

Corvallis, Seaside Girls Staters Named Candidates for Governor

The 36 citizens of Corvallis and Seaside, Ore., who will hold their general election this morning at Willamette University, are choosing between Judith Roth, 17, of Corvallis, and Helen Lark, 17, of Seaside, for governor.

The two were nominated Wednesday at mock conventions of the girls' Nationalist Party and the Federalist Party respectively.

Oregon Girls State is made up of a select group of girls who elect their officers, pass laws, and conduct court in annual session sponsored by the Oregon American Legion Auxiliary. It aims to teach

the girls "through actual practice, the rights, duties and responsibilities of American citizenship."

Also nominated Wednesday were two Salem girls for attorney general. Diana Boyd, 17, Nationalist candidate, and Kathy Fischer, 14, Federalist.

The girls were addressed Wednesday by Secretary of State Mark Hatfield, who expressed the hope that some day they really "will return to Salem as politicians."

Hatfield reviewed what he called the social and political rights for women, and commented that "The coming generation will have a job to do protecting the rights already gained."

He remarked that "Women have shown they can go into politics and not ask for special consideration because they are women."

Forest fire prevention was the topic of Albert Woodson, executive secretary of the Oregon Green Association, Inc., who spoke to the girls at their dinner meeting Wednesday evening at Lausanne Hall.

He also introduced a life-sized model of Smokey the Bear, national symbol for forest fire prevention.

Other candidates nominated by the Nationalist Party's delegates are: Marian Hauke, Astoria, for secretary of state; Marjorie Sell, Bend, for treasurer; Ernestine Sherman, Clatskanie, for labor commissioner.

Federalist Party's other nominees are: Linda Blomquist, Astoria, for secretary of state; Sandy Gue, Seaside, for treasurer; Betty Williams, Lebanon, for labor commissioner.

Diana Boyd is the niece of Mr. and Mrs. Lee O'Hart, 328 N. 14th St., and attends North Salem High School. Kathy Fischer, a student at Sacred Heart Academy, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. A. J. Fischer, 1805 Highland Ave.

Candidates made a campaign speech at an election rally in Lausanne Hall last night. At noon Wednesday girls heard a talk by Mrs. Mabel Cooper, explaining the veteran-made American Legion poppy.

Today's highlight will be the general election between 9 and 9:30 a.m. at Lausanne Hall. The mock inauguration will take place in the State Capitol at 1:30 today.

Speakers scheduled are Gov. Robert D. Holmes, Don Eva, State American Legion Commander, and Mrs. Clarence Grund, state Auxiliary president.

My husband didn't give me a present on Mother's Day. I was very hurt and asked him why. He said, "You aren't my mother. You are my wife." I told him this didn't matter, and that he was thoughtless and maybe cheap, as well. He insisted that I was wrong and this day is to pay homage to mothers only.

I have six children, Mrs. Landers, and they are under nine years of age. So you can see they are too small to go out and buy me a present on their own. Don't you think I'm entitled to a little home too? My husband's mother is on his side, but his sisters are with me. What do you say? Should I get home or not?—ELISE

I agree with you. It wouldn't hurt your husband to pass a little of that home-ager around on Mother's Day. You don't have to be his mother. It's enough that you're the mother of six children—thanks to him. Is my book you qualify for home-ager, and I hope he comes through next year with some small token just to let you know he remembered.

Dear Ann: I know you don't believe in beating an issue to death, but I would just love to have my say on this question of slapping children. Believe me, I am a real authority on the subject. My father had as hard a time as I and I felt it many times, across the head, the back, the face, anywhere at all. We weren't allowed to utter one word at the table. No Grace was said. We just ate like hogs.

My brother lived for the day he could join the Navy and get away from home, but he couldn't make it. He had a busted ear drum. My dad hit him once too often. Today that brother is in prison. I'm not saying my dad put him there, but he helped. My childhood was a nightmare because I never knew when I'd be getting a spanking. My mother was as scared of Dad as we were. She never opened her mouth to talk up to him.

I have three children now, Ann, and they are wonderful. When they misbehave I turn off the TV, deprive them of skating, or movies, or make them do extra chores. But no beatings. I have too many scars from belt buckles and fists. The way to teach children to be loving and kind, and have respect for others is to treat them with dignity and justice.—PROUD MOTHER

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Finns Give No Concessions To Russians

HELSINKI, Finland, June 12 (AP)—Russia's Communist leaders would up their grip-holding on Finland today with a prediction that communism would conquer the world without nuclear weapons.

But they failed to see a single political concession from their close and military neighbors, the Finns.

Winding up their barnstorming good-will junket, Soviet Communist boss Nikita S. Khrushchev and Premier Nikoli Bulganin left this country by way of Tampere—Tampere, the site of the first meeting four decades ago between the two giants of Bolshevism, Lenin and Stalin.

Three Khrushchev announced to the world today that the Communists intend to destroy world capitalism with ideas rather than nuclear weapons, and that "we are as sure of this as we are sure that the sun will rise tomorrow."

"All we have to do," said the spokesman for world communism, "is to grease our ideology with butter."
