

\$126,500 Remodeling Job Due For Old State Office Building

A \$126,500 remodeling plan for the old State Office Bldg. was out-lined Tuesday to the State Board of Control.

It includes moving out of the building from the 10th floor to the basement and remodeling the building as a modern office building. The plan also includes a complete renovation of all floors and expansion of the electrical system. Salem architect William J. Williams and the Board of Control are working on the plan.

The \$126,500 remodeling plan is now available for the public. William J. Williams said the plan will provide a good office building for the state. The plan is expected to be completed by the end of the year.

MIAMI, Fla., Aug. 13 (AP)—U.S. customs agents today announced a huge cache of arms and ammunition seized from a ship bound for Cuba. The cache included 100,000 rounds of ammunition, 100 machine guns, 100 rifles, and 100 pistols. The ship was the *Granma*, which was carrying the arms to Cuba for the revolution. The U.S. government has announced that it will continue to search for arms caches in the future.

LaMarca, 32-year-old mechanic and cab driver, had been sentenced to hang for the murder of the baby. The stay of execution was granted by the court, which is now reviewing the case.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13 (AP)—The Interstate Commerce Commission said today its suspension board, a staff group has voted not to interfere with the proposed lowering of certain railroad rates on meat products.

The case concerns a railroad proposal for a competitive downward adjustment in the rates on certain rail movements of fresh meats and packing house products between central and near western points to far western destinations.

The firm's letter to physicians with return postcards for acceptance said: "In any community where an outbreak occurs no group would be more essential than the members of the medical profession."

Mussolini Treasure Trial Ends In Suicide of Juror

PADUA, Italy, Aug. 13 (AP)—A juror's suicide brought the Mussolini treasure trial to an abortive end today.

Court President Augusto Zucchi declared a mistrial after receiving word Silvio Aldighetti, 62, one of the eight jurors shot himself. The treasure case involving 30 defendants on charges ranging from embezzlement to murder, got under way April 21.

Sen said a new trial will start soon. The court wants to find out what happened to the 16 million dollars Duce had with him when Communist partisans caught him trying to flee to Switzerland.

U.S. Takes Possession of Warning Line

POINT BARROW, Alaska, Aug. 13 (AP)—The government today took possession of the half-billion-dollar DeW Line warning line. The line is a 300-mile line across the Arctic Ocean to accept the DEW Line in behalf of the Air Force.

Brig. Gen. Stanley Wagon, chief of the U.S. Air Force's electric defense system, arrived yesterday at this lonely outpost on the Arctic Ocean to accept the DEW Line in behalf of the Air Force.

The Western Electric Co. prime contractors in construction of the 300-mile line across the rim of the continent turned over the DEW Line to the Air Force and the Air Force immediately delivered control of the line to the Federal Electric Corp.

Civilian technicians of the Federal Electric Corp. will operate the line under a contract with the government.

The commission will hear a recommendation from its variance committee headed by T. W. Lane Tuesday night.

Other reports scheduled for night for the Aug. 17 meeting will come from David L. Hammons, streets and traffic committee on proposed extension of Widows Lane and Margaret Street and on the 12th Street Civic Association plan for extending Berry Street and underpassing the railroad at Hines Street.

A city attorney's report on legislation setting standards for conversion also was requested for the Aug. 17 commission session.

Next night's session was the first in which Wesley J. Kvarstrom served as planning consultant. Kvarstrom, director of the New Mid-Western Valley Planning Council, is now serving as consultant to the various public agencies represented in the council.
