

Chief Homers Rack Solons in 3-2 Clash

Loss Skein Reaches 4

Bat Punch Fails; Tappe Clout Wins

WENATCHEE, June 12 (Special).—A pair of homers run by three Wenatchee Chiefs and Salem's inability to cash in on numerous chances to score brought the Senators their second straight Northwest League series setback here tonight, 3-2 to the Chiefs. Coupled with two losses to Tri-City last Sunday, the sinking Salem have now dropped their last four in row.

First baseman Herb Anderson, slugged homer No. 1 in the first inning with no one on base. Then in the sixth big Ted Tappe, who had a perfect 3-for-3 night at bat, slammed a long drive over the right-center wall with George Huffman aboard. Huffman had singled.

This was all the scoring off rookie Lee Walker of the Solons who went the route but it was sufficient as for other than the first and fifth innings the Senators were absolutely puncheon. They left 14 runners stranded on the sacks.

Winning pitcher Jim Jones, a left-handed rookie with a 3-5 record earned run average, was biffed for nine hits and walked nine more. But Salem couldn't dent him when he counted after three walks and a double play scored in first inning tally, and another walk, an infield out and Gene Laursen's single accounted for a run in the fifth.

Walker struck out five and walked only one in taking his fifth loss, against one who Jones had five in getting his second win, against four losses.

Laursen had a perfect 4-for-3 game at bat too, and rookie Terry Marrow hit a single and double in four trips. Tappe's three and Mgr. Don Lundberg's two hits led the blow attack against Walker.

Only 300 people watched the game. The series closes here tomorrow night. The win pushed Wenatchee ahead of the Solons in the standings, and Salem is now in fourth place, only 1/2 game from the dungeon.

Eugene Wins Another, 2-1

EUGENE, June 12 (AP).—A ninth inning, bases-loaded sacrifice fly by pitcher Ollie Brantley gave Eugene a narrow 2-1 Northwest League baseball victory over Tri-City here tonight.

The crucial final inning opened with Tri-City pitcher Bill Spelling giving up two of eight walks he yielded in the game. Dan Holden and Jack Simpson then were advanced by John Keller's sacrifice. Spelling, who yielded only three hits, deliberately walked catcher Fred Bower to load the bases.

Brantley then slammed a fly to deep right field. Holden scored easily. The victory gave Brantley an 11-3 season mark.
