Junior High Schools Damage Suits Ask \$40,000 In Road Deaths

Salem's School Board will decide tonight whether they have sufficient funds to go ahead with construction of two new junior high schools.

School officials have been negotiating with Architect William L. Williams and low-bidding firm of Viecko & Post for three weeks in an attempt to trim an offer of \$2,715,260 down the district's budget for the projects.

Supt. Charles D. Schmidt said Wednesday that final efforts of the negotiations will be weighed to determine if it can award a contract to Viecko & Post of Salem for building the two identical structures.

Bids, including those offered by two other Salem firms, were opened Nov. 23. The low was considerably above the \$2,400,000 allotted for the projects for building, furnishing and landscaping. The delays in awarding a contract have ruled out any chance of the junior high schools being ready for occupancy when they are needed next fall.

Packing Firm Plans Annual Report Dinner

The 35th annual meeting of the Blue Lake Packers, Inc. has been set for Tuesday, starting at 10 a.m. at the plant.

Purpose of the meeting is to transact the usual business which includes the president's report, the manager's report and the election of directors. This year the terms of Ernest Gubser, Russell Coburn and Cornelius Bateson will expire. Under the bylaws, Coburn and Bateson are not eligible for re-election.
