

Seeds New to Valley Will Be Popular

In a recent agricultural release, Secretary Ezra Benson indicated his department's concern about a possible shortage of seeds of certain grain grasses.

The Secretary said that the USDA's expanded conservation program will increase the demand for seeds needed in the Great Plains area.

The USDA is considering ways to encourage farmers and the seed trade to produce, harvest and accumulate stocks of the seeds that are believed to be in short supply.

While Oregon does not produce many of the seeds listed—at least not to any great extent—growers and dealers in the state should be interested in what the USDA believes are some of the seeds that will be needed most in the near future. Also, Ray Teal, seed and grain marketing specialist at Corvallis, said during the week-end that there is possibility some of the seeds can be grown successfully in the mid-Willamette valley.

Increased production is most needed for these 14 seeds, according to the Secretary: Big Bluestem, Canadian Bluestem, King Ranch Bluestem, Little Bluestem, Sand Bluestem, Bluestem mixtures, Buffalo grass, Blue Grama, Side-oats Grama, Grama mixtures, Green Needlegrass, Indiangrass, Switchgrass, Western Wheatgrass.

Next in line, according to listings, are these grasses: Bluestems of any varieties, Smooth brome, southern varieties; Buffelgrass, Hardinggrass, Indian Ricegrass, Sand Lovegrass, Weeping Lovegrass, Blue Panicgrass, Reed Canarygrass, Russian Wildrye, Sand Dropseed, Crested Wheatgrass, Intermediate Wheatgrass, Pubescent Wheatgrass, Slender Wheatgrass and Tall Wheatgrass.

Big Ears to Compete in Corn Show

Corn takes the spotlight for two days this week with husking contests, special exhibits, and naming of the state's top hybrid yield at the Oregon State Corn Show, Nov. 30 and Dec. 1, at Ontario.

It will be the second time in the 18-year history of the show that it has been staged in Eastern Oregon. Hermiston was host in 1953 and Ontario in 1949.

Show chairman R. E. Fore, Oregon State college farm crops department, says the show will again feature three major divisions for adults, 4-H and FFA. Entries in the hybrid yield contest will be shooting at a 204-bushel per acre record set in 1953 by Ronnie Larson, Hermiston. Next high was 191 bushels by Oscar McCarty, Echo, in 1954.

Champion 10-ear exhibits for each of the three age groups will also compete for a sweepstakes trophy. Cash premiums will be awarded in each division for top hybrid yields, corn judging, and 10-ear exhibits.

Use of hybrid seed has increased from zero to nearly 100 percent since the show was introduced under sponsorship of banks of Oregon, Farm Bureau, the Grange, Farmers Union, and Oregon State college. The show's "150-Bushel Club" for irrigated corn now numbers 35 entries dating back to 1949. Persons who have qualified for the "100-Bushel Club" of non-irrigated corn total 14 with all records made since 1950.

Acquitted Man Not Quite Ready To Leave Jail

HAMMOND, Ind., Nov. 29 (AP)—Jacob Pokrywinski, 79, Hammond, had spent two weeks in jail awaiting trial on a disorderly conduct charge, but when he was tried and acquitted he wasn't quite ready to go home. Frank Fron, special judge in City Court, finally got the explanation through a Polish interpreter because Pokrywinski speaks little English. Pokrywinski said he'd like to stay another night in jail so he could get out during bank hours of the Whiting Bank where he had \$12,000 on deposit. Judge Fron granted him banker's hours.

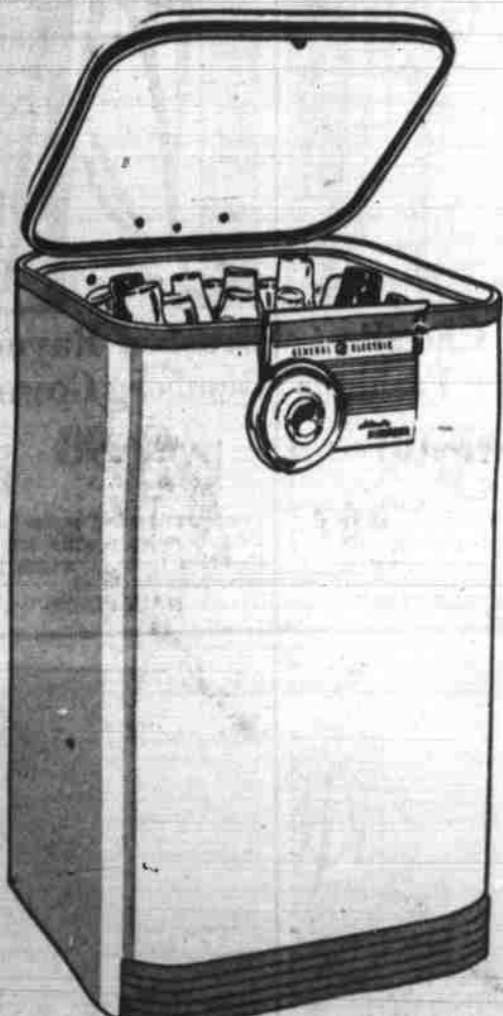

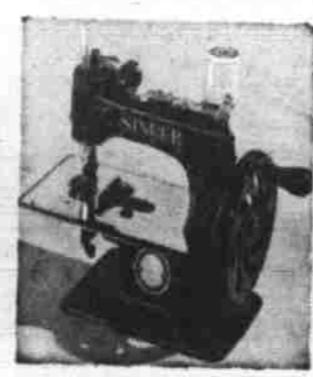
