Budworm Infestation Rated Serious

PORTLAND Sept. 12 (AP)—A serious budworm infestation in Pacific Northwest timber was reported here today by E. L. Kolbe, chief forester of the Western Pine Assn.

Kolbe told a press conference at the association's semi-annual meeting here that 800,000 to 1,000,000 acres were infested with the destructive pest in the high country areas bounded by John Day, La Grande and Baker rivers.

He said there also is an infestation in the Yakima Indian Reservation in Washington but the extent of it has not been determined.

Kolbe said he planned to meet with state and federal foresters in Princeton, Ore. Wednesday to begin a survey of the situation.

This is the first serious outbreak for several years since some 4 million acres of timber were sprayed to kill spruce budworm.

Kolbe expressed hope that the new infestation could be controlled quickly by spraying at a cost of \$1 an acre.

Most of the affected area is federal land and he said he believed money is available for the work.

In an interview with the Egyptian Middle East News Agency, Bizry said he came here on a pilgrimage to see President Nasser and visited Maj. Gen. Abdel Hakim Amer, Egyptian defense minister, "because it is the first duty of a soldier to contact his commander."

Innocent Plea Given By Beck

TACOMA, Wash., Sept. 12 (AP)—Teamsters President Dave Beck today pleaded innocent to charges he defrauded the government of \$184,000 in income taxes for the years 1951-53.

Plea of innocent to charges of helping Beck evade tax payments were entered in U.S. District Court by Dave Beck Jr. and two Teamsters Union officials, Fred Verhoeven Sr. and Norman J. Gersert.

The four were indicted Aug. 28 by a federal grand jury—Beck on seven counts of tax evasion, the others with conspiracy.

Also indicted on charges of conspiring with Beck to help him cheat the government were Nathan Shefferman, Chicago labor relations consultant, and his son, Shelton.

Beck is accused of evading a total of \$240,000 in income taxes for the four years, 1950-53. The same grand jury indicted him last May on a charge of failing to pay \$64,000 due in income taxes in 1950. Beck pleaded innocent to this charge, too.

PENDLETON, Ore., Sept. 12 (AP)—John Hatley, a 275-pound former professional football player, was the first cowboy to break a rodeo record at the Pendleton Round-Up.

Hatley, who formerly was with the Chicago Bears, bulldogged his steer in 5.9 seconds today—four-tenths of a second better than the 6.3 mark held by Wayne Dunsford, Westmoreland, Kan.

Hatley, who comes from Uvalde, Tex., will have to turn in two more top performances to win the event, however. Winners are judged on the average of their time in three "go rounds" in all events—bulldogging, bronc riding, calf roping, bareback riding, Brahma bull riding, and steer roping.

Bill Linderman of Walla Walla, Wash., the top money winner in rodeo history, had some hard luck today. He missed his plunging steer and fell to the ground.

Pacific Northwest Indian tribes, who traditionally provide much of the color for the Round-Up, presented a pageant this afternoon.

The final go round and presentation of trophies will be televised Saturday by the Columbia Broadcasting System.
