The board of directors at their last meeting applied for a \$100,000 loan to hasten the erection of a second wing in order that more children can be housed. Mrs. Fischer states "The Home has been blessed far beyond our fondest dreams. We still need the prayers and various assistance that many can give. To long has society put our reliance on the 'forgotten' list." Mrs. Clarence Kraft, representing the Salem Association for the Battered, will show the film "Tuesday's Child." She will comment and also have a question and answer period.

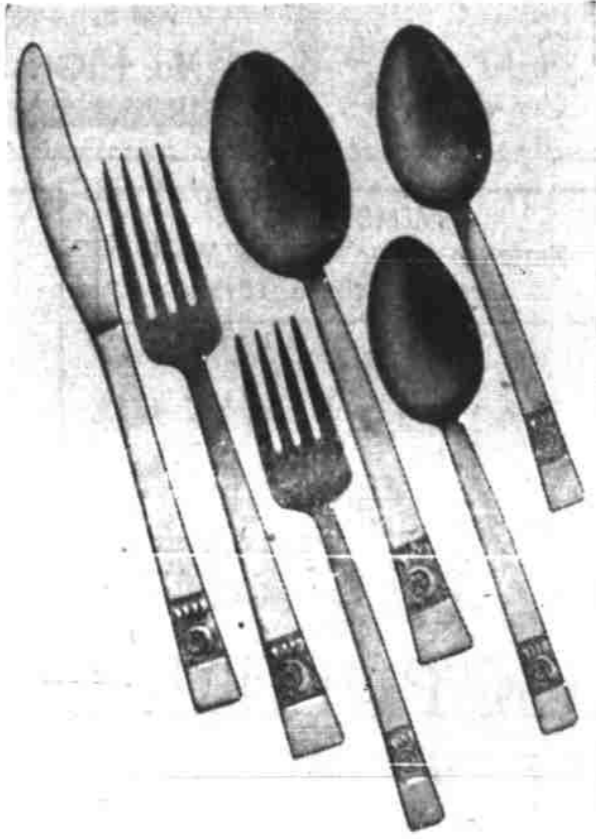
The young couple will live in Salem.

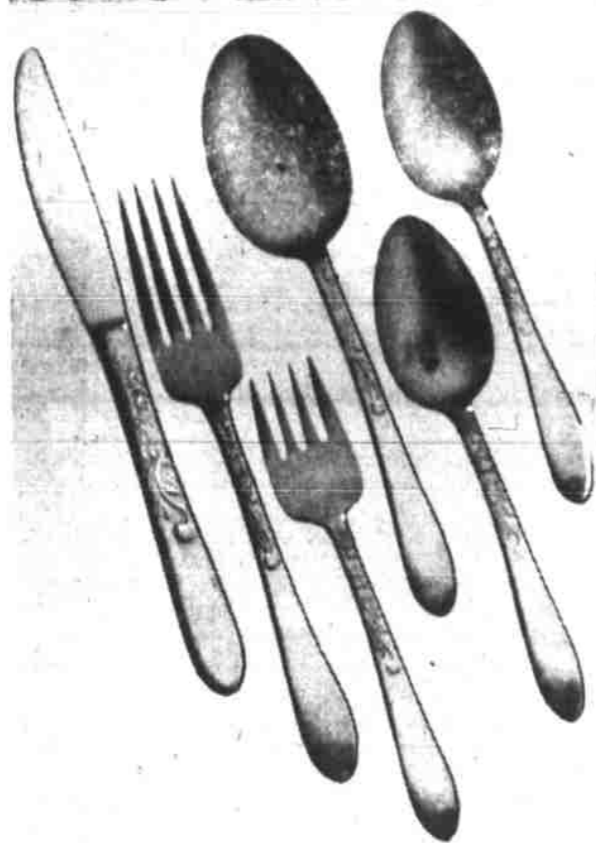

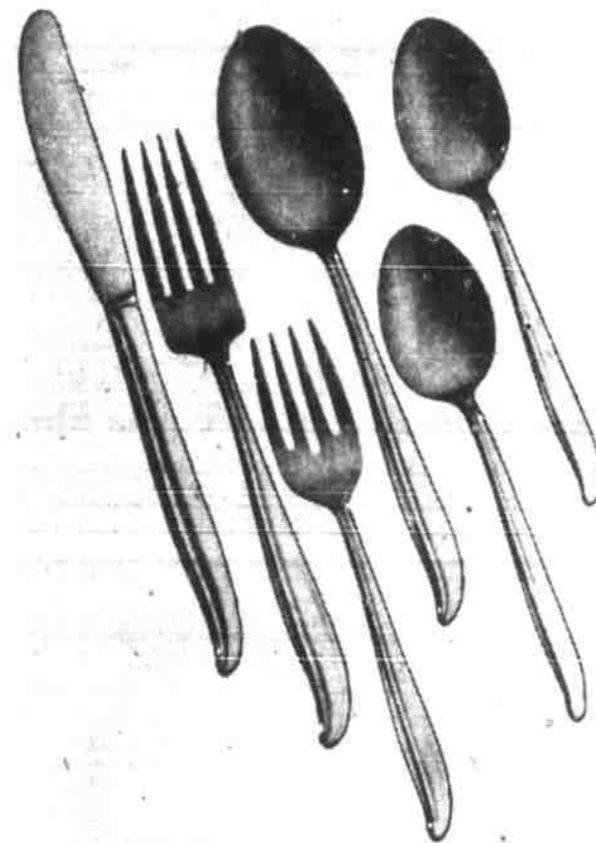

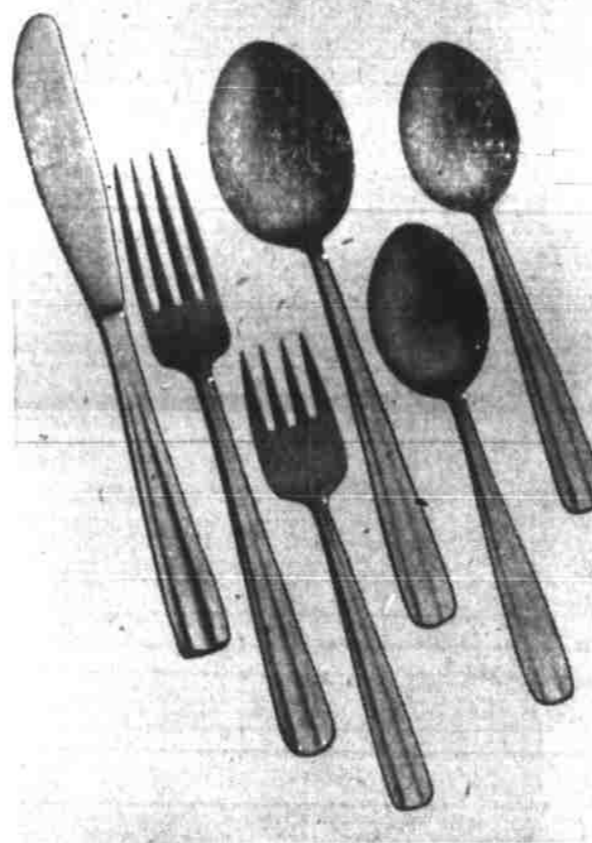
