

### Banana, Nectar Pie Delicious

The children in your family will like this Nectar Banana Cream Pie, made of bananas, apricot, whole fruit nectar, bananas, evaporated milk and lemon juice.

**NECTAR BANANA CREAM PIE**  
 1 1/2 cups apricot whole fruit nectar  
 1 cup sugar  
 Few grains salt  
 envelope plain gelatin  
 1 banana  
 1/2 cup chilled evaporated milk  
 2 tablespoons lemon juice  
 1 baked 8-inch pastry shell  
 Heat 1 1/2 cups nectar with sugar

and salt. Soften gelatin in remaining 1/2 cup nectar, and dissolve in hot nectar. Cool until thickened. Beat with rotary beater until light and frothy. Beat mashed banana into gelatin. Whip evaporated milk, beat in lemon juice gradually. Fold into gelatin mixture. Pour into baked pastry shell and chill until firm. Serves 6 to 8.

### Ship Survives Blast, Blaze

**NEW YORK, June 20 (AP)—**Owners of the freighter Grain Shipper reported Wednesday "everything is under control" aboard the vessel following a minor explosion and fire. The incident occurred in the Pacific Ocean, some 600 miles northwest of the Panama Canal.

A spokesman for Grant Fleet Inc., said a "soft fire" in the engine room had been extinguished without too much trouble. There were no reported casualties among the ship's 37 crewmen, the spokesman said. The ship is carrying a load of lumber.

### Former Oregon Professor Takes 5th in Red Inquiry

**SAN FRANCISCO, June 20 (AP)—**Sidney Rubin, 44, a former professor of economics at Oregon State College at Corvallis, Ore., refused to testify at a hearing of a House Un-American Activities subcommittee here Wednesday.

He was among five witnesses who invoked constitutional provisions in refusing to testify.

Rubin, now 44, held the OSC chairmanship from 1946 to 1952. He now is a Marin County, Calif., accountant. He said he formerly was a National Labor Relations Board employee in Denver and Kansas City.

### Relaxing of Wheat Restrictions Asked

**WASHINGTON, June 20 (AP)—**The administration has urged Congress to grant small farmers freedom to grow as much wheat as they desire without penalty if it is used on the farm for seed or livestock feed.

### Summer Stains Easy to Remove Before Washing

Summertime has a personality all its own. And one characteristic is the increase of stains. First aid for all stains is to remove while they are fresh and always before the clothes are washed. Hot water and detergent may set the stains permanently.

Follow these guides for treatment of "summer stains."

**Berries** — treat the stain immediately if possible. If they are hard to remove after they dry. Boiling water or sometimes even warm water will remove most fruit stains. Pour from a height of three or four feet so the water hits with force. It is better not to use soap, as alkalies set some berry stains.

**Fresh peaches, pears, cherries and plums** — For either white or colored garments, first sponge the stain well with cool water, then work glycerine or a soapsy shampoo into the stain, rubbing lightly between the hands. Do not use soap, as it will set the stain. Let stand several hours, then apply a few drops of vinegar or oxalic acid. Allow to remain for a few minutes, then rinse thoroughly in water.

If fruit stains persist, use a dye remover for white garments. Follow directions on the package.

**Grass** — If the material is washable, use hot water and soap, rubbing the stain well. If this does not completely remove the stain, use a bleach. Chlorine bleaches and dye removers are satisfactory on uncolored fabrics, except wool. A sodium perborate bleach is safe on colored fabrics and wool.

**Ice Cream** — If the ice cream contains fruit, follow the above suggestions. Washable garments should be sponged with cold or lukewarm water, then wash in warm soapsuds.

For nonwashables sponge with carbon tetrachloride to remove the greasy part of the stain. Let it dry, then sponge with cold water to remove any stains from the egg and sugar in the ice cream.

**Mildew** — Treat these spots when fresh, before the mold growth has a chance to weaken the cloth. On washable material, soap and water will remove very fresh stains. Drying on the grass in the sun helps to bleach the spots. Try moistening with lemon juice if soap and water do not work. Place in the sun. Old stains can be bleached out with chlorine. Wash well.

**Soft drinks** — Tannin stains may result. When washed in soap and water or heated as in ironing or pressing, they turn brown and are almost impossible to remove.

To remove fresh stains sponge the stain with water or with a mixture of equal parts of water and alcohol. Then pour glycerine on the stain and rub between the hands.

If this treatment does not work, apply a 10-percent solution acetic acid with a medicine dropper and let stand a few minutes. Rinse and repeat if necessary.

Stop the action of the acid with baking soda or ammonia. Sprinkle soda on the stain, moisten with water.

After the bubbling stops rinse well. Or hold the stain over the fumes from an open bottle of ammonia.
