Okinawa Reels Under Blow

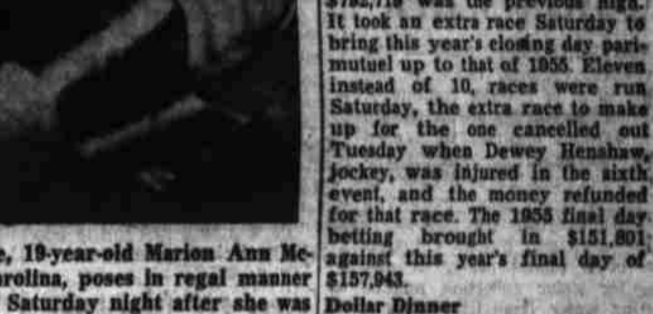
