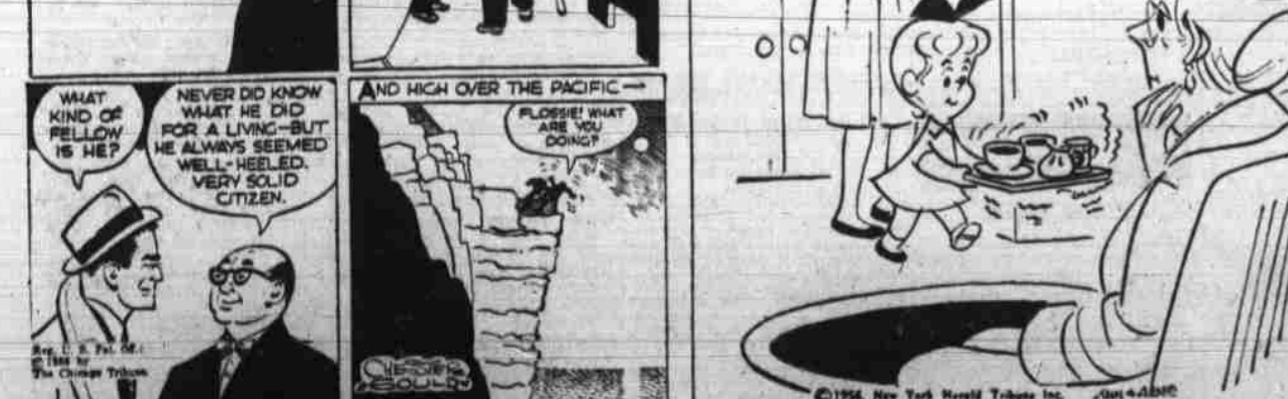

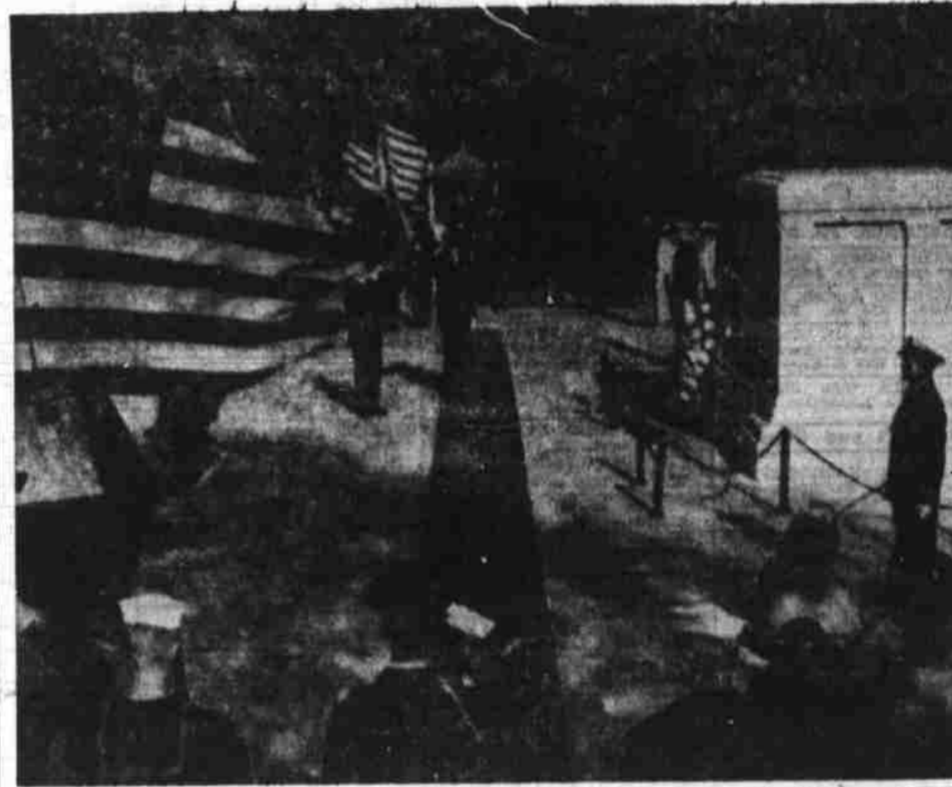

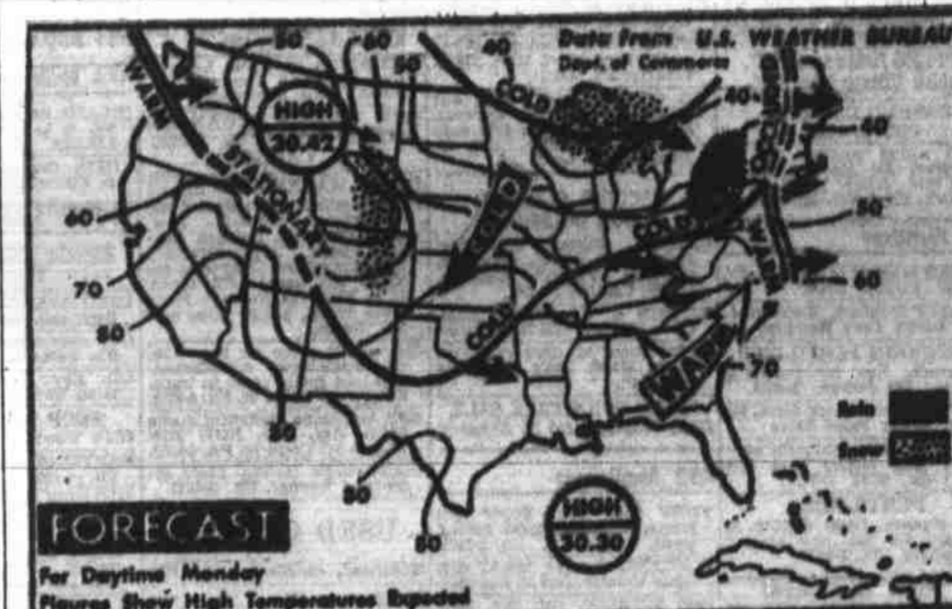
# Smoke in Budapest
