

Sec. Dulles Acts as Go-Between In Negotiations on Suez Canal

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Oct. 7 (AP)—Secretary of State Dulles tonight appeared to be acting as go-between in efforts of the Western Powers to negotiate a settlement of their Suez Canal quarrel with Egypt.

Dulles talked privately with Foreign Secretary Selwyn Lloyd of Britain. He presumably informed Lloyd of what Egyptian Foreign Minister Mahmoud Fawzi told him in a half-hour conversation Friday night.

Prison Volunteers to Test 'Live Virus' Polio Vaccine

CINCINNATI, Oct. 7 (AP)—A University of Cincinnati polio researcher said tonight that the next step in testing his new "live virus" vaccine will be on volunteer prisoners at Chillicothe, Ohio, federal reformatory.

The scientist is Dr. Albert B. Sabin, professor of research pediatrics at the university's college of medicine, who has championed the possibilities of polio immunization by use of live but harmless virus.

20-Year-Old U.S. Labor Party Dies

NEW YORK, Oct. 7 (AP)—The American Labor party, once a potent political force in New York state, has gone out of existence, it was revealed today.

State Chairman Peter K. Hawley announced the state committee, meeting last Tuesday, had voted to dissolve the organization. The action ended the 20-year history of a party which had elected or helped to elect numerous city and state candidates and sent a congressman — the late Vito Marcantonio — to Washington for seven terms. It also had been credited with considerable power in national politics.

Eugene Choice For Legion Convention

EUGENE, Oct. 7 (AP)—The executive committee of the Oregon American Legion met here Sunday and decided to hold next year's convention at Eugene. The date is to be set later.

W. H. Baillie, administrator of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission, was principal speaker at the session. He asked for Legion help in maintaining the liquor control law as he said that the state profits more from monopoly than from private sales.

Japan Envoy Off to Seek Russ Treaty

TOKYO, Oct. 7 (AP)—Prime Minister Ichiro Hatoyama left tonight for Moscow, where he hopes to sign a peace treaty with the Soviet Union. Thousands of Japanese were at the airport to watch his departure. Some shouted "banzai," some distributed leaflets which said his journey "will lead Japan to ruin" and still others, relatives of Japanese still prisoners in Russia, carried banners urging the Prime Minister to get their men home.

Nepal to Get Red China Aid, Peiping Says

HONG KONG, Monday, Oct. 8 (AP)—Red China will give strategic Nepal 60 million Indian rupees—about \$12,650,000—in economic aid over the next three years, Radio Peiping said today. The broadcast said an agreement was signed yesterday in Peiping at the conclusion of a 10-day visit to Red China by Nepalese Premier Tanka Prasad.
