INDEPENDENCE, Aug. 20—A Japanese high school baseball coach who was born at Independence in 1924, today led his team to its first Japan National Baseball Championship since World War II. He is Yasuhiko Enoki of Commercial High School in Hiroshima.

The city of 400,000 citizens erupted into wild celebration, pouring into streets, back slapping and shaking hands with strangers and toasting the American born coach who went to Japan in 1931.

Commercial defeated Hosen (Kawasaki) Second High School 3 to 1 in the finals at Koshien near Osaka.
