

# Tunisia Turns Itself Into Republic; Bey Deposed

TUNIS, July 25 (AP)—Tunisia turned from a monarchy into a republic today and chose pro-American Premier Habib Bourguiba, a former prisoner of the French, as its first president.

Bourguiba deposed and succeeded the unpopular, 75-year-old Bey Sidi Mohamed Al-Amin, as chief of state and thus became the head of both state and of government. As such the job is equivalent to the presidency in the United States.

The old Bey, a remote figure residing among the ruins of ancient Carthage, had been a figurehead of the French in their latter years of colonial rule here and then a certain candidate for discord on the rising tide of African nationalism.

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## Multnomah Reports First 1956 Polio Case

PORTLAND, July 25 (AP)—Multnomah County today reported its first polio case of 1957.

Health authorities here said Denise A. Sherwood, 24, Gresham, suffered a "mild, nonparalytic" case.

Sherwood's physician said he probably would be able to return to work "in a few weeks."

In a comparable period last year, the county had nine polio cases.

## California Wife's Tip Nets Killer

LOS ANGELES, July 25 (AP)—The 1954 slaying of a West Los Angeles grocer was solved today, police said, because the killer's young wife unwittingly gave him away in a telephone conversation.

Charged with the murder of 48-year-old David Nagin was James L. Feidkamp, 34, an insurance salesman. His wife, Lucille, 17, used a neighbor's telephone to call a man described by police as an accomplice in the Nagin case.

"My baby is sick," Mrs. Feidkamp said over the phone.

The neighbor offered her sympathies but Mrs. Feidkamp replied: "Oh, there's nothing wrong with the baby. That's a code I use when my husband is in jail."

The neighbor called police, who questioned the young wife. She blurted out some of the facts surrounding Nagin's death Nov. 13, 1954.

Feidkamp arrested last Sunday after an attempted holdup at a market in nearby Van Nuys, was questioned in his jail cell here.

At first, Feidkamp steadfastly denied any connection with the Nagin case. Later, officer said, he broke down and told of the shooting.

He said he went to Nagin's home because he had heard Nagin was wealthy, and started firing when he became rattled, officers said.

## Plane Crash Report False

EL PASO, Tex., July 25 (AP)—A big Air Force troop carrier, which earlier was reported to have crashed—landed safely in Arizona tonight.

Search parties from Biggs Air Force Base here were sent to rugged sandhill country 30 miles north of here following reports that the C-130, powered by four turboprop engines, had crashed.

The Lockheed-built craft, capable of carrying 92 infantrymen and a crew of four, landed a short time later at Davis-Monthan Air Force Base in Tucson, Ariz., with two engines idling.

The copilot of the plane declined to say how many were aboard or where it was going. He said it was on "a special mission."

## Surgical Forceps Reported Found In Man's Stomach

CHICAGO, July 25 (AP)—Hospital authorities reported a five-inch surgical forceps was found today in the abdomen of a man who died yesterday after being hospitalized for recurring stomach pains.

W. J. Brookshire, a supervisor at Woodlawn Hospital, said the forceps was discovered during an autopsy of the body of Joseph Olson, 39 (Olson had undergone intestinal surgery June 28 to correct adhesions from a previous operation), Brookshire said.

He added that Olson reported the hospital Tuesday complaining of stomach pains and nausea.

An inquest is scheduled tomorrow.

Brookshire said Olson underwent an ulcer operation in another hospital about a year and a half ago. Dr. Orin T. Friedell, who said he and Dr. Edward Goldberg performed the June 28 operation, said the finding of the forceps could not be reached for comment.

## Colfax Girl, 16, Killed by Truck

COLFAX, Wash., July 25 (AP)—A 16-year-old girl was fatally injured today when she was struck by a truck in downtown Colfax.

The girl was Sheila McIntyre, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Gilbert McIntyre.

## Britons Settle in India to Escape American Troops

CALCUTTA, July 25 (AP)—British scientist J.B.S. Haldane and his wife arrived tonight to settle down on Indian soil. They are in rebellion against having American forces in England.

The couple will join an Indian statistical institute here.

Replying to a question, he said they left England because he did not like to live in a country where there are foreign troops.

## Doctor, Acquitted Of Murder Count, On Trial Again

LEWES, England, July 25 (AP)—Dr. John Bodkin Adams will stand trial tomorrow on 15 charges of violating Britain's Larceny, Cremation, Forgery and Dangerous Drugs Acts.

Dr. Adams, 58-year-old society physician from the fashionable seaside resort of Eastbourne, was acquitted last April on charges of drugging to death Mrs. Edith Morrell, a wealthy widow patient.

The new charges were brought against Dr. Adams in May. They allege that Dr. Adams falsely certified three cremation certificates to say that he had no financial interests in the deaths of three patients and that he tried to conceal two bottles of morphine in violation of the Dangerous Drugs Act.

## Red Skelton's Son Cheered At Bullfight

BARCELONA, Spain, July 25 (AP)—Bullfight fans gave Richard Skelton a standing ovation in the Monumental Arena today. Ace matador Antonio Bienvenida dedicated his first bull to the stricken boy traveler.

Richard and his father, mother and sister Valentina had front seats for the bullfight, their first, and stayed to the end.

The boy's eyes were shining. He said he had liked it.

Richard is suffering from leukemia and doctors say it will be fatal. His father, comedian Red Skelton, is trying to show the 9-year-old as much of the world as possible in the little time remaining. Skelton said they plan to go to Paris tomorrow evening.

The family arrived yesterday from Rome where it was granted a private audience by Pope Pius XII.

In Barcelona when the four appeared in their seats at the building a roar went up from the crowd. Red lifted the boy up onto the railing in front of them and the child waved to the crowd.

After some preliminaries Bienvenida walked over in front of the Skeltons. "I dedicate this bull to a valiant young man," he said aloud in the hushed arena.

Then he turned and over his shoulder tossed the standing boy his aquat, two-pointed matador's cap. It was a high spot of the European tour for Richard.

## Governor of Hawaii Resigns

HONOLULU, July 25 (AP)—Gov. Samuel King said today he is resigning as governor of Hawaii after four years and five months. In a formal statement he said, "I have this day forwarded my resignation as governor of Hawaii effective at the pleasure of the President."
