

# Red China Launches Attack on 'Sabotage'

HONG KONG, Jan. 20 (AP)—Communist China's secret police have launched a massive crackdown on a B-Red sabotage and harassment reports reaching Hong Kong indicated today. Hundreds have been arrested and tons of ammunition seized in recent months, the reports said.

The reported purge apparently stemmed from fear that East European discontent could spread to China unless swift measures were taken. The disclosures of infiltration secret police activity came from Communist publications which have just reached Hong Kong.

Secret police in Kwangtung Province coastal areas south of the Nationalist base of Formosa uncovered enough guns and ammunition to supply a small-scale revolt, the papers said.

Secret police unearthed many about 600 rifles, 20,000 rounds of ammunition and 600 hand grenades, along with a few machine guns, were seized in the Kwangtung cities of Swatow and Foshan.

## Missing Man Clues Sought

Salem police Sunday asked Portland police to aid in a search for Everett M. Scotten, 70, of 340 E. Washington St., who was reported missing since Wednesday.

Harold Patterson of the same address told police he had accompanied Scotten to Portland, where Scotten was to report to the Veterans Hospital for treatment of an illness, but left him at the bus station, police said.

The rear-end collision occurred about 10:35 as Donald Carl Schulke, Silverton, was maneuvering his car to push the car driven by his wife, Mrs. Carolee Schulke, who had run out of gas, police said. Driver of the other car was listed as Richard Merle Kemper, 1930 N. 24th St.

Three cars were involved in a collision caused by one of them skidding out of control about 8:30 p. m. Sunday on Salem-Portland Freeway near Aurora Junction, state police said.

## Dag Confers With Israeli, Egypt Delegates

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Jan. 20 (AP)—U. N. Secretary General Dag Hammarskjöld conferred with Egyptian and Israeli delegates today on the General Assembly's latest demand that Israel withdraw from all occupied territory.

Hammarskjöld talked separately with Egyptian Foreign Minister Mahmoud Fawzi and Israeli Ambassador Abba S. Eban. He set up the meetings yesterday after the Assembly, by a 74-2 vote, asked him to "continue his efforts for securing the complete withdrawal of Israel" and to report within five days.

None of the participants would give details of the talks, but the following questions were asked:  
1. Will Israel pull out of the Gaza Strip and the sharm el Sheikh area at the mouth of the Red Sea Gulf of Aqaba without guarantees that Arabs will not raid from Gaza and Egypt will not bar Israeli ships from the gulf?  
2. Will Egypt give the guarantees?

Delegates studying the three-day debate that preceded the Assembly's decision doubted either side would give what the other side wanted. The prospect was the Assembly will have to meet again late this week or next to deal with a deadlock.

Israel has agreed that by Tuesday it will pull back all its forces from remaining beyond its armistice lines with Egypt—except those in the Gaza strip and on the gulf.

## Club Declares Champ Stole Lie From Recording

WYBURN, Salk, Jan. 20 (AP)—Members of the Weyburn Lions Club have voted unanimously to lodge a strong protest with Wisconsin's Burlington Lions Club for awarding the title "world's champion liar" to Albert B. Hopkins of Madison, Wis., it was learned Sunday.

"This decision," claims master liar Fred Parker, president of the Weyburn club, "casts a shadow of disrepute on the characters of liars in general. For while Albert Hopkins is a liar, and a big liar at that, he is an honest liar."

Mr. Parker said Hopkins copied his title-winning tale "word for word" from an old phonograph record of the song, "Cross Eyed Sue."

The song tells the story of hogs who died from Jack of sleep after acquiring such an accumulation of North Dakota gumbo oil on their tails that the weight stretched their hinds so tight they could not close their eyes.

## St. Mark's Votes Approval For New Church Building

The congregation of St. Mark's Lutheran Church, at its annual meeting Sunday night, approved specifications for a new church building as outlined by its building committee, and authorized that committee to award and sign the contract.

A contract is expected to be awarded within a few days, the congregation also approved an enlarged budget for 1957 and elected a Church Council consisting of: Leslie Davis, Mark Gehlar, Edward Jensen, Dr. Otto Kraushaar, Oscar Ludahl (all three year terms), William Stortz (two year term), and Arnold Olson (one year term). All are newly elected. W. V. Lytle was named as a delegate to the Convention of the Pacific Synod, to be held in May in Portland.

Three contractors submitted bids on the new church. The congregation had earlier endorsed the idea of a new church, but on Sunday voted—almost unanimously—to go ahead with the actual contract-signing and construction, Pastor Cauble explained.

The young Turkish Cypriots struck to avenge the death yesterday of a Turkish auxiliary policeman. He was killed in a bomb attack attributed to Greek Cypriot rebels against British rule.

Earlier in the day the youthful thugs set fire to 11 shops, garages and warehouses owned by Greek Cypriots. After darkness fell, they struck again in a score of places. One group raided a Greek-owned coffeehouse in Nicosia's Turkish quarter, wounding three Greeks. Then fires began erupting.

## Two Dead in Alaska Crash Of Army Plane

FAIRBANKS, Alaska, Jan. 20 (AP)—The bodies of two men who were in a light Army plane missing since Friday were found in the wreckage of the plane today. Names of the fliers are being withheld until next of kin have been notified.

The wreckage was sighted by a helicopter from the 74th Air Rescue Squadron from Ladd Air Force Base. The missing L-19 was found on the frozen Tanana River a mile and a half southeast of the Fairbanks International Airport this morning.

The last word heard from the plane, inbound from Galena, about 300 miles west of Fairbanks, was a request made to Ladd AFB Friday night for landing instructions.

## Police Arrest Salem Man on Weapon Count

A Salem Post Office clerk was charged early Sunday morning with carrying a concealed weapon after a gun was found in his car, city police said.

Facing the charge was Raymond George Reeves, 35, of 215 S. Winter St., with bail set at \$10,000 after consultation with Marion County District Court Judge E. O. Stedter Jr., police said.

Police stopped Reeves in his car after investigating a disturbance report about 2 a. m. at the home of his ex-wife, Mrs. Viola Reeves, 1895 Lorain Ct., and searched the car with his permission, they said.

The gun, described by police as an Army issue .45 caliber Colt automatic revolver with five cartridges, was post office property, according to Postmaster Albert Grever.

Investigating officers said the gun was apparently taken from the post office shortly after the reported disturbance. Gragg said Reeves was seen in the post office about that time but told the clerk on duty he had come in to check the work schedule as he had been off for the past week.

The sisters, Mrs. S. E. Honey, Kansas City, Mo., and Mrs. Ed Vardy, San Fernando, Calif., came to Salem to find their brother, police said.

## Youth Facing Check Count

An Aurora boy, 16, was charged with attempting to obtain money by false pretenses Saturday afternoon after he allegedly sought to cash a check for \$26.99 in a Safeway store at Court and Front streets.

Police said the youth handed the check to a Safeway employee about 1:30 p. m. then ran out the door while the manager was phoning the bank. The manager chased the boy and held him until police arrived, they said.

The boy admitted trying to pass a check at Safeway, as well as cashing checks at three other Salem stores, police said.

The boy is to be turned over to Marion County Juvenile Court Monday, police said.
