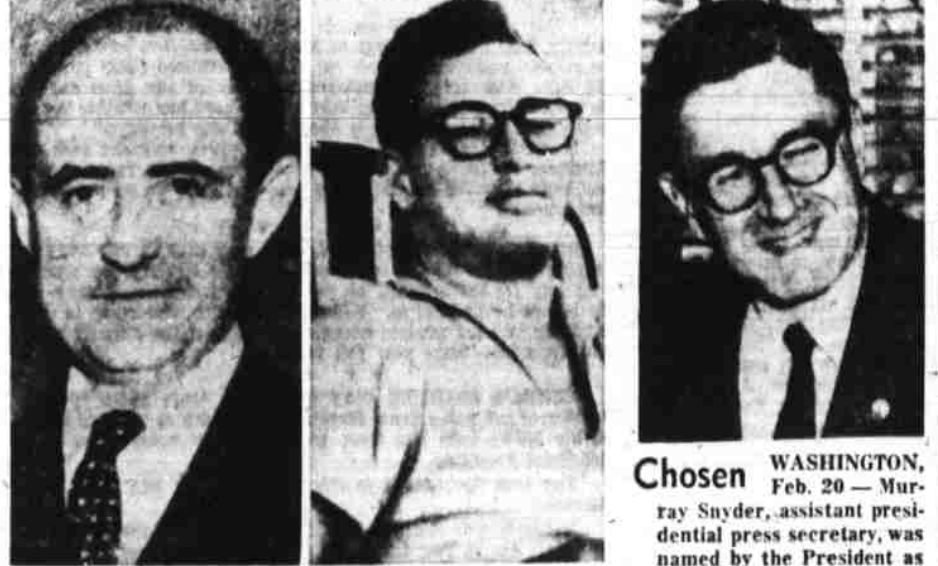

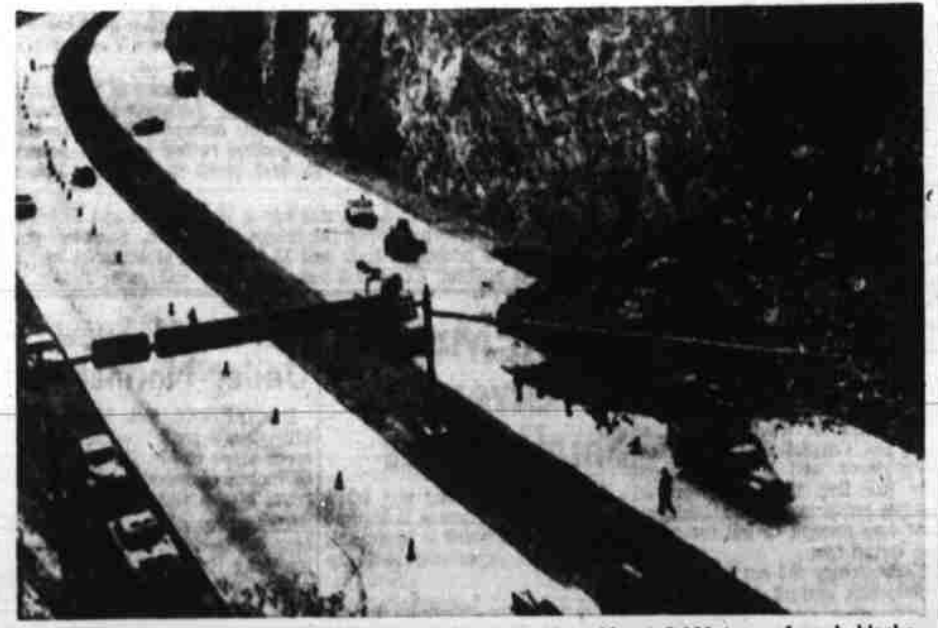
Car in Ohio 'Chilly'

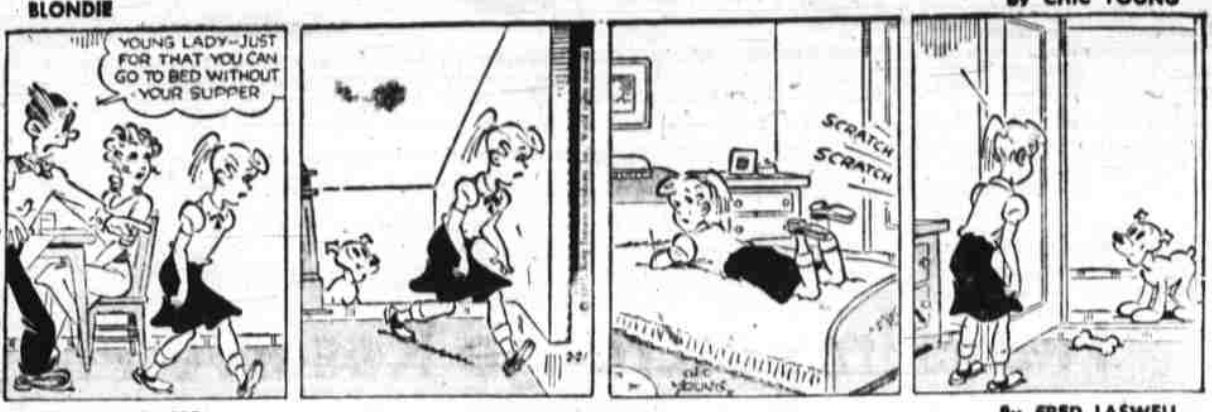
