showed the government spent \$66,396,000,000 in fiscal 1956. The Budget Bureau's revised estimates next week will show a much higher spending outlook for 1957.
