Whether the Salem city manager has jurisdiction over police officers or firemen as he does over all other city employees is a question the City Council is now trying to settle.

Alderman E. C. Thornton said Monday night as the council ordered printing of the civil service code.

Thornton branded the civil service code now incorporated in the city charter as "unworkable and undesirable." He sponsored the motion to have a revised version put before Salem voters next May.

Drafting of the revision was headed over to City Attorney Chris J. Schwartz. Later a committee representing various affected interests will probably be appointed to study the revision, said Mayor Robert F. White.

Pro Football Star Shot to Death in Row

Tavern Patron Kills Barni of Redskins

SAN FRANCISCO, July 22.—The football star Roy Barni died early today, four hours after he was shot while escorting a booster patron from his tavern.

Police jailed James D. Invernizzi, 32, a beer truck driver and an old neighborhood friend of Barni's, said it was all a mistake.

"I didn't know it was Roy," he said. "I just lost my brain."

Police said Invernizzi fired three bullets into Barni while the 30-year-old athlete was escorting him out of the tavern.

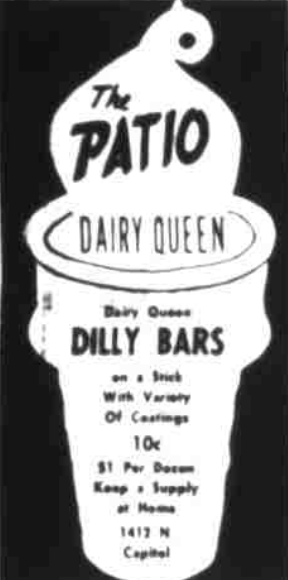
Barni, on the way home from a movie, stepped into his tavern and broke up the argument. According to Barni, Invernizzi shot him while he was being escorted out.

Barni was a halfback with the Washington Redskins. After playing in the University of San Francisco's undefeated team in 1951, Barni played professionally for the Philadelphia Eagles and the Chicago Cardinals. He was to leave for the Redskins training camp next week.

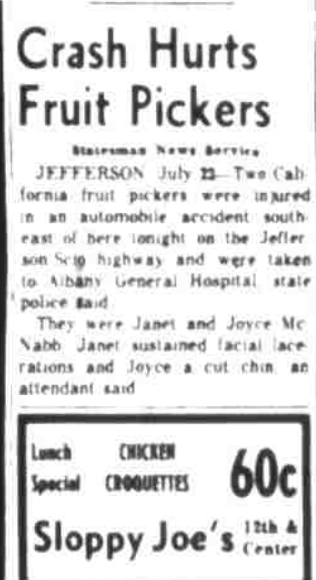
Crash Hurts Fruit Pickers

Defense Cites Lincoln Action In Clinton Trial

Says He Set Course For South on Races

KNOXVILLE, Tenn., July 22.—A defense leader in the Clinton trial said today Abraham Lincoln set the course for the South to refuse to obey the U. S. Supreme Court's 1854 edict against segregating whites and Negroes in the nation's public schools.

Ross Barnett of Jackson, Miss., a former president of the Mississippi Bar Assn., made the statement as both sides presented final arguments in the 11-day-old Clinton segregation trial.

Before Barnett spoke, U. S. Dist. Atty John L. Crawford Jr., urged the all-white jury to cling to the facts and not be swayed by emotional appeals.

Holmes Accused In Commutation Of Death Term

PORTLAND, July 22.—Gov. Robert D. Holmes tonight was accused of violating his oath to uphold the state constitution when he commuted the death sentence of a convicted slayer.

Hugh Barzee, Portland attorney who served as legal counsel to former Gov. Paul Patterson and Elmo Smith, made the accusation on the Portland television program "Viewpoint."

Holmes action was defended by his legal counsel, Orval Thompson of Albany.

Barzee said that Holmes had ordered a commutation although no appeal had been made in the case of George Sack Barzee, said that the power of reprieve and commutation historically has been for the purpose of sparing a life where an error has been discovered or other extenuating circumstances existed.

Indonesia to Call U.N. Army Home

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y., July 22.—Indonesia is withdrawing its unit of 500 soldiers from the U.N. Emergency Force in the Middle East, apparently for economic reasons.

This will be the first break in UNEF ranks since the force went on duty last winter.

Council Okehs Street Improvement Minus Sidewalks in New Wrinkle

City sidewalk policy got a new wrinkle Monday night when the City Council allowed a street improvement without sidewalks, with the provision that walks must be installed at the time each house in the new residential subdivision is built.

Alderman Russell E. Bonesteel prompted the new plan by suggesting it in connection with paving of Azalea Drive from Canterbury Drive to Madonna Avenue. He said there would be no use for walks until the houses went up and, besides, the walks would take a beating from construction trucks if they were put in first.

Mayor Robert F. White said the policy would be appropriate only to that Candalaria area or some of the West Salem area where enough city land remains for new subdivisions.

Three groups of new parking meters for the State Capitol area were ordered by the Council at the suggestion of Secretary of State Mark Hatfield and the city's traffic advisory committee. One-hour meters will occupy the south side of Court Street along the block the State Office Building faces.

Holmes 'Was Urged to Take Role in Probe'

Labor Unit Accuses Thornton, Rejected

The Portland vice investigation dormant during the summer court recess, was the subject of comment by two state officials and a labor organization Monday night.

Gov. Robert Holmes said in his regular periodic television report to his constituents, broadcast by Portland station KOIN-TV, that he had no intention of using his office to interfere in the Multnomah County vice investigation and prosecution, despite "the urging of friends and supporters."

Holmes said he had turned the matter over to Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton. "From that point on," Holmes said, "the responsibility for conducting the investigation lay exclusively with the attorney general. Elected by the people, he was not and is not subject to the direction or supervision of the chief executive."

Eight-Peet Letter

The Portland Central Labor Council Monday night unanimously approved an eight-point letter of inquiry to Thornton.

The letter was critical of what it said was Thornton's failure to prosecute ex-gambler Big Jim Elkins, the man whose decision to talk touched off Portland's vice probe that resulted in 41 persons being indicted on 114 charges.

Among those indicted was Clyde C. Crosby, head of the Teamsters Union in Oregon.

Thornton Comments

Thornton, reached at his home at Salem, said that Labor Council President William W. "Owen" Jones had written him "a very nice letter" but that he was not going to be controlled by Mr. Jones or any other person. He said he was not going to be controlled by Mr. Jones or any other person.

This investigation and prosecution are not being controlled by Mr. Jones or any other person, but by the people of the state of Oregon and we will continue to conduct these cases in an impartial manner," Thornton said.

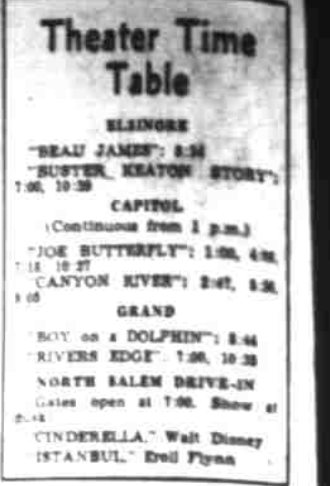

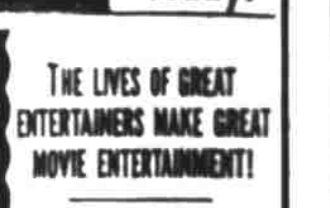

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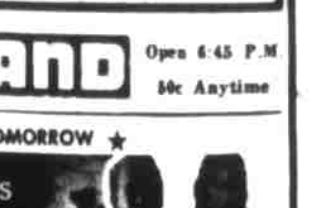
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
