

# Survey Shows Outside Work Load of Police, Firemen Greater Than Estimated

The extent of outside work done by city police and fire departments is greater than city officials thought, a new survey of city employees showed Tuesday.

Results of the survey, conducted by the city's personnel department, showed that in the past month the police department had 1,000 hours of outside work, while the fire department had 1,200 hours.

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## Protest Group To Walk Into A-Test Area

NEW YORK, July 30 (AP)—The National Committee for Non-Violent Action Against Nuclear Weapons said today some of its members will deliberately violate the law Aug. 8 by walking into the nuclear test area in Nevada.

The committee said it plans to organize protests at Las Vegas, New York and other cities if possible against what it called the senseless cost of nuclear tests.

A new test explosion is planned for Aug. 8 in Nevada.

Walking into the test area, the committee said, will be an act of civil disobedience against a law of the United States. It is undertaken in a spirit of prayer and from feelings of conscience.

A committee member said about 70 persons will assemble in Las Vegas Saturday to discuss ways to protest the explosion which will take place between the Aug. 8 anniversary date of the Hiroshima atomic bomb attack and the Aug. 9 Nagasaki attack.

It seems an explosion might be scheduled for that date, said the committee member Albert Rugeley.

The meeting was attended by some 25 representatives of 42 downtown Salem stores. Promotional plans were presented by Jerry Shipley, publicity chairman. Robert Sprague, Dave Host, Dick Schupp and Don Macdonald.

Prize drawings are to be held each Friday through Aug. 21 and a \$1,000 grand prize is to be awarded at Waterbury Field either Aug. 26 or 27. Cash awards will total \$1,575 and merchandise prizes are expected to swell the list to a value of \$4,000.

Free bus service will shuttle between the Capitol Mall and the downtown shopping center Friday noons during the month.

Down town parking problems also were discussed at the meeting and referred to a new committee to be named by Douglas Yeater, association president.

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## Poundage of Turkeys Sold On Upswing

Turkey poundage sold by the Oregon Turkey Growers increased from \$4 million pounds in 1955 to \$6 million pounds in 1957, according to reports made at the annual meeting Tuesday night.

The association had to buy additional turkey to supply its demand this past year according to William T. Geurts, secretary-manager of the cooperative.

Herbert Beyers, Salt Lake City general manager of Norbest, a cooperative marketing association, told the group that its members were selling below cost of production this year. He referred to the turkey business as one that can get awfully sick quick, but can get well just as quick. Right now he said it is "awfully sick."

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## County UF Okehs \$42,500 Budget

Marion County United Fund's board of directors approved a budget of \$42,500 Tuesday evening at a meeting in the fund's office in the county courthouse.

The full requests of all six member agencies were granted. The agencies are the Cascade Area Council, Boy Scouts of the Willamette Area Council, Camp Fire Girls, Santiam Area Council, Girl Scouts of Oregon, and the Salvation Army.

Executive Director T. Vernon Merrick said social funds throughout the county are expected to request another \$2,500 approximately for welfare and recreation use.

Thus he said the goal during the October and November will be about \$45,000, he said, as last year. The goal was not reached last year.

The Marion County United Fund serves as a coordinating agency for Salem. Its president is J. H. Judge Rex Hattley, who presided at Tuesday's meeting.
