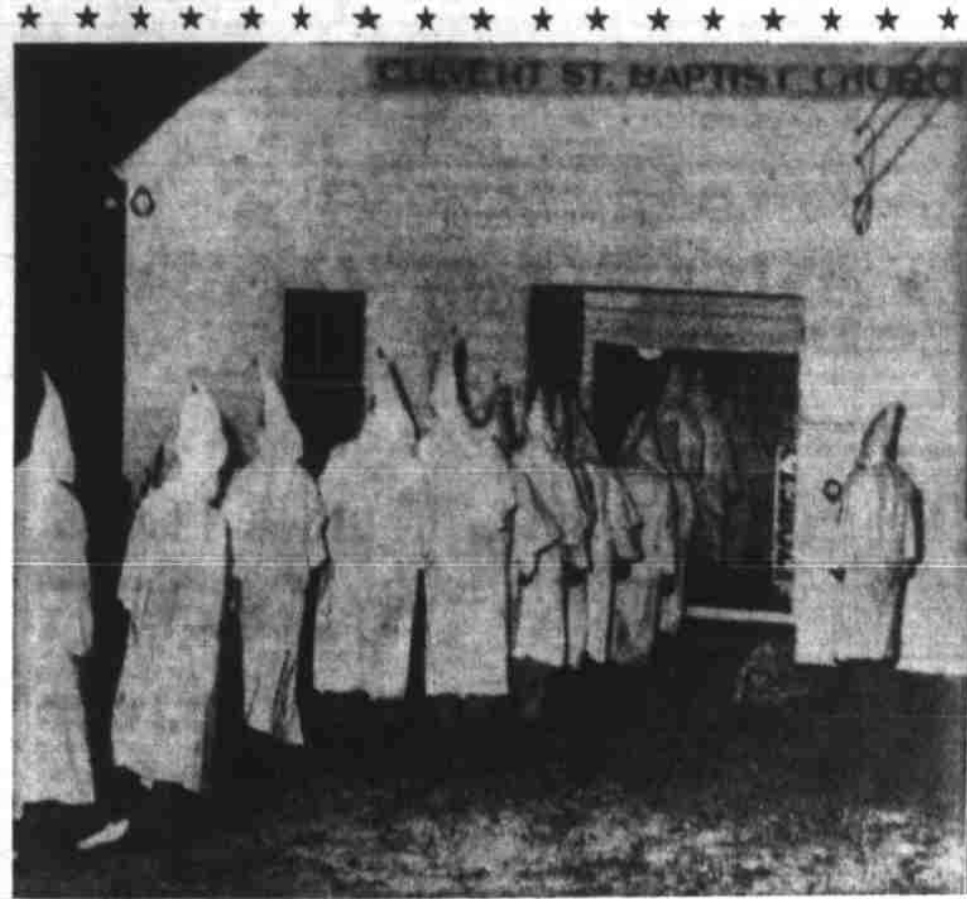

Klan Visits Church



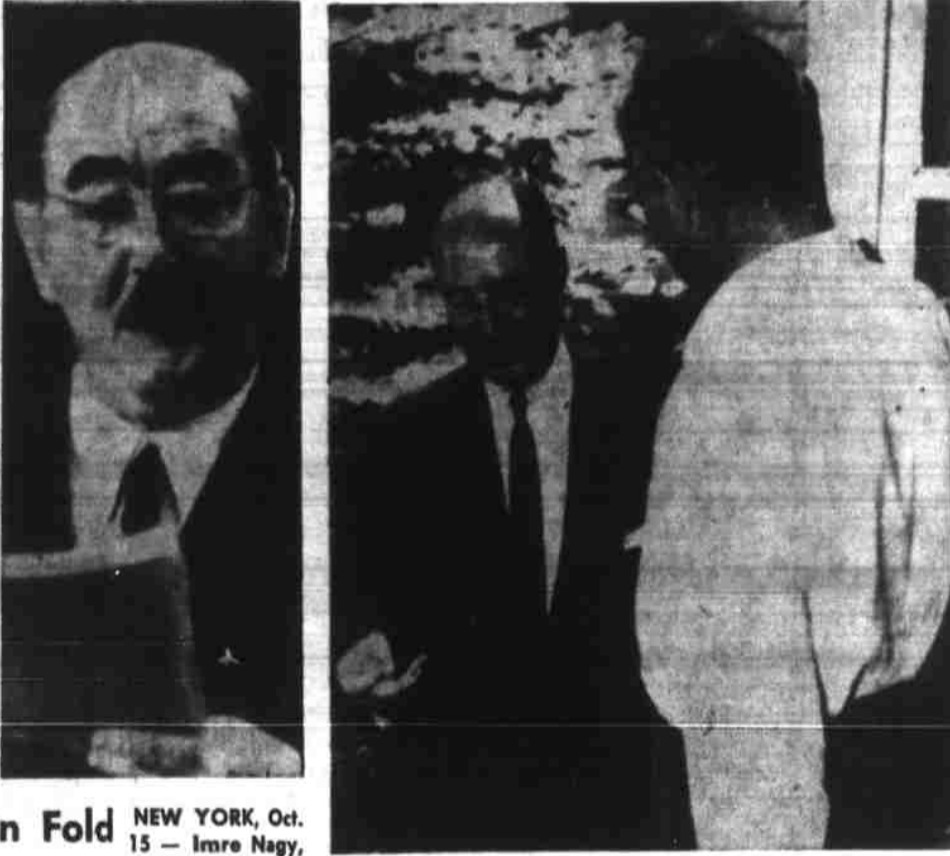

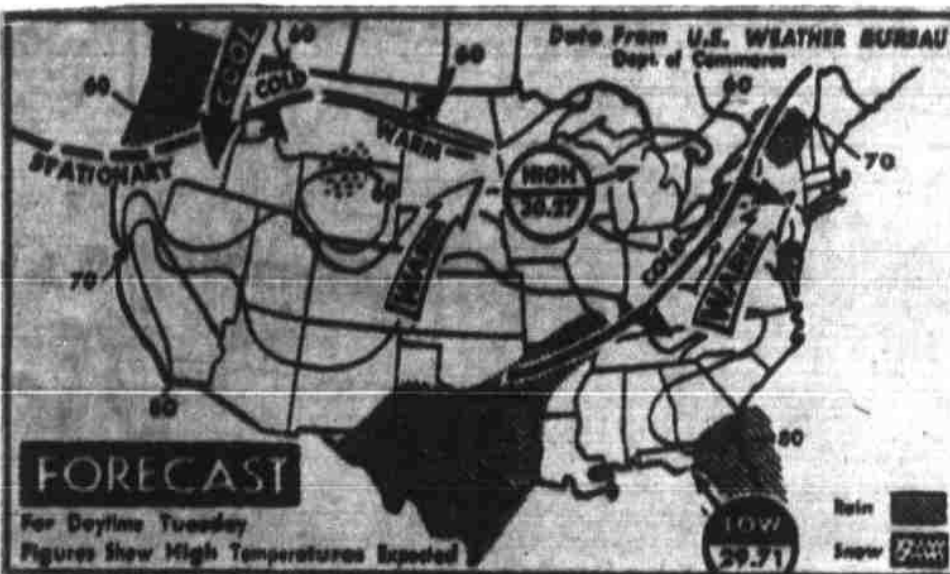
