

Dixie Solons 'Backing Into Corner' Over Civil Rights

WASHINGTON, July 28 (AP)—Eighteen die-hard Southern opponents are rapidly backing their Dixie position into a political corner from which the only exit may lead to Senate passage of a civil rights bill.

The 18 representatives from Dixie states, term the core of dwindling resistance to passage of a civil rights legislation. By their own actions they are making it more difficult to accomplish their objective.

Faced with a dilemma, they chose to back amendments to the administration's civil rights bill. Their only other course was to let the bill stand as it was passed by the House and attempt to derail it with a filibuster.

Wounded Banker Charged After Bank Records Fired

PHILADELPHIA, July 28 (AP)—The FBI today accused a Philadelphia banker of a fantastic plot to cover up an embezzlement by shooting himself and setting fire to bank records.

After shooting the vault, he said he went to the basement to turn on air conditioning. On his way up the basement stairs he said he was stopped and knocked unconscious.

Federal and state charges of embezzlement and arson were filed against Norman Van Artadalen, 41, of suburban Springfield, as he lay in St. Agnes Hospital with a bullet wound in the shoulder.

Police said Van Artadalen stole at least \$22,000. About \$28,000 is missing from the Marcus Savings and Loan Assn. in South Philadelphia, but the remainder may have been burned in the vault fire, police said.

The accusation against Van Artadalen came less than 12 hours after he crawled through an office window at the association, dropped to the street below and collapsed.

A passer-by ran to give him aid and turned in a fire alarm when he saw smoke pouring from the window.

Fireman and police discovered records burning in the open bank vault and a .25-caliber pistol with one shot fired melting in the flames.

At a hospital, Van Artadalen told police he went to the office on this Sunday morning to work.
