

Tight Study Schedule Adopted By Group Probing Urban Woes

A special 20-man committee appointed recently by the Salem and South Salem Chambers of Commerce outlined its area of operation and adopted a tight nine-month schedule for an exhaustive study of Salem's fringe area problems at an organizational meeting Wednesday night.

Consideration of a growing sewage problem in the South Salem area underlies the group's adoption of a tentative schedule which should complete the study within four months.

The committee's goal of operation is to study the fringe area problems of the city of Salem.

First two meetings, scheduled at two-week intervals, will be devoted to a study of existing policies and attitudes of the city of Salem and Marion County toward fringe problems such as sewage disposal, water and fire districts.

Three city officials will be invited to attend the opening meeting, including Kent Matheson, city manager; J. Harold Davis, city engineer; and John L. Geren, manager of the city water department.

Budget Omits John Day Dam Start, Irrigs Solons

WASHINGTON, Jan. 16 (AP)—Pacific Northwest Democrats, with some Republican support, complained today that President Eisenhower had recommended no money to start construction of John Day Dam. They described it as the biggest omission in the budget Eisenhower sent to Congress.

Generally speaking, however, most members otherwise indicated approval of the budget, which would earmark 144½ million dollars for spending in the Oregon-Washington area in the year beginning July 1.

Two members, Sen. Morse and Rep. Green, Oregon Democrats, termed the absence of John Day funds "shocking." Rep. Ullman (D-Ore.) said it was a "direct slap in the face to the economy of Eastern Oregon and the Pacific Northwest."

Mrs. Green also viewed as "awfully shortsighted" the absence of any request for funds to start construction of flood protection works at the Peninsula Drainage District 1 and 2 and Savie Island District in Multnomah County, where emergency flood funds were spent last winter.

Rep. Porter (D-Ore.) said the requests were "pretty good on most projects" but that he was not convinced that Holley and Green River reservoirs, for which the President asked only planning money, could not use construction funds this year.

Starts on five new water resource development projects in Oregon and one in Washington state were recommended by the President. The largest would be the proposed \$6,287,000 Crooked River reclamation project near Prineville, Ore., for which an initial appropriation of \$850,000 was recommended.

Bonneville Tops

The largest single item in the two-state program was the \$30,800,000 asked for construction by the Bonneville Power Administration. It represents a large increase over the \$18,700,000 asked a year ago. An additional \$8,630,000 was asked by BPA for operation and maintenance.

Other Oregon projects included: Army Engineer's construction of Chetco River \$200,000; Columbia River and mouth \$1,150,000; Amazon Creek \$446,000; Willamette River bank protection \$300,000; Cougar Reservoir \$6,750,000; Hills Creek Reservoir \$4,800,000.

Army engineers' planning projects: Rogue River Harbor at Gold Beach \$21,000; Blue River Reservoir \$100,000; Columbia River local protection (Umatilla River) \$16,000; Holley Reservoir \$100,000; Lower Columbia River bank protection (Beaver Slough) \$40,000; Green Peter Reservoir \$225,000.

Bureau of Reclamation construction: Rogue River Basin project, Talent division, \$6,041,000.

BPA Projects

PORTLAND, Jan. 16 (AP)—President Eisenhower has requested a \$29,430,000 appropriation for Bonneville Power Administration in the year beginning July 1. Administrator William Pearl said today.

Pearl said the request—a \$8,501,000 increase over this year's budget—includes nearly 31 million dollars for construction, including facilities to carry 3 million kilowatts from Chief Joseph and The Dalles Dams and such private projects as Priest Rapids, Mayfield and Pelton.

These projects are included in the scheduled construction: Oregon City-Chemawa \$154,000; Round Butte-Redmond \$421,000; Santiam-Alvay No. 2 \$1,604,000; Coos Bay area service \$109,000.

Customer transmission facilities: Oregon—Reedsport sectionalizing circuit breaker \$73,000; Coos Bay point \$52,000; Toledo area service \$1,639,000. Others, \$346,000.

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Boat Club Plans 'Foul Weather' February Cruise

Salem Boat Club Wednesday night made plans for a "foul weather cruise" to Independence Feb. 3, heard reports on a proposed floating clubhouse and elected Lee Dugger of Brooks as rear commodore.

The club met as usual in Salem Memorial hospital chapel, about 60 attending, according to Bob Hullette, commodore.

Reports were read on progress toward a new clubhouse, which will resemble a houseboat—possibly with two stories—and be moored at the Salem Boat House. Hullette appointed Lee Greenlee as crew captain to replace Stanley Ness, who resigned last month.

Election of three new directors was postponed, pending adoption of a new club constitution and set of bylaws.

The grand jury is scheduled to appear before the grand jurors tomorrow. So are 14 other persons, including English actor Michael Wilding, her current escort; shoe magnate Harry Karl, her former husband; Mrs. Mary Tuboni, her mother; Harold Plant, her business manager; and movie columnist Harrison Carroll.

The mother and Karl said they received phone calls from an apparent kidnaper shortly after she had disappeared. The voice was described as that of a nervous young man.

During her disappearance, Marie made phone calls to Carroll, Wilding and Plant.

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo., Jan. 16 (AP)—Missouri's new governor has refused to move into the state's 65-year-old executive mansion, described by a state senator as a "rat-infested firetrap."

Gov. James T. Blair Jr., was inaugurated Monday and spent his first night in the 32-room mansion. The next morning he got up, reported "The beds are as hard as rocks," and sent his clothes back home.

Northwest Oil Prices Hiked

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 16 (AP)—Standard Oil is increasing the price of gasoline half a cent a gallon tomorrow in California, Oregon, Washington, Nevada, Alaska and Hawaii.

Standard said tonight it also is boosting by half a cent a gallon prices of heating and diesel oils and liquefied petroleum gas.

Film, Verbal Kidnap Tales 'Differ' in McDonald Case

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 16 (AP)—There seems to be "glaring inconsistencies" in Marie (The Body) McDonald's film and verbal accounts of being kidnaped, a spokesman said after the county grand jury took up the case today.

The jury saw a 20-minute film of the blonde beauty acting out her story of her kidnapping by two men from her Encino home the night of Jan. 3.

Then they saw a three-minute film interview with the actress by a local TV newscaster, George Putnam. And they heard a police sergeant read a 47-page statement Marie made to detectives at an Indianapolis hospital.

She was taken there, bruised and hysterical, after a truck driver found her on the desert 24 hours after she disappeared.

The grand jury spokesman, who declined to be identified by name, said:

"The films are mutually inconsistent, and the statements in the films are inconsistent with themselves."

"And there are inconsistencies between both of them and the Indianapolis statement."

"Whether the inconsistencies are of a material nature I don't know."
