PORTLAND, March 20 (AP)—The Battleship Oregon Museum Commission reported today that an anonymous Japanese has contributed another piece of the famed ship to the city of Portland.

Clyde Dickey, chairman of the commission, said the gift was the towing bitt from the warship's hull. It will be mounted on a concrete pedestal near the Oregon's mast on Harbor Drive here.

Rescuers Fail To Reach Sick Prospector

RIGGINS, Idaho (AP)—A rescue party tried for the second day Wednesday to get through heavy snow to reach an elderly prospector lying ill in his isolated cabin in the Salmon River wilderness.

The plight of Albert "Deary" Hale, about 69, was discovered Sunday by a friend, Karl Samson, who had come to visit the prospector in the mining ghost town of Florence, about 20 miles north-east of here.

Sheriff Bud Taylor was notified and a rescue party was quickly formed. The group left Grangeville at 1:30 Tuesday morning in an attempt to reach the abandoned town, which is at 8,000 feet elevation in rugged mountain country of the Nez Perce National Forest.

The party had to return about 15 miles on foot when its snow cat broke down about Riggins Hot Springs, where members had been trying to follow a creek bed through the seven-foot snow.

The party, headed by Dr. Ralph M. Buttermore, a forest engineer Chester Curtis, started out again Wednesday with a larger snow cat, but had not reported back by nightfall.

Meanwhile, assistant forest superintendent Ray Hilding asked that a helicopter be sent from Forest Service headquarters at Missoula, Mont. The helicopter was unable to come Wednesday because of bad weather over the Idaho-Montana ridge.

Porter Asks Protection of Union Dues

WASHINGTON, March 20 (AP)—Rep. Porter (D-Ore.) today urged that union members be given "protection of dues-payers' funds from raids and expropriations."

He warned at the same time "against drastic punitive measures which could undermine the basic purpose of trade unions, which is to safeguard the living standards of working men and women."

Porter said in a statement that current hearings before a Senate committee are "a challenge to trade union officials themselves and they must respond to it."

He said it would be "unfortunate if either political party made use of the current revelations for political purposes," inasmuch as some of the union officials "charged with grave misdeeds have supported candidates of both parties."

"Furthermore," he said, "I think final public judgment must be withheld until the courts have passed on many of the charges recently voiced."

Grant to Aid Video Classes

PORTLAND, March 20 (AP)—The State Board of Higher Education today announced receipt of \$200,000 from the Ford Foundation Fund-for-Advancement of Education, which will be used for an experimental project in college teaching by television.

Chancellor John R. Richards said the grant will make possible the start of classroom-television on three campuses next September. Preliminary work to set up facilities is underway at the University of Oregon, Oregon State College and Oregon College of Education.

The undergraduate courses and one graduate course are planned. Courses definitely scheduled are U.S. history, to be taught at the University by Wendell H. Stephenson, and chemistry, to be taught at Oregon State by W. H. Slabaugh and M. B. Williams. The other two schools will receive the programs.

Gains, Losses Salem Quotations

NEW YORK, March 20 (AP)—The stock market ended with a mixture of gains and losses today when a morning advance failed to hold through to the close.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks ended unchanged at 117.80, with industrials up 20 cents, rails up 10 cents and utilities down 20 cents.

Of 1,101 issues traded, 426 advanced and 335 declined. There were 14 new 1936-37 highs and 10 new lows.

Volume totaled 1,830,000 shares compared with 1,540,000 yesterday.
