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Boston Left Minus Sunday Newspapers

BOSTON, Aug. 10 (AP)—No Boston Sunday newspaper will be published tomorrow due to a strike of 200 mailers.

Six of the seven dailies in the city suspended publication last night when the mailers—a subordinate unit of the International Typographical Union—set up picket lines.

The affected papers, with a combined circulation of 1,250,000, are the Boston Daily and Evening Globe, the Boston Herald, the Boston Traveler, the Daily Record and the Evening American. The Sunday Advertiser as well as the Sunday editions of the Globe and Herald, also will miss editions.

The Christian Science Monitor is not affected by the strike but is taking no advantage of it and announced it will not have papers on public sale within a 30-mile radius of Boston. The Monitor does not have a Sunday edition.

The mailers, who handle bundle and distribute papers from the presses to the loading platform, struck when negotiations on a new contract bogged down.

The strikers turned down an offer of a two-year contract calling for a \$4.50 raise the first year and \$3.25 the second.

Joseph P. Bailey, third vice president of the ITU, said the mailers have been seeking to boost their wage scale closer to the national average of \$10 a week. He added their present weekly wage averages \$94.13.

Woman Held After Airline Bomb Threat

DENVER, Aug. 10 (AP)—A woman was held for questioning tonight after she told passengers not to board an airliner because "there's a bomb" aboard, police said. No bomb was found.

The plane, United Air Lines Flight 624, was searched thoroughly before its 18 passengers were allowed aboard.

The flight to Omaha, Neb., was delayed from 8:30 p.m. to 10:30 p.m.

An FBI agent identified the woman as Doris Hall Fletcher of Pueblo, Colo. He said she was taken to police headquarters and was being questioned there.

He said it's out of our hands now. "No charges were filed immediately."

An airline spokesman said the woman was at the bus terminal's Gate 6 advising passengers not to board the plane. The plane was moved to restricted isolated area where FBI agents and police made the check.

Passengers, meanwhile, waited in the Stapleton airport terminal during the 90-minute delay.

Cramps End Try For 1,000-Mile Water Skis Run

CHELAN, Wash., Aug. 10 (AP)—Leg cramps tonight caused Herb Thomas, 20-year-old college student, to halt an attempt to cover 1,000 miles non-stop by water ski.

Thomas gave up at 7:50 p.m. after being towed 14 hours 31 minutes. He had covered 430 miles.

He had hoped to set a new world's endurance record for water skiing. Thomas was shooting at a "record" of 715 miles non-stop reportedly set by a St. Joseph, Mo., skier earlier this year.

Thomas was forced to halt an attempt at a record last week because of choppier water. He covered only about 165 miles then.

The skier lunched on raw eggs mixed in orange juice and chunks of steak handed over by his brother Paul, who skied up beside him. At one point he even slipped on a sweater.

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The individual judging title was won by Howard Coffield of Katsada.

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Bazooka Shell Explodes, 4 Pennsylvania Boys Die

YORK, Pa., Aug. 10 (AP)—A bazooka shell exploded today and killed four boys—two pairs of brothers—who were playing with the missile in a back yard.

An elderly man who was sitting nearby was injured.

The blast dug a crater four feet deep in a spacious yard at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Leon Weaver, near Weigelstown, six miles north of this central Pennsylvania city.

Police said the shell apparently was obtained two weeks ago when the Weaver family paid a visit to a soldier son at Ft. Bragg, N.C.

Gary Weaver, 15, climbed a tree with the missile and dropped it to the ground near his playmates, police said. The resulting blast broke windows in the house and shook the surrounding residential area.

When the dust cleared, three boys lay dead near the tree. They were Joseph Weaver, 10; Lynn Baker, 11; and Stephen Baker, 9.

Gary Weaver fell from the tree with his legs shattered. He was taken to West Osteopathic Hospital here where he died shortly afterwards.

The Weaver boys' grandfather, Jonas Jacobs, 76, who was sitting on the back porch, is in satisfactory condition from blast injuries at the same hospital.

Leon Weaver and David Baker—the two fathers—were on the roof of the Weaver home fixing a television antenna at the time of the explosion. They were unhurt.

The Baker boys were the only children of Mr. and Mrs. David Baker, who live four blocks away.

Car Kills Youth At Grants Pass

GRANTS PASS, Aug. 10 (AP)—A 13-year-old boy was killed tonight late this afternoon when he was struck by a car on a section of Highway 99 that runs through this Southern Oregon town.

Josephine County coroner's deputy Walter Enriksen said the victim was Lloyd Murphy, the son of Mr. and Mrs. William Murphy of Grants Pass.

Enriksen said the boy was walking across the highway with his brother, Edwin, 14, when the accident occurred. Edwin was not injured.

Asst. Police Chief Oran Chastain said the driver of the car was Ray Lowell Straight, 38, of Wolf Creek, a small town 25 miles north of here.

Crash Fatal to Young Driver

NEWPORT, Aug. 10 (AP)—A lumber company pickup truck failed to negotiate a curve on the Alsea River road early today and upset, killing its 20-year-old driver and slightly injuring two 14-year-old boys riding with him.

Killed was Willard C. Wallen, 20, Swanton, employed by the Coquille Valley Lumber Co. at Swanton.

Queen Urged To 'Go West' In America

LONDON, Sunday, Aug. 11 (AP)—The Sunday Pictorial today urged Queen Elizabeth II not to waste her charm in Washington and New York on her trip to the United States in October.

"Go West, Liz!" the pictorial demanded.

"Unless there is a last-minute change of heart by the Queen—or by her advisers—her tour of the United States may do more harm than good," said the mass-circulation tabloid.

"Britain is sending to America her most precious asset and her most superb saleswoman. But the Queen's grace and charm will be wasted on the same old tired dignitaries in Washington and New York."

The Pictorial published a letter from a former British non-resident in Missouri, Geoffrey J. Green, Kansas City, to back up its appeal for a royal tour of the West.

Green said he understood Buckingham Palace had turned down invitations to the Queen from Kansas City and other Midwestern communities.

"As a former Britisher, I believe that a glorious opportunity of bettering U.S. British relations is being passed up," Green said.

Gospel of Christ Said Only Answer By Billy Graham

NEW YORK, Aug. 10 (AP)—"You may be alive physically but you are dead spiritually if you have not accepted Christ," evangelist Billy Graham said tonight.

Graham spoke to 15,000 persons in Madison Square Garden. It was the 78th night of his New York revival crusade.

The evangelist declared, "The Gospel of Christ is the only answer to the problems and complexities of adolescence and to delinquent parents as well."

At Graham's urging, 210 persons came forward to make "decisions for Christ," raising the overall total of such responses to 44,514. Attendance since the crusade began May 15 now totals 1,475,800.
