Daugherty Keeps Job

Passes Up Offer Of Texas A&M

enach Hugh Duffy Daugherty to day passed up a reported \$60,000 a-year coaching position at Texas A&M because his heart belongs Michigan State University.

Daugherty's decisies to remain at MSU was the big news as the Big Ten annual winter meeting get underway with football coaches and athletic direc-tors shaping 1961-61 grid sched-

Daugherty told reporters, after ejecting Texas A&M's offer of head coaching job and athletic di-rectorship by long distance teledeep at Michigan State.

Daugherty had deliberated on the offer since Monday noon when he had conferred with Texas A&M officials concerning the position vacated when Bear Bryant quit to become ceach at Alabama. Daugherty, 42. head MSU coach

since 1954, receives an estimated

Daugherty, whose 1957 Spartans had an 8-1 record and finished third in the national AP poil, said he did not use the Texas A&M offer to bargain for

bigger salary at MSU. "As far as I know, my salary is still the same," said Duffy. He did not disclose the Texas A&M terms and chuckled "that's a lot of money" when the \$60,000 figure

MSU athletic director Biggie Munn, whom Daugherty suc-ceeded as head coach, said he was "very pleased" with Duffy's decision to remain at MSU. "He has done a fine job and I hope he will be with us for years to

"There are no finer people anywhere and those people down there (Texas A&M)," said Daugh-
