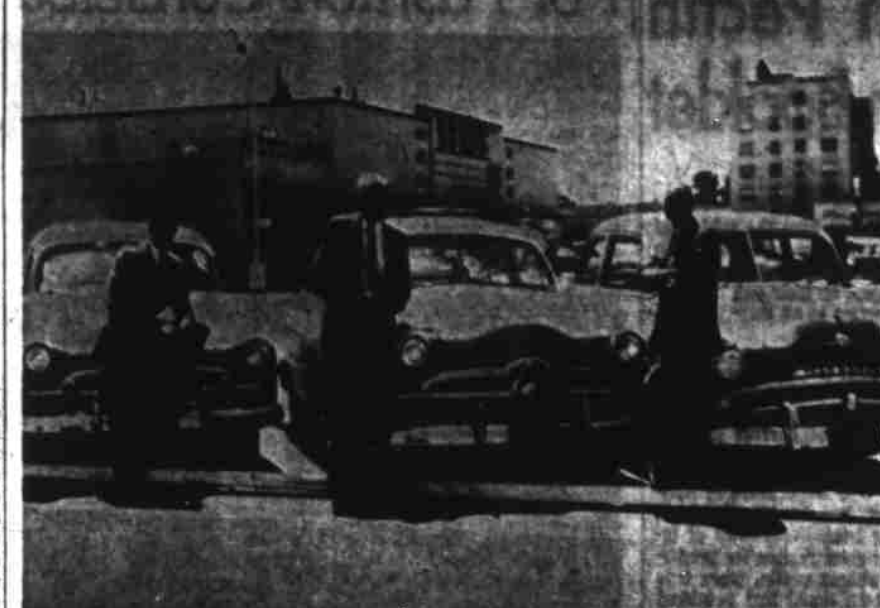

Welfare Board Aid Cases Still At High Level

Commissioner Says Slack Off Very Small

General assistance cases cared for by Marion County Welfare Commission still remain at a high level even with seasonal farm work well underway, Welfare Commissioner Kenneth Peterson said Wednesday.

"Our intake of cases and expenditures has slackened off very little this summer," Peterson said. Summer months usually see a considerable drop in local relief cases as valley harvesting takes up slack in local employment.

Peterson attributed the unusual situation in part to short strawberry and cherry seasons with unfavorable weather conditions and low farm prices aggravating the county relief case.

The welfare commission had to seek an additional \$15,000 appropriation and dig deep into reserves to carry the office through the spring and early summer. In 1956-57, the commission spent some \$195,000 on general relief as compared to the \$128,000 budgeted in that category.

"We look for a drop with bean picking getting underway," Peterson said Wednesday. However, the State Employment Service to date has reported a small surplus of bean pick
