## Mapping Flights Between Alaska, Russia by U.S., Soviet Planes Proposed

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20 (AP)—A-1 shuttle flights between Alaska and Russia by American and Soviet photo mapping planes were proposed by the United States today as part of the International Geophysical Year starting in 1957.

The Russians are expected to accept, inasmuch as their scientists helped advance the proposal at informal discussions already held.

The proposal made by the State Department today calls for weekly flights, with Soviet and American planes, alternating, between Nome, Alaska, and Murmansk, Russia, to photograph the polar ice pack.

Purely Scientific  
The flights, described as strictly nonpolitical and purely scientific, would start in March and continue through next September, taking advantage of the period of maximum sunlight in the arctic.

In a note delivered to the Soviet Embassy yesterday and made public by the State Department today, the United States proposed that the flights be made "along routes and under such operating conditions as agreed upon by our two governments."

The route from Nome to Murmansk, which is near the arctic tip of the Scandinavian peninsula, would bisect a great circle around the North Pole and cover roughly 3,000 miles. Officials said three or four four-engine planes would be needed for the American share of the operation. They said the planes would not necessarily have to be military craft.

Worldwide Projects  
The International Geophysical Year is a worldwide project during which scientists of 41 nations, including Russia and other Communist countries, will coordinate special observations as the most comprehensive study yet made of the earth, its oceans and the atmosphere above.

Worldwide improvements in navigation and weather forecasting are among the hoped-for results.

This study of the arctic ice cap is designed to determine its exact boundaries and how it reacts to tides and winds.

## \$20,321 Paid For Political Travels of Ike

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20 (AP)—The White House said today that the Republican National Committee has paid out \$20,321 so far for political travels of President Eisenhower in the 1956 campaign.

Most of this was for the use of government equipment, including the presidential plane Columbine III.

White House press secretary James C. Hagerty told reporters the GOP is meeting all such expenses and "I would be curious to see if this was ever done by any other administration in a campaign."

"I do not know whether this was done in past years," Hagerty said, "but I do know it will be done this year."

And, he said, starting with Eisenhower's flight to Iowa today, the National Committee is paying the U.S. Treasury in advance of the trip.

Hagerty said that for this trip a check for \$5,071 already has been turned over to the Treasury while an additional \$50 has been put up for the food the President and his party will consume aboard the Columbine.

The arrangement on the Columbine, Hagerty said, is under exactly the same sort of contract newsmen have in chartering a commercial plane. That means, Hagerty said, that the charges are based on mileage rather than hours.

## Rise in U.S. Capital Juvenile Problems Laid to Integration

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20 (AP)—Two Washington school principals told racial integration of their schools was followed by a marked upturn in police calls, student pregnancies and disciplinary problems.

The school administrators gave their testimony at the second day of public hearings by a House District of Columbia subcommittee which is investigating the effect of integration on schools in the nation's capital.

Wilmer Bennett, principal of Hines Junior High School, said that after his school was integrated in the fall of 1954 there were "more fights, theft . . . bad language . . . loiterers."

And he said there were 10 student pregnancies at the school last year, compared with two or three during the first year of integration. He was not asked the race of the girls who became pregnant.

Arthur Storey, principal of Macfarland Junior High School, testified that since his school was integrated he has had to call police as often as 50 times a year.

He said his problems included "boys feeling girls," fighting and the carrying of knives by students.

But Storey said his disciplinary problems cannot be attributed entirely to integration.

A fourth-grade teacher, Mrs. Dorothy Denton, told the subcommittee she believes white residents will move out of predominantly Negro school districts and that in effect "the time will come when the schools will be segregated again."

"In my opinion," she said, "integration has lowered standards of education in the District."

She said some of her pupils can read no more than 25 or 30 words.

## Steam Threshers Plan Harvest Bee

COLTON, Wash., Sept. 20 (AP)—Pages of the calendar will be flipped back Sunday when members of the Western Steam Threshing Assn. operate noisy steam threshing machines on the farm of Chris Busch, near here.

Some 250 steam fiends, some from as far away as Michigan and Ohio, are expected to watch as the noisy old threshers, dating back to 1912, turn over. In keeping with the old fashioned atmosphere, a horse drawn water wagon will be used.

The association will hold a business meeting on the eve of the threshing bee.

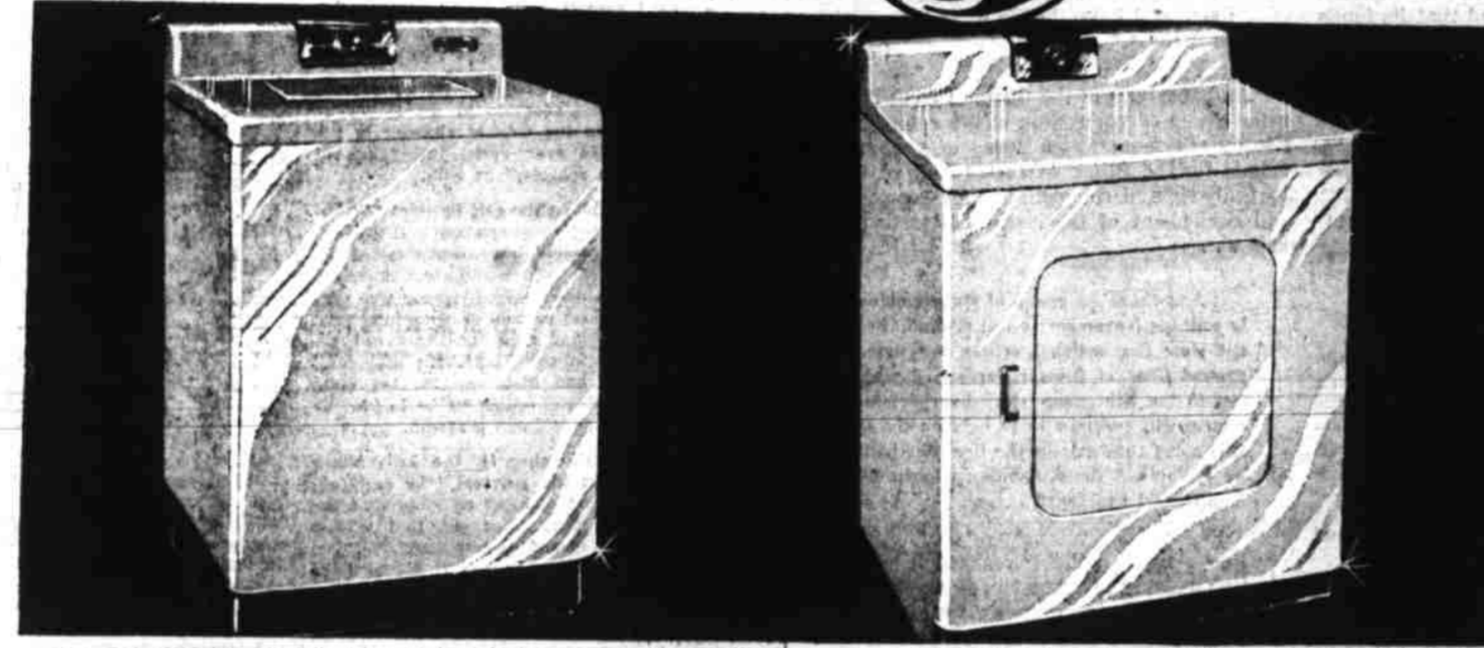

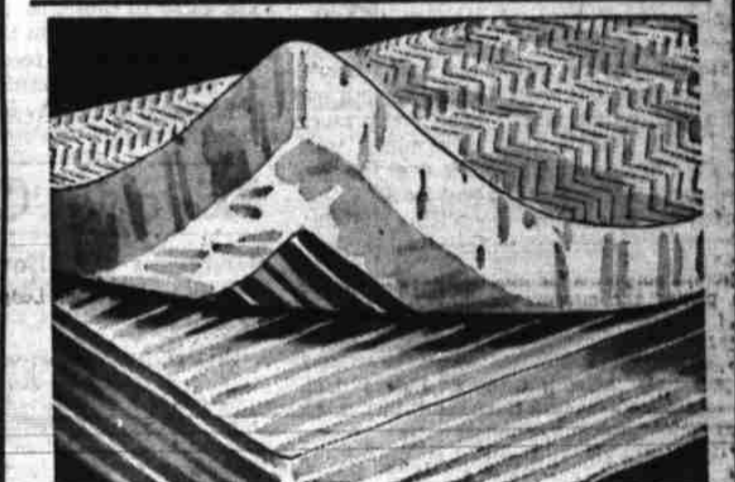

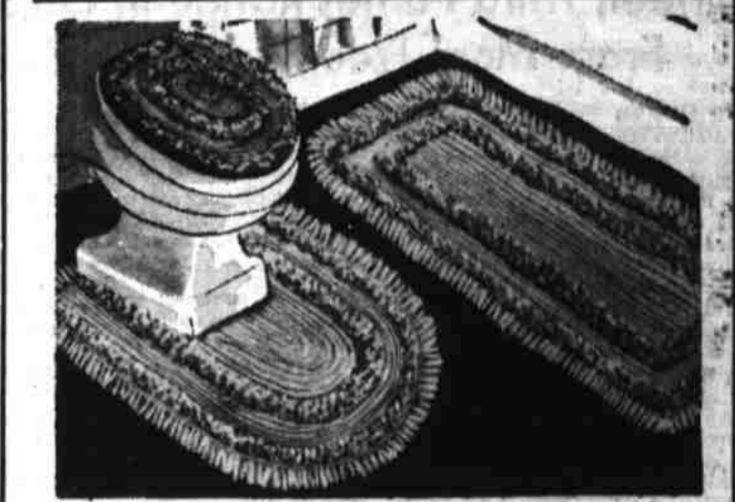
