at Winchester Bay is good. Salmon and cutthroat angling is fair in tide-water area of lower Umpqua. Salmon angling at Coos Bay remains fair to good whenever weather allows fishing. There are a lot of jacks being taken out of the Coquille river in the Prosper-Parkensburg area. A few sea-run cutthroats are now being taken in the Milliloma river. Sitoum lake cutthroat angling is good on troll. Tahkenitch lake perch and bluegill angling is good.

**CENTRAL**  
Angling has been slow at East and Paulina lakes, but fly fishing in the evening for eastern brook trout at East lake has been good. Crater lake has been very good. Gold lake is good. Odell lake is good with several catches of large mackinaw reported. Davis lake is only fair. Marilyn and Rosary lakes have been producing fair catches of eastern brook trout. Crane Prairie reservoir has been good with lots of bluegill being caught. Cullis river is the best spot. Nice catches have been taken from Big Lava lake. Fish are beginning to hit good on Wob-rites.

**NORTHEAST**  
The Wallawa and Imnaha rivers continue to produce good catches of rainbow on both flies and bait. A few large rainbows are being caught in Wallawa lake with bait. High lakes in the Wallawas remain accessible, and fly fishing should now be at its best. Fish lake in Baker county is producing limits on flies. Steelhead are being taken on the lower Grande Ronde river near Troy. Good catches of large channel catfish have recently been made on the Snake river in the Dug Bar area. John Day area streams have been fair. Strawberry lake has produced good catches on deep troll.

**SOUTHEAST**  
Malthus reservoir is good. Beulah reservoir and the spillway below Beulah are good, and trout are being caught up to 16 inches long. Snake river is fair for small bass. Blitzen river is good, and Fish lake (Harney county) good.

# Janowicz Has 'Little Chance'

**'Skins Not Counting On Vic Returning**

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20 (AP)—George Preston Marshall, owner of the Washington Redskins, said today there is almost no chance that injured halfback Vic Janowicz will be able to play this year for his National Football League club.

Janowicz suffered a severe concussion in an automobile accident last month at Los Angeles, after the Redskins opened their exhibition season with a victory over that city's Rams.

With Quarterback Al Dorow also sidelined by injuries—and No. 1 passer Eddie LeBaron just back in action—the Redskins have had a hard time winning ever since. They lost last Sunday to arch neighborhood rivals, the Baltimore Colts. Janowicz, former Ohio State All America, was second high scorer in the league with 88 points last year and led the Redskins in ground gaining. He figured high in Washington's hopes for this season.

The 190-pound back is still in a Los Angeles hospital. "He's due to be released this weekend and return to Washington for further treatment, but Marshall told a luncheon given the Redskins by the Washington Touchdown Club "it doesn't look good."

# Georgia Tech, Kentucky Meet in TV Game Saturday

LEXINGTON, Ky., Sept. 20 (AP)—Georgia Tech, fingered as the south-eastern's football best, tangles with a darkhorse challenger Saturday and Tech chieftain Bobby Dodd vows he can't afford to point for Kentucky.

These principals inaugurate a new season at Lexington before a national television audience (NBC) and a near capacity turnout of 36,000. Game time is 2:30 p.m. (central daylight or eastern standard time).

The game will be carried by KPTV, Channel 27, Portland, Ore., at 11:15 a.m.

Tech, like Kentucky, is up to its neck in SEC opposition, eight league foes standing between the Engineers and the pennant. Dixie Doppers figure to fly in Atlanta this fall. Asked if he had any special plans to counter Kentucky's challenge or get his seasoned squad up for the opener, Dodd replied:

"No, with the schedule we have this fall we will have to play them one game at a time and not try to be up more for one opponent than another. There isn't that much difference between them."

Tech counts 19 returnees from the first two teams that posted a

1955 mark of eight victories, one loss and one tie plus the Sugar Bowl championship. Its line, says Dodd, is only average for the league but the backs are talented and plentiful.

"We certainly are not underrating Kentucky," Dodd commented.

Cochair Blanton Collier, who leans to the belief Tech is the circuit's muscleman, asserts "we'll try to make a contest of it. Tech is the second best team in the country and I'm afraid we don't have the equipment to do it."

Kentucky and Tech primarily feature a ground game. The Wildcats operate a split T type of offense, Tech the spread T featuring its famed belly series.

Graduation took Kentucky's passing duo of Bob Hardy for All-America end Howard Schnellenberger but returning are tackle Lou Mochales and center Dave Kuhn, certain to attract national attention.

and fullback Bob Dougherty spirited and trimmed to a solid 210 pounds.

Tech lost only reserves in its backfield but will miss guard Franklin Brooks, the Sugar Bowl's outstanding player, and center Jimmy Morris. Key personnel include tackle Carl Vereen, halfback George Volkert and quarterback Wade Mitchell, currently a doubtful performer because of a shoulder injury.

The clubs last met in 1954, Kentucky pouncing out a 12-6 upset that was the turning point in its season and a blockade to Tech's possible tie for the southeastern title.


