

Owner of Berry Camp, Employers Held Guilty Of Labor Law Violation

The labor contractors and owner of a berry camp involved in a recent labor situation near Gresham all violated Oregon laws, State labor Commissioner Norman O. Nilsen said Tuesday.

In a report to Gov. Robert D. Holmes, Nilsen said labor contractors H. J. Harmon and E. J. Honeycutt, who brought 28 workers from Arizona for berry picking, had not been licensed or bonded to contract labor under the state employment law. Evidence is being gathered for the prosecution, according to the report.

State investigators found that living conditions on the Eldon Snider farm, where the migrants were housed for 30 days with little work, did not comply with minimum sanitation standards of the State Wage and Hour Commission and the Board of Health, the report states.

Snider is said to have agreed to dismantle the camp and refuse any future cooperation with unlicensed labor contractors.

The labor commission's recommendations to the governor include closer liaison with other states on needs for migrant labor, passage of Senate Joint Resolution 2 which would provide an interim committee of the legislature to study migrant worker problems and strengthening of laws governing farm labor contractors proposed in House Bill 435.

The report advises physical ex-

amination of migrant workers for communicable diseases prior to leaving their resident states and requirement of "certificate of inspection" from the State Board of Health administrator for labor camps.

Nilsen also asks larger staffs for state agencies charged with regulation of labor camps.

Russ to Expel U.S. Diplomat

MOSCOW, May 7 (U.P.)—The Soviet government notified the U.S. Embassy today that it was expelling Martin S. Bowe Jr., of Holyoke, Mass., a second secretary, but set no date for Bowe and his family to leave.

No reason for the expulsion was given except the usual statement that Bowe has been guilty of actions unbecoming a diplomat.

John Guthrie, in charge of embassy affairs until a new U.S. ambassador reaches here, was reported preparing to visit the Soviet Foreign Ministry tomorrow to ask for an explanation.

It was assumed here the order for his expulsion was connected with the recent U.S. expulsion of Gennadi Mashkintzev, a Soviet Embassy consular service official in Washington.

Housewives Blamed for Food Costs

WASHINGTON, May 7 (U.P.)—Part of the blame for the high cost of groceries may rest on the housewife herself, Department of Agriculture marketing experts told Congress today.

Consumer demand for such things as grocery store parking lots, trading stamps and pre-packed foods have transformed American shopping habits since World War II, they reported.

Testifying at the start of an agriculture subcommittee inquiry into reasons for the size of the family food bill, Omer W. Hermann, deputy administrator of the Agricultural Marketing Service, said customers are more and more being attracted into retail stores by convenience and service.

"It is under such circumstances that retailers, in particular, look for new promotional techniques to attract and keep customers," he said.

"It was in such a setting as this that the use of trading stamp plans began to grow by leaps and bounds after 1953."

But he also stated consumers also are eating more and better food than before World War II.

Ike to Take Plea to Public

WASHINGTON, May 7 (U.P.)—President Eisenhower is going to follow through on a plan to make a direct appeal to the people for support of his legislative program, now having some rough going in Congress.

Press Secretary James C. Hagerty revealed this today but said the President hasn't decided yet just when and how to present a public brief for his embattled budget, the foreign aid program and other items facing critical scrutiny from the legislators.

Hagerty had said a week ago that Eisenhower was considering a direct appeal to the people and indicated then that it would take the form of a radio-television address.

British Guiana Fights Polio With U.S. Help

GEORGETOWN, British Guiana, May 7 (U.P.)—Because of a record outbreak of polio, British Guiana has received emergency supplies of Salk vaccine from the United States and Britain.

U.S. Offers to Tell Troop Movements

LONDON, May 7 (U.P.)—The United States offered today to tell the world beforehand of any international movement of U.S. troops, even including transfer of forces from the mainland to Alaska.

U.S. Delegate Harold Stassen made the offer to the U.N. Disarmament subcommittee on condition that other nations agree to give such advance notice.

Stassen also called on the Soviet Union to accept an international control system over imports and exports of arms.

Stassen's proposals got a non-committal reception from the Soviet delegation.

Jules Moch of France gave firm support to the U.S. proposal on troop movements, authoritative sources said.

Stassen emphasized that both proposals should be included in a partial agreement setting the stage for a full-scale treaty ending the world arms race.

More Texans Flee Floods

DALLAS, Tex., May 7 (U.P.)—More Texas residents fled high water today and a federal official estimated state damage from spring tornadoes and floods at \$5 million dollars.

Most streams receded after 20 days of heavy rains, flooding and near flooding.

But on the lower Brazos River, about 50 miles southwest of Houston, scores of persons moved out as new high water came in.

The National Guard sent eight guardmen to Angleton to help in rescue work.

The Brazos spread to a width of 13 miles at places near the coast, bringing floods to areas around Angleton, West Columbia, East Columbia, Anchor and other towns and communities.

Estimates from Bill Lee of the Angleton Times and others indicated that at least 100 persons had left in fear of still higher rises on the Brazos and its tributaries.

Woman Contributes \$120 To Reduce National Debt

WASHINGTON, May 7 (U.P.)—Sen. Byrd (D-Va.) today personally handed to Secretary of the Treasury Humphrey \$120 sent to the senator by a California woman who asked that it be used to reduce the \$75-billion-dollar national debt.

Miss Sheila M. Martin, of Pacific Palisades, Calif., wrote Byrd that, "No one else will lower it—the debt—so we citizens should at least try."

The Treasury, however, said no donations can be accepted if they are earmarked for specific purposes.

A spokesman said Humphrey plans to write Miss Martin for permission to deposit the \$120 in the general fund. He explained that would represent a debt reduction since it would be that much less the government would have to borrow to meet its obligations.

There is no way to apply the \$120 directly to debt reduction, the spokesman said.

Byrd, in giving the contribution to Humphrey at a session of the Senate Finance Committee, said "George, there's no excuse now for you to come up here and ask for an increase in the national debt limit."

The latest Treasury report, as of May 2, lists the national debt on that date as \$274,040,946.153.
