LEBANON, Nov. 20.—W. Glenn Huston, Linn County coroner, regained consciousness and was reported "much improved" today following the Tuesday truck auto collision that cost the life of O.M. Stevenson, Lebanon horseman and fuel dealer.

Examination of head injuries Huston incurred in the crash indicate concussion but no fractures, it was reported by Lebanon Community Hospital today. Huston is not allowed visitors, however. Huston was passenger of Stevenson in car that collided with a gravel truck on Tangent road three miles west of here Tuesday morning. Stevenson was killed outright.
