

Money Bills Cut Over \$1.1 Billion

WASHINGTON, June 30 (AP)—Congress so far has cut \$1,148,212, set off more appropriations bills for fiscal 1958 starting tomorrow but these offer little hope for actual spending cuts in the year ahead.

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Aide Confesses To 'Deviations' In Red China

HONG KONG, June 30 (AP)—Huang Shao-hung, non-Communist member of the powerful Standing Committee of Red China's Parliament, confessed today to "rightist" deviations in criticizing the ruling Communist party.

But the Central Committee of the Kuomintang Revolutionary party, before which he recanted, was not satisfied. Peiping radio reported. It branded him "dishonest" and "vague."

A committee member sharply recommended that Huang, former minister of interior under the Kuomintang, and Gen. Lung Yun, a deputy chairman of the Red National Defense Council, "seriously reform."

Falling this, he said, steps should be taken to suspend them from the party, one of China's eight minor groups. Huang committed the sin of suggesting early in May that the country's top lawmaking body, the National People's Congress is a rubber stamp of the Communist party.

Lung, hard-bitten former warlord governor of Yunnan Province, criticized Russia for insisting on repayment of loans to China. He described Russia as more imperialist than the United States.

Both accusations were made as part of a nationwide campaign sponsored by Chairman Mao Tse-tung to criticize the Communist party as a means of correcting mistakes in its relations with the masses.

Huang is the second top non-Communist figure to make a clean breast of his errors. Chang Po-chun, minister of communications and deputy chairman of the Democratic League, previously made an abject retraction of his proposal that the Communists share rule of the country with minor parties.

This has not absolved him, however, from severe criticism at the hands of deputies to the People's Congress, now sitting in Peiping.

ACCRA, Ghana, June 30 (AP)—Adlai Stevenson arrived in Accra today on his African tour. He told reporters at the airport, referring to South Africa, "I have been there and seen how that inhuman apartheid or racial segregation policy operates."

The U. S. Democratic party leader said he thought the future of Africans in South Africa depends on how the new Negro state of Ghana progresses.

TOKYO, June 30 (AP)—Air Force search parties and Japanese police recovered today the bodies of two U. S. airmen killed Friday when their T33 jet trainer crashed in the rain near Itazuke Air Base, Kyushu Island. The pilots' names were withheld pending notification of next of kin.

Saud Said to Repudiate Ike Mid-East Plan

DAMASCUS, Syria, June 30 (AP)—A Syrian diplomat quoted Saudi Arabia's King Saud today as saying he "will never accept the Eisenhower Doctrine or join any other foreign (non-Arab) military pact."

This report was made in news items by Mawaffak Alai, Syria's charge d'affaires in Saudi Arabia, while he awaited action by Premier Sadr Asad's Cabinet on proposals from Saud for ending a nine-day-old crisis in relations between the two nations.

Hope rose here for repair of this rift in the Arab bloc. Alai flew home last night with Saud's proposals, which the diplomat described as "a fair compromise," after a three-hour conference with the King. The Cabinet studied them today.

No details were disclosed. But Premier Asad said after the Cabinet meeting, held under the chairmanship of President Shukri Kuwari, there is "plenty of hope" normal relations will be resumed shortly.

Secretary of 'Star Crossed' Lover to Quit After 20 Years

VERONA, Italy, June 30 (AP)—Juliet Capulet's "secretary" retired today.

Enrico Solimani, 56, sometime sailor, school teacher and journeyman laborer was pensioned off after 20 years in a job the city titled "curator of the shrine of Juliet." But he called himself Juliet's secretary and handled all the mail which came addressed to her.

He was the keeper of and the guide at the tomb of Juliet, one of the big tourist attractions in this walled Italian city where, according to Shakespearean tradition, the tragic and immortal love affair of the "star-crossed lovers"—Romeo and Juliet—took place.

Twenty years ago, bowing to his constant pleading, the Verona City Corporation allotted a small sum to smarten up the Capulet family home and appointed Solimani as custodian.
