

5 Men Working Overtime Perish in Cave-in of Clay

DRESDEN, Ore., Aug. 14 (AP)—Five men working overtime died tonight in a cave-in while laying the foundation for a new water-works pump-house.

The men were buried alive by heavy clay in a 35-foot hole.

Rescue workers were able to locate three bodies tonight and still sought the bodies of the other two. Officials said that another slide delayed recovery of the bodies.

Dresden is 12 miles north of Chatham, about halfway between London and Windsor.

Joseph Graber, who lives near the site, said he had been watching the men at work on the bank of the Sydenham River. Suddenly there was a thundering roar and 200 tons of clay caved in, he said.

The men were pushed against the other side of the steel structure. As the fall increased they were covered.

For three minutes the men screamed. Then their cries died away. The foreman rushed down and jumped on top of the earth working feverishly with a spade attempting to get them out.

The other workmen and I attempted to clear the thick clay with shovels. But it was far too heavy. We had to use the crane.

Forty rescuers labored by floodlight with mechanical equipment in an attempt to lift out the clay. The men were supposed to quit work at 4 p.m. but they stayed on tonight in an attempt to finish laying the concrete base.

Short Trip Turns Long For Boater

PORT ORFORD, Ore., Aug. 14 (AP)—George Marchman set out in an eight-foot boat to row 150 yards to a fishing boat anchored in the harbor here.

The 45-year-old Coos Bay Ore. man is a crewman on the boat.

But when he got out in the harbor his paddle broke.

He tried to row with his hands but couldn't get up enough power and the tide swept the little boat out into the Pacific Ocean.

For the next 14 hours the boat bounced along the Pacific always within sight of land.

Several times Marchman tried to land the boat but failed.

In between he battled it out with one of his shoes.

The boat driven by a strong wind finally slipped through heavy breakers and landed safely on a beach yesterday at Ophir.

The beach is 20 miles south of here.

Average Ram Price Higher

PENDELTON, Ore., Aug. 14 (AP)—The average sale price per head at the 31st annual Oregon ram sale this week here generally was higher than last year for all breeds except Suffolks, which dropped more than had below the 1936 level.

Rambouillet rams sold for an average of \$127.20 per head, compared to \$144.90 in 1936. Lincoln Rambouillet Crossbreds sold for \$162.50 per head in 1936 with no sale in 1937.

Hampshires averaged \$65 this year compared to \$60.90 in 1936. Columbias sold for \$125 compared to \$85 per head in 1936. There was no comparative price on Dorsets.

The drop in Suffolk rams from \$123.92 per head in 1936 to \$67.13 per head at this year's sale was blamed on the demand for white-faced rams for replacement purposes.

HAZEL PARK, Mich., Aug. 14 (AP)—Oliver Godsey, superintendent of public works in this Detroit suburb, says no manhole covers scheduled for use on a street paving project went for beer money.

Godsey said City Councilman Zigmund Niparko was mistaken in a report Monday night that workmen had appropriated cast iron covers, sold them for scrap and split the money for beer.

Juvenile Crime Wave Brings Plea For More Officers

PORTLAND, Aug. 14 (AP)—A juvenile court judge called today for more police officers to help curb a rising juvenile crime wave here in the past three months.

Since Aug. 1, police records show more than 100 juveniles have been arrested for crimes ranging from curfew violations to burglary.

Judge Virgil Langtry, chairman of a newly formed citizens committee to study juvenile delinquency, said more officers should be assigned to the juvenile division to try to curb the crime increase.

Federal Reserve Bank in Bay Area Ups Discount Rate

WASHINGTON, Aug. 14 (AP)—The Federal Reserve Board said tonight the discount rate at the Federal Reserve Bank in San Francisco has been raised from 3 to 3 1/2 per cent effective tomorrow.

Last week similar action was taken at 7 of the other 11 federal reserve banks. Still charging the 2 per cent rate are New York, Cleveland, Richmond, and St. Louis. They are expected to follow suit soon.

The discount rate is the interest which the federal reserve charges its member banks on borrowed money. Raising the discount rate tends to discourage bank borrowing and in turn decreases the amount which the member banks can lend. The Federal Reserve Board considers an increase in the discount rate as a means to combat too extensive credit and inflation.

88-Year-Old Woman Found Dead on Peak

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo., Aug. 14 (AP)—Because "she couldn't see a mountain and she didn't want to climb it," Mrs. Inestine Roberts was found dead on a peak of Pike's Peak.

The 88-year-old woman's body was found today high on Pike's Peak—a 14,139-foot mountain she had climbed 14 times before. She apparently had fallen and died of exposure.

Searchers found her body not far from where she was last seen Aug. 3.

The frail white-haired Mrs. Roberts conquered many of the nation's tallest mountains.

"She couldn't sit still," said Mrs. Margery Feldkirchner, one of Mrs. Roberts' four daughters, Colorado Springs in the past 10 years.

She left a week ago Saturday for her 12th hike alone to the top of Pike's Peak and back. She was last seen by another hiker two days later on her way down, carrying a small sack of food.

The body was found in a gully of Timberline cabin, a ramshackle landmark. Coroner William Joss said the woman may have been dead for a week.

A great-grandmother of 10 times, Mrs. Roberts was a native of Sisseton, Pa. and a member of numerous climbing and historical groups. She was the oldest member of the Prairie Mountain Club of Chicago.

Surviving besides Mrs. Feldkirchner are three other daughters, Mrs. Helen Griffith of Los Angeles, Mrs. Florence Turner of Chicago and Mrs. Lillian Shary of Tucson, Ariz., two sons, Edgar Roberts of Grand Rapids, Mich., and Herbert Hamilton, San Diego, Calif.

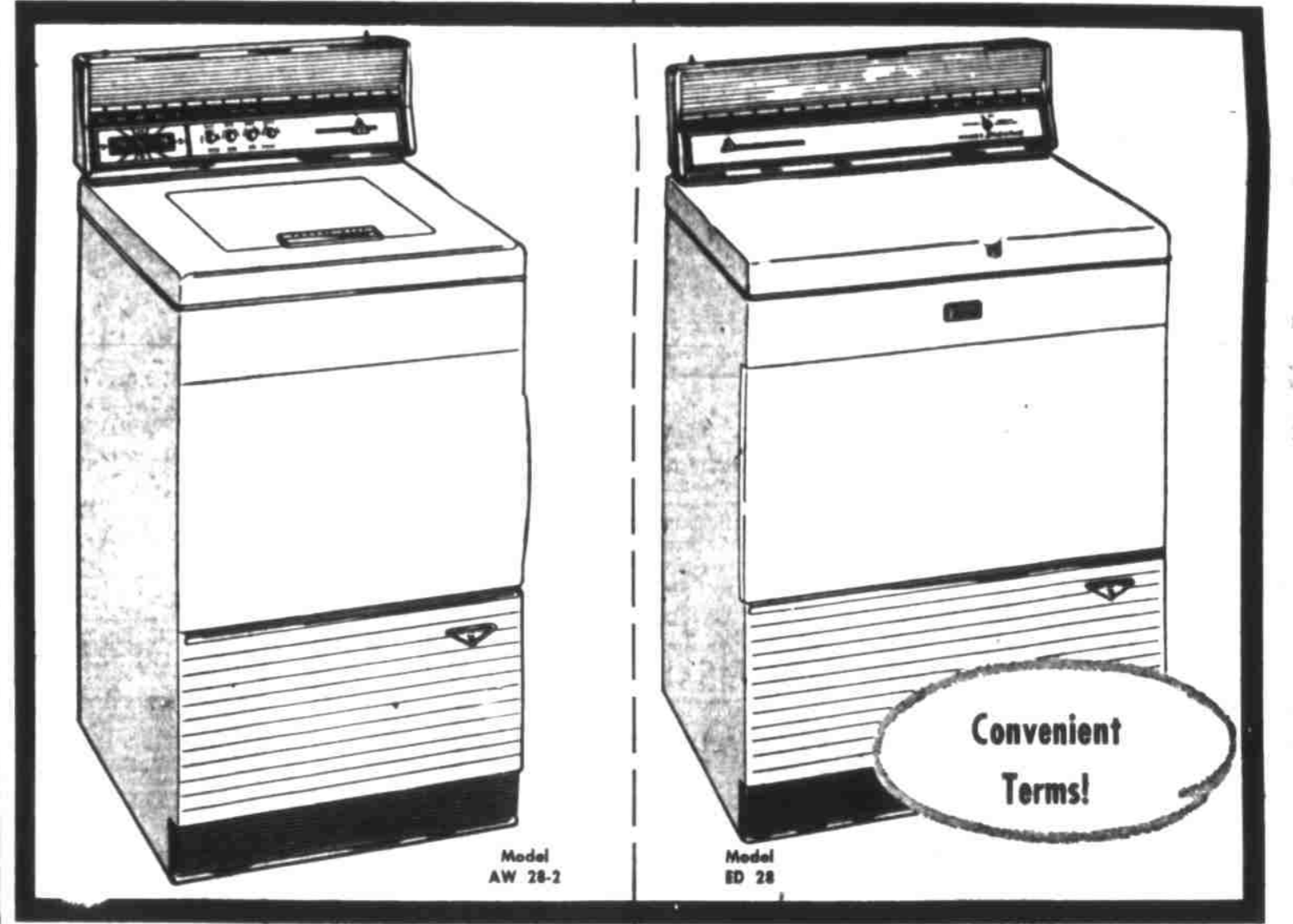
