

# U.N. Probe Tells Soviet Slaughter In Hungary

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., June 20 (AP)—A U. N. investigating committee accused the Soviet Union today of indiscriminately slaughtering women and children and putting down the Hungarian revolt last fall.

In a blistering indictment, the special committee also charged the Russians deported thousands of Hungarians to Russian prisons, conducted wholesale executions and set up a puppet government under Janos Kadar to rule without the support of the Hungarian people.

**Denounced as Propaganda**  
Moscow angrily denounced the committee as a vehicle for "U.S. Propaganda."

The committee made these additional points:  
The will of the Hungarian people for independence has only been strengthened by the Soviet army's unbridled suppression of the uprising, which cost between 2,000 and 3,000 lives.

What took place in Hungary in October and November 1956 was a spontaneous national uprising due to grievances which had caused resentment among the people.

**Red Charge Unsupported**  
From start to finish the revolt was led by students, workers, soldiers and intellectuals, many of them Communists or former Communists. There is no evidence to support Moscow's charge that the revolution was fomented and helped by reactionary circles in Hungary and "Western imperialists."

The uprising was not planned in advance. But it appeared Soviet authorities had taken steps as early as Oct. 30 to make armed intervention in Hungary possible.

In its account of hearings at New York, Geneva, Rome, Vienna and London, the committee said it had been told some Soviet soldiers at the start of the rebellion last Oct. 23 showed sympathy for the Hungarians. Then Moscow rushed in thousands of troops in the early days of November to carry out the pacification of the country by force.

**Called Danube "Sea"**  
The committee said these troops apparently were Mongols and Tartars from central Asia, who had been told and apparently believed they were being sent to Egypt to "throw back" Anglo-French imperialists. Some of the troops pointed to the Danube River and called it the "Suez Canal."

Imre Nagy, leader of the government which was crushed by Soviet power, denied he ever invited the Soviet authorities to assist in quelling the uprising by force.

The grip of the secret police was loosened by the rebels. The committee was shocked by what it learned from witnesses who told of suffering inflicted on the people by the Hungarian secret police (AVH). The secret police were separated from the population by a "wall of hate" and became a state within a state dedicated to the control of the people by terror and oppression. The Hungarians people now are aware of police surveillance and have a real fear and hatred of the new security police, which they identify with the old AVH.

**Denies U.N. Violations**  
The committee said consideration of the Hungarian question was legally proper. It refused to accept Soviet contentions that the U.N. was violating charter restrictions against taking up internal affairs.

"A massive armed intervention by one power on the territory of another with the avowed intention of interfering with the internal affairs of the country, must, by the Soviet's own definition of aggression, be a matter of international concern," the committee said.

Moscow radio called the report "a propaganda bomb" supported by false evidence. It assailed the committee as "illegal" on the grounds it violated the U.N. charter by interfering in the internal affairs of a member state. Its report was described as a "U.S. propaganda offensive."

The Soviet delegation at the U.N. was all ready to quit. But it was apparent Soviet diplomats were amazed and angered by the strong language and conclusions of the 150,000-word document, boiled down from 2,000 pages of verbatim testimony by 100 Hungarians.

The British Broadcasting Corp. announced it would televise as possible (due to the U.S. report on broadcasts today) and discussions heard to from certain countries where audiences "will not hear" to the report in their own radio and press services.

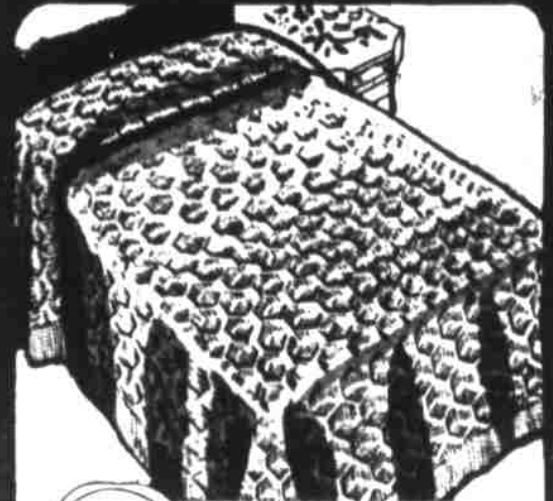

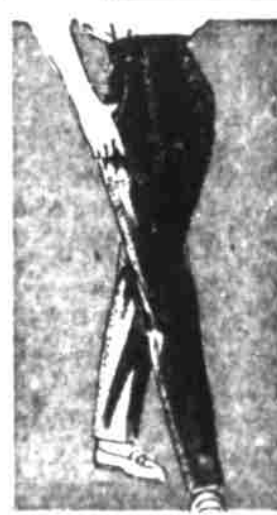

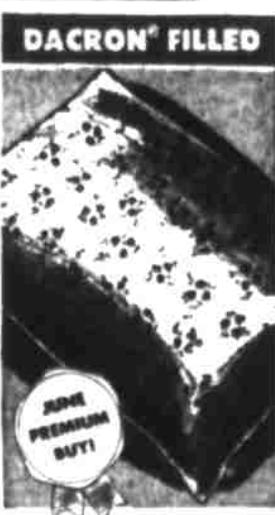
