The death of Mrs. Myers followed that of her twin sister, Mrs. Fred Wied by three weeks and a day. The latter was killed in an auto-train crash near Jefferson.

Services will be held Saturday at 2 p.m. at the Jefferson Christian Church. Burial will be at St. Masonic Cemetery. Fisher Mortuary, Albany, is making arrangements.

The deceased was born June 26, 1878, near Scio. She had lived in Portland and Brownsville before moving to Jefferson 14 years ago. She had never married.

Courthouse Sinking Fund Up to Voters
