Parker Quits As Head Lion Coach

Can't Handle Ball Club Given as Main Reason

DETROIT, Aug. 12 (AP)—Raymond J. (Buddy) Parker resigned tonight as coach of the professional football Detroit Lions in a sudden announcement that caught Lion officials by surprise.

Parker, starting his seventh season as head coach, made the startling announcement at the eighth annual "Meet the Lions" banquet at a downtown Detroit hotel. He said "when you get to a situation where you can't handle football players, it's time to get out—and that's what I'm doing tonight 'I'm through with football in Detroit."

Club President Edwin J. Anderson and General Manager W. N. Kerby immediately went into a huddle with Parker in an effort to talk him out of his dramatic decision.

Parker, who guided the Lions to three Western conference championships — and who a year ago brought back a team that had finished last and wound up second to the Chicago Bears in the Western division — refused to elaborate on his single statement.

Mantle Gaining Ted Still Bat Pacer

NEW YORK, Aug. 12 (AP)—Mickey Mantle is chasing Ted Williams and both are chasing the 400 mark.

That in brief sums up the American League batting race in the 1957 season. But there is more to it than that.

For one thing, Mantle has gained considerable ground while Williams has shown signs of slackening off in last week's games. Mantle hit at a 520 pace. The New York Yankees switch-hitter collected 13 hits in 25 times at bat and boosted his average 11 points to .379.

Williams Drops to .387

Williams meanwhile, dropped two points to .387. The 38-year-old Boston outfielder had eight safeties in 22 tries.

Mantle walloped two home runs in last week's action while Williams and the other contender Roy Sievers of Washington, failed to connect for the circuit. This gave Mantle the lead with 31 round trippers. Williams and Sievers each have 30.

Severs, however, continues to set the pace in runs batted in with 81. Mantle has 80 followed by Vic Wertz of Cleveland with 78.

In the National League, Hank Aaron of Milwaukee regained the batting lead after reimpounding it early last week to Stan Musial of the St. Louis Cardinals.

Aaron climbed one point to 328 while Musial tailed off a single point to 332. Willie Mays of the New York Giants and Dick Groat of Pittsburgh are deadlocked for third place at 330.

Aaron maintained his edge in home runs with 32 although Brooklyn's Duke Snider slammed three last week, giving him 29 for the year. Aaron and Musial share the runs batted in lead with 87.
