LANGHORNE, Pa., Oct. 12 (AP)—A local tool engineer learned today that the widow of a man whose life he had twice saved left him half a million dollars.

BPA Reports '57 Revenue Sets Record

PORTLAND, Oct. 12 (AP)—The Bonneville Power Administration today reported a record revenue of \$66,399,970 for fiscal 1957.

The federal power system sold more than 28 billion kilowatt hours in the Pacific Northwest in the year, boosting revenue 8.87 per cent over fiscal 1956, said administrator William A. Pearl.

Net revenue was \$5,965,735, but was no record. The largest net came in 1952, when it was nearly 18 million dollars.

Since Bonneville's inception in 1938, the system has grossed \$529,205,862, and netted \$104,711,340, Pearl said.

Revenues go to pay back the federal government for construction costs. The report did not give the status of that, although in the past Bonneville has reported its repayments are running far ahead of schedule.

The report said industrial customers accounted for 42.89 per cent of the revenue, with aluminum industries alone providing 30.16 per cent. Public utilities accounted for 33.2 per cent, private utilities 21.76 per cent and miscellaneous sales 2.15 per cent.

7 Miss World Finalists Hit By Asian Flu

LONDON, Oct. 12 (AP)—Seven of the 23 finalists in the 1957 Miss World contest came down with Asian flu tonight.

The sneezing, coughing collection of international beauties—fussed over like a prize collection of ailing thoroughbreds on the eve of a big race—were bedded down in their hotel rooms.

Contest officials, deprived of almost a third of their finalists, brought in teams of doctors to help put the beauties back on their feet within the 48-hour deadline. The showdown in London's seventh Miss World contest comes Monday night.

The other 16 finalists were taken out to spend the day absorbing some seaside air at a resort.

Those with the flu are Miss Belgium, Jane Chaudelle; Miss Canada, Judy Welch; Miss Denmark, Lilian Madsen; Miss Iceland, Runa Brynjolfsdottir; Miss Ireland, Nessa Welsh; Miss South Africa, Adele Kruger; and Miss U.S.A., Charlotte Sheffield.

All the cases appeared mild.

Yellow Jackets' Stings Prove Fatal to Hunter

GRANGEVILLE, Idaho, Oct. 12 (AP)—A hunter died tonight shortly after being stung by yellow jackets in the Selway Wilderness Area, about 75 miles east of here, Idaho County Sheriff Bud Taylor said.

The man was identified as Rodney Brackenbury, 38, owner of the Idaho Hotel in Lewiston and the father of three.

Brackenbury apparently went into convulsions and collapsed after being stung by the wasp-like insects, Taylor said. His hunting companion in the rugged country near the Idaho-Montana line walked to the Finn ranger station for help, he said.

The stings set up a violent reaction which effected the heart, said Dr. Ralph Buttermore, Idaho County coroner who examined the body.

Parts of Brackenbury's body were still swollen and discolored when he was brought to a funeral parlor at Koonkia, Idaho, Taylor said.

For two years no person died among the town's population of 140. Then, in less than 48 hours, three persons died. The first was the town's pastor. He was 79.

Bomber Aids Sick Sailor

HONOLULU, Oct. 12 (AP)—A British Shackleton bomber made a successful airdrop today of vital needed medical supplies for a critically ill sailor aboard the U.S. Navy icebreaker Glacier.

The bomber flew 1,100 miles west from its Christmas Island base to reach the ship.

Aboard the Glacier is Seaman Larry L. Darling of Effingham, Ill., stricken with encephalitis, a brain infection commonly called sleeping sickness.

Paddlin' Principal Freed of Assault

DECATUR, Ill., Oct. 12 (AP)—A high school principal who paddled an errant pupil was acquitted today of an assault and battery charge.

The finding was announced by Harry Sackriter, a justice of the peace, in an action brought by the mother of 14-year-old Larry Lindsey against David W. Beggs, III, the principal of Lakeview High School.

The mother, Mrs. Gladys Lindsey, charged that Beggs, who is 26, broke the law when he whacked the pupil with a 14-inch wooden paddle for taking clothing from another pupil's locker.
