Board Hears Report From City Mission

Over 21,500 meals and 10,500 beds were furnished during the last 16 months to needy individuals by the Union Gospel Mission in Salem, Supt. George Simonka said at a recent group meeting. He added that 550 items of clothes were also distributed.

Bread during this period was contributed free by Master Bread Co., meat from Salem Meat Co., and a large amount of vegetables from Al Ped Fruit and Produce Co., he said.

Simonka, in charge of the mission at 345 N. Commercial St., also presented a budget of \$5,800 for the coming year which was approved by the board of trustees. Trustees who were appointed at the meeting to a three year term are Henry Turner, Maynard Haverland, Henry Horge, Charles H. Hiler, Lauren Stettler and Stanley Fagg. Lee Eyerly was appointed to a two-year term.
