Art Aragon Booted for Fix Attempt

AUSTIN, Tex., Dec. 20 (AP)—State Boxing Commissioner H. B. Morgan slapped an indefinite suspension today on third-ranked welterweight Art Aragon for trying to fix a fight in San Antonio, Tex.

Richard Goldstein, boxing buddy of Aragon from Los Angeles, drew a 30-day suspension. Under National Boxing Association rules, both fighters are automatically suspended in all states except New York.

"It's another case of a big-time fighter not wanting to take a chance of being whipped by a little-time fighter," Morgan told The Associated Press.

Goldstein testified at an investigation in San Antonio yesterday that he was offered \$500 and threatened with death if he didn't take a "dive"—fake losing the fight—in the third round.

Aragon denied any deal with Goldstein. Morgan's stiff punishment came following a grand jury investigation and lie detector tests taken voluntarily by both fighters.

Variations Noted
The lie tests revealed that Goldstein's story was substantially truthful and Aragon's—well, there were variations, at least," Morgan said.

"However, our decision was made on all the findings in the case, not just the lie detector tests."

"This is a terrible thing for Texas boxing," Morgan said, "and I am sorry for these boys. I hate for them to read of this first in the newspapers because they won't get the letters of suspension for several days, but we cannot defer action. This thing had to be handled immediately."

Trio Paces NL Figures

NEW YORK, Dec. 20 (AP)—Red Schoendienst set a National League record for second basemen with a .993 fielding average, making only four errors while handling 610 chances for St. Louis and New York. The old record was set by Jackie Robinson of Brooklyn in 1951.

Joe Adcock of Milwaukee dethroned Ted Kluszewski as the top average first basemen in figures released Wednesday. Big Ted of Cincinnati had topped the first basemen for five years but was way down the list in 1956. Adcock made only six errors. Close contenders were Stan Musial of St. Louis and Gil Hodges of Brooklyn. Del Crandall, the Milwaukee catcher, also topped the league in fielding at his position with only two errors in 109 games.

early we have very few waterfowl at all. If the season is delayed there is a good chance that what ducks do arrive will find so much water in the valley that hunters will be hampered.

Eastern Oregon Providing New Spas

We had a long discussion with Oregon Game Commission Director, Phil Schneider, about four years ago. We talked over this problem of the new agricultural picture of eastern Washington. At that time Schneider told us that although the waterfowl men were concerned with what changes it may produce, none could foretell just what those changes might be.

With thousands of acres of desert land under cultivation, and with many new lakes and potatoes being formed by the back-up water from Grand Coulee it is becoming more obvious that the waterfowl have a new cafeteria lying between their breeding grounds and Oregon's hunting grounds. As long as the weather remains mild in eastern Washington the birds will stay there and find all they desire in the way of food, water and shelter.

From where we sit there is very little to be done about the problem. We will have to be content with what we get, and trust that our shooting eye will get a bit truer so that we may score on what we do get to shoot at.

River Shooters Now Finding Tough Going

The river bottom potholes and flooded areas are disappearing (just since the flash flood), and the river shooters are finding the shooting a bit on the lean side. Surface water remains in many of the outlying fields and it is enough to make field feeders out of the pintails and mallards.

It came to our attention that at least one Salem hunter was under the impression that Oregon had a split waterfowl season. Such is not the case. The 1956 waterfowl season ends at sundown on December 31. It is indeed a long recess until it opens again in the fall of 1957.
