

Supreme Court Frees Roseburg Attorney of One-Day Jail Sentence

Spencer W. Yates, Roseburg lawyer who was sentenced to a day in jail for contempt of court by Circuit Judge Carl E. Wimberly, was freed of the charge Wednesday by the Oregon Supreme Court.

Decision in Stock Auction Yard Delayed

Decision over whether Earl Gillaspie's license to operate a livestock auction yard in Salem should be revoked or suspended was taken under advisement Wednesday after an administrative hearing in the State Agriculture Department.

Presiding over the hearing was Albert Julian Scio, chairman of the State Livestock Auction Board.

The issue over Gillaspie's license arose Sept. 11 when Dr. Gordon C. York, assistant state veterinarian, called at the yard and asked Gillaspie to show him the records on four cattle.

At the hearing Wednesday, Gillaspie said Dr. York was a stranger to him and didn't show agriculture department identification. In his appearance, Dr. York maintained he had identified himself verbally and the yard owner hadn't asked to see his credentials.

Witnesses indicated that Gillaspie did not produce the cattle records until the next day after York had returned with Sheriff Denver Young and State Veterinarian Kenneth Peterson.

Two Injured In Mishaps Said Better

Two 76-year-old Salem women who were involved in two different accidents on Tuesday were reported in good condition Wednesday by hospital authorities.

Mrs. Bertha V. Compton, 664 S. Commercial St., underwent surgery Wednesday in Salem Memorial hospital, to correct bone breaks suffered when she fell while attempting to catch a bus at State and Liberty Streets.

Mrs. Martha Graham, 506 North 21st St., was admitted to Salem Memorial hospital for treatment of a head laceration, bruises and shock, when she was struck by a car which jumped over a curb after a wreck at 21st and Broadway Streets.

Ike to Request More Money for Disabled Veterans

WASHINGTON, Oct. 24 (AP)—President Eisenhower said today he will ask the next Congress to increase the compensation of totally disabled veterans.

He said he believes they now are undercompensated.

Eisenhower's statements were in a letter to James A. Sheehan, associate editor of the National Tribune, White House press secretary James C. Hagerity described the publication as the successor to Stars and Stripes.

Eisenhower's letter was in reply to one from Sheehan.

Eisenhower told Sheehan the present veterans' program "is the finest in the world and has been largely developed on a bipartisan basis."

The President said he concurs wholeheartedly in a report by a commission headed by Gen. Omar N. Bradley that service-connected needs of veterans should be given the highest priority, and that service-connected compensation and death benefits should be liberal and generous.
