

Heart Ailments to Be Studied at Conference

Heart ailments, including rheumatic fever, coronary, and hypertension, will be the topic of the second "sneak preview" of health programs available Monday to county residents from Marion County health department.

The heart disease and prevention program, scheduled from 1:30 to 3 p.m. Monday in the Salem General Hospital conference room, is the second in a series of three conducted by the health department.

The programs show representatives of parent, social, civic farm and service groups planning available to be organized for their individual health meetings, said Mrs. Bernice Yeary, director of nurses in the health department.

Two movies will be reviewed at the meeting. One is "Common Heart Disorders" which covers rheumatic fever, coronary, hyper-

tension and how to cope with a heart condition or overweight problems. The other is "The Valiant Heart" which concerns rheumatic fever and its correlation to heart trouble.

Another part of the program will be a short skit on weight control and heart difficulties and group discussions. The weight control classes conducted by the Marion Health Department will be illustrated.

The present weight classes will be completed this month, and the new series, which meets at the Marion County health department will begin in November. The classes are held in cooperation with the Marion County Heart Association, said Mrs. Yeary.

Last Monday over 50 persons attended the first preview concerning the mental health program, and next Monday the program concerning safety will be presented.

Celebration Due for Ike's Birthday

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12 (AP) — President Nixon and several hundred volunteer GOP fund-raisers will spearhead a "Happy Birthday" celebration for President Eisenhower at the White House Monday.

They will present a cake, and if the weather is good they will get a few presidential remarks out in the White House rose garden.

The President, who will be 67, has made no special plans of his own to observe the day, the White House said. There is a good possibility a family dinner Monday night will take some note of the anniversary.

Eisenhower is described by his doctors as in good shape with his weight around 172 pounds. After an early breakfast conference with Sen. Knowland (R-Calif.) today he motored 25 miles into Maryland to play golf at Ft. Meade with Lt. Gen. Floyd Parks, retired.

The Soviet newspaper, the Soviet government today expelled Danish Embassy attaché Leo Raneik in retaliation for the ouster Oct. 2 of a Soviet Embassy employee from Copenhagen.

The Soviet news agency Tass said Dep. Foreign Minister A. K. Zakharov summoned Danish Consul Anker Svast to the Foreign Office and protested that the Danish government had expelled a member of the Soviet Embassy staff in Denmark for the third time this year "without reason."

Zakharov also told the Danish diplomat that the Soviet government ceases what he called its hostile actions, the Soviet government will take retaliatory measures.

Zakharov said the Soviet Embassy employee, Sergei S. Smirnov, had done nothing to warrant expulsion. He charged that Danish newspapers had written hostile stories about Smirnov and other expelled Soviet employees "to hide military preparations of the NATO bloc."
