Acquisition Of State Park Land Okehed

PORTLAND, June 27 (AP) — The state Highway Commission authorized acquisition of land today for three state parks.
Commissioners also said the favored development of a state park at Owyhee Lake in Malheur County, but only if the federal government provides most of the money.
The federal money would go to construction of an access road, the major cost item. A bill for this has been introduced in Congress by Rep. Ullman (D-Ore).
The commission was told more than 2,000 cars visited the lake in March, April and May, about half of them from out of state.
The commission accepted a Marion County offer for a mile of river frontage adjoining Camp State Park on the downstream side. It also accepted 20 acres from the city of Delate. It decided to buy from the Bureau of Land Management 22 acres adjoining Sunset Bay, south of Cape Arago lighthouse.
Among successful low bidders on 13 projects for which bids were opened at a June 6 meeting in Salem were:
Harney County—Construct 133-foot concrete bridge over middle fork of Malheur River at Drewsey. Harney Homes, Inc., Burns, \$34,402.
Harney and Grant—Burns rock production project on the Central Oregon and John-Day Burns Highway, C. E. Laseberg, Nyssa, \$37,200.
Morrow—Oil 12.16 miles of the west unit, Heppner-forest boundary-section of the Willow Creek Road, Barney Helser Rock Production, Beaverton, \$119,750.

City-School Vote Ballots Said Ready

Applications for absentee ballots for Salem residents voting in special city-school election July 11 may be made at City Hall until July 5, the city clerk's office said Thursday.
Residents of School District 24-J who live outside the city limits will not be able to use absentee ballots in the elections.
Salem voters will ballot on two items—a \$38,000 special tax levy for two successive years to reconstruct two existing swimming pools in Salem and a \$150,000 bond issue to improve eight existing Salem parks.
Residents within the district but outside of the city limits will ballot only on the swimming pool issue. The two pools, Leslie and Olinger, are operated and maintained jointly by the city and the school district.
