

State Grange Asks Education Program In Property Respect

BEND, June 13 (AP) — The Oregon State Grange today called on lawmakers to try, through an intensive campaign, to educate hunters to respect farmers' property.

In a resolution approved at the Grange's next-to-closing convention day, the general cooperation of hunters was commended. It is a very small group responsible for vandalism reported each year, the Grangers said.

They proposed that rather than a general program of closing lands to hunting, an effort be made to enlist responsible hunters in checking the vandals.

In other resolution action, the Grange voiced continued approval for a high dam in the Snake River; criticism of the fast tax-write-off for Idaho Power Co.'s "low" Snake River dams; asked Highway Commission improvement on Highways 19 and 26 in Grant County; urged the people to vote against a plan of giving the state Land Board control over ocean beaches; and asked the federal government to establish a program such as the depression-born Civilian Conservation Corps for 14 to 18 year olds, as a means of combating juvenile delinquency and for general service.

In a declaratory contest for juniors, first places in their age groups were won by Caroline Edmondson, 13 to 14 years, and Marie Elma Grange, 14 to 15 years, both Elma Grange, Lane County; and Alice Blinnig, 9 to 11 years, Multnomah County.

Harley Libby, Salem, president of the Oregon Farmers Union, told Grange members an attitude of close attention to public spending has been evident of late. He said some good should come from this.

Jack Travis, Hood River, chairman of the State Fair Board, reported on improvements under way and said an architectural firm was at work on a study for a 15-year development plan.

Then they heard Superintendent Charles D. Schmidt report that a new septic tank will have to be installed at Brush College School where a sewage problem has developed. He said the cost would be between \$1,000 and \$10,000, but the work hasn't been estimated yet.

A road cut made near the septic tank apparently upset the system, he reported. The school was consolidated by vote with the Salem district a few years ago.

The superintendent said work had started at a fast pace at both Liberty School and Salem Heights School where additions are being erected this summer.

About three weeks more work is required at the new music wing of North Salem High, he added.

Telegrapher Wage Dispute Said Settled

NEW YORK, June 14 (Friday) — A wage dispute between the Associated Press and the AFL-CIO Commercial Telegraphers Union was settled early today.

Commissioner Walter A. Maggilo of the U.S. Mediation and Conciliation Service announced the settlement at 2:30 a.m.

"A settlement has been reached subject to ratification by members of the union," Maggilo said.

Maggilo had met with negotiators for the AP and the union since Monday when the contract expired. It had been extended twice to last midnight.

Woodburn Man Hurt in Collision

Melvin Johnson, Woodburn, sustained minor injuries in a two-car collision early Wednesday evening at the intersection of Broadacres, Donald Road and Wiscare Lane, state police reported.

He was taken to Veterans Hospital in Portland by a Woodburn ambulance, officers said.

William M. Eggmann of Oregon City, driver of the second car, sustained slight cuts and bruises according to the state police. Both men were driving alone.

The two cars were extensively damaged, officers said.

Law Review Committee Challenged

PORTLAND, June 13 (AP) — State Sen. Monroe Sweetland today said a Senate committee created by the last Legislature "could take Oregon on a political excursion far beyond all precedent and sound policy."

The Milwaukee Democrat said he will ask Atty. Gen. Robert Thornton for an opinion on the legality of the committee created by Resolution No. 21.

Sweetland told the American Veterans Committee luncheon here the creation of the committee was a "dangerous violation of the separation of powers."

Sponsors of the measure told the Legislature the committee would receive complaints on operation of laws in Oregon, and would make suggestions of their improvement.

Sweetland said the committee has an "undefined scope and purpose." And he added: "It would depend on private contributions for its expenses, and could be a vehicle for personal political vendettas and inquisitions."

\$51,000 Scout Council Budget Gets Approval

A \$51,000 budget for 1957-58 was approved Thursday evening by the executive board of the Cascade Area Council of the Boy Scouts of America and now awaits approval from four supporting United Fund boards.

The budget request will be submitted to the United Fund budget committees in Marion, Polk, and Linn counties and in Salem.

"This year's request is actually below that of a year ago," Samuel Samuel, chairman of the finance committee, pointed out.

In other business, Robert Elstrom was appointed chairman of a subcommittee to handle finances for the proposed new council headquarters to be built in Salem.

If an all out community fund drive is necessary to finance the structure, it will not be conducted until late this year, according to a resolution passed by the board.

The \$2,800 net proceeds from the Scout Exposition held this spring is \$1,100 over received by the council a year ago, Jim Randall, ticket sales chairman, reported.

Some \$815 has also been distributed to participating scout units.

Tom Tweed of Monitor, who will attend the Boy Scout Jubilee in England following the National Jamboree at Valley Forge next month, outlined his itinerary for the group. He will be accompanied by Stanley Mayo of Dallas, board member.

Next board meeting will be held at Camp Pioneer in the Cascades above Idanha August 4.

Alice Eastman, the festival's newly-crowned queen, reigned over her first event today, the wheelchair parade at the Veterans Administration Hospital here.

The award for the best decorated chair went to Gilbert Getman of Hermiston, Ore.

Thousands of persons are expected to line downtown Portland streets Saturday for the 46-foot parade that will include bands, marching groups and sheriff's possees from all over the Northwest.

Nine Navy ships, headed by the frigate USS Wilkinson, tied up here today for the duration of the festival. The Navy's famed Blue Angels, a quartet of jet pilots, will perform here Saturday and Sunday.

Out-of-town visitors due here by parade time Saturday include: Dixie Jo Thompson, queen of the Seattle Seafair; Jerry Geehan, president of the Tacoma Daffodil Festival Assn.; and from Salem, Ore., Gov. Robert Holmes and a marching delegation of the city's Cherrians.
