

## Vehicle Department Report Lists Saving Possible for Agency

Cost of transportation, typing and issuance of drivers licenses is considerably less under a new operating organization in the State Motor Vehicles Department, its director, Wayne H. Nunn, asserted Wednesday as he prepared to leave the department to become assistant secretary of state.

Nunn estimated all the changes already instituted would produce a savings of \$152,000 over the fiscal biennium.

In a report to Gov. Elmo Smith, he outlined general administrative changes and listed 11 specific changes that accounted for his \$152,000 savings estimate.

### Vehicle Savings

Automobile expense savings worth \$27,000 every two years were figured by Nunn as the result of the department now using 14 state motor pool vehicles instead of 18 state-owned vehicles assigned to the department, and plans to discontinue the lease of 16 additional vehicles for which the state has been paying a Portland firm \$35 a month each.

Changes in typing work, including the merger of typing, proofreading and corrections sections, were estimated in the report at a rate of savings of \$38,400 per biennium.

### License Changes

Production of driver licenses was made less costly, the Nunn report said, by substituting electric type writers with check-perforating type for the previous process of laminating licenses with acetate as a protection against a licensee holder altering the information on his license. This savings was estimated at \$29,000.

Other savings as forecast in the report on the basis of present efficiency increase, \$21,600; revision in transcripts of driver records, \$2,400; simplified "dead title" file, \$12,000; increase revenue on meter skip payments, \$7,200; reduced laundry expense (involving dust mops and abolishing uniform jackets), \$6,000; janitorial expense, \$4,000; office furniture renovation, \$1,500; relocation of financial responsibility field office, \$3,100.

The condition of all was "good" Wednesday night, Salem Memorial Hospital attendants said. There were no fatalities but the five were being kept overnight in the hospital for observation, attendants said.

The patients were listed as Mrs. Estelle R. Harding, 51, Medford; a daughter-in-law, Mrs. Dorothy M. Harding, 21, Medford; another daughter-in-law, Mrs. Lucille D. Harding, Central Point; Dorothy Harding's one-year-old daughter and Lucille Harding's 10-month-old son. They were taken to the hospital by Willamette Ambulance Service.

Driver of the car which skidded into a ditch about 9:45 a.m. was Warren D. Harding, husband of Lucille Harding, state police said.

## Five Youths Charged With Barn Entry

Five Mt. Angel juveniles were cited in Marion County Juvenile Court Wednesday on a charge of breaking and entering, the sheriff's office reported. They are scheduled to appear Jan. 16.

The boys, all 14 and 15, were charged with entering a barn belonging to Howard Van Cleave, Silverton, and taking a variety of articles stored there. Theft included a bullet molding machine, powder molds, wrenches, an electric razor and some shells. Van Cleave estimated the articles were worth about \$50.

The entry occurred Dec. 31 and the barn was entered again on Jan. 2 and 3 after a window was broken to gain entry, deputies said. The barn and a house belonging to Van Cleave are located about three miles northwest of Mt. Angel.

## Long Illness Takes Life of Salem Man

John P. Schimberg, 1010 S. 14th St., died Wednesday in a Salem hospital at the age of 37. He had been ill with a heart condition the past two years.

Schimberg was a leader in acquiring the Salem Senators baseball team for the community and in fund-raising associated with the club. He was owner of Chuck's Tavern, 3190 Portland Rd., now Chuck's Steak House, in the 1940s. He later served as deputy Marion County assessor and was a Republican candidate for assessor in 1954. He retired about two years ago.

He was a member of Salem Elks Lodge, American Legion Capitol Post 9, 40 and 8 Voiture 153 and East Salem Lions Club.

Schimberg was born July 27, 1899, at Minneapolis. He moved to Salem from Minneapolis in 1933 as agent for National Cash Register Co. He resided in Eugene from 1934 to 1942 when he returned to Salem. He and Anna Mae Willis were married in June, 1946, in Vancouver, Wash.

Besides his widow, he leaves a son, Air Force Lt. R. J. Schimberg, Lubbock, Tex.; two sisters, Mrs. Alice Jungblut, Salem, and Mrs. Marie Quinn, Minneapolis; and two grandchildren.

Services will be 1:30 p.m. Friday at Virgil T. Golden Mortuary with ritualistic services by BPOE Lodge 3288. Burial will be in Belcrest Memorial Park.

DALLAS, Ore., Jan. 9.—Services for George Elmer Pack, 68, longtime resident of the Dallas-Falls City area, will be 10 a.m. Saturday at Bollman Funeral Chapel, the Rev. James Royer officiating. Burial will be in IOOF Cemetery, Falls City.
