

Boy, 13, Recovering From 5 Days, Nights Trapped Inside Truck Body

PORTLAND, Dec. 12 (AP)—Francis Clow, a 13-year-old school boy, recovering at his home here from what he said was five days and nights spent trapped inside an abandoned truck body.

During his ordeal, the boy lost 23 pounds and contracted an infection of the feet as a result of the long time spent in the wet and cold, his mother, Mrs. Kenneth M. Clow, said.

His doctor told her he may have to spend another week in bed, she said.

The boy finally escaped by beating open an emergency door with a heavy piece of pipe he found inside the enclosed truck body, he told his parents.

Francis disappeared Friday, Nov. 29. He said he went to play in the vicinity of N.E. 10th Ave. and Columbia St., where a friend had some riding horses.

The boy, en route, got into the truck body and the door slammed shut and locked from the outside.

Francis said he yelled, but apparently no one heard him. He found the pipe and began pounding on the door which finally gave way after the long period of intermittent beating.

The boy had nothing to eat, but said he managed to get some moisture by reaching through a hole in the side of the truck body and wetting his hand with rain.

Then he licked his hand, he said. His thirst was his worst suffering, he said.

Francis told his mother he never doubted that he would get out. "He said he never prayed so hard in his life," she added.

When Francis failed to come home, his mother called the police.

Rogue River Residents Ask Flood Control

GRANTS PASS, Dec. 12 (AP)—Residents of the Rogue River Basin want and need flood protection, the state Water Resources Board was told today in the second of hearings on development of the Rogue Basin.

Ben Hillon, Grants Pass, cited the disastrous floods of 1965 and previous years in urging that flood control works be started soon.

Hillon said, however, that other uses should be considered also and that "large structure should be planned for the foreseeable future and not as a stopgap for the present."

The board, which held a hearing at Medford yesterday, will hold another at Gold Beach tomorrow.

The board, represented by chairman L. C. Bimler, Portland, and John D. Davis, Stayton, also heard reports from Hugh McKinley, Grants Pass city manager; Larry Cushing, Cave Junction; George W. Baker, Grants Pass; Hugh Moulton, Grants Pass; and G. Hathaway, Grants Pass.

The report on domestic use indicated that Grants Pass has ample municipal water for the present but that future growth might require an additional supply.

The present appropriation is 12 second feet and the city has applied for an additional 10.

The convention also voted to seek less dependence by agriculture on government.

The big farm organization declared in a resolution that all elements of the economy should return to what it called the "competitive enterprise system."

By unanimous vote the delegates adopted a farm policy platform that commits the Farm Bureau to fight for changes in federal farm laws that would allow farmers greater freedom in operating their farms and permit farm prices to be determined in a freer market by free market forces.

The convention renewed demands of its predecessor of a year ago that labor unions be made subject to antitrust laws. It called also for federal legislation to outlaw labor racketeering such as has been uncovered by recent congressional investigations.

The delegates voted down with a roar a proposal that it back-track on its previous stand favoring federal legislation prohibiting compulsory unionism.

Before closing, the convention re-elected Charles B. Shuman, Sullivan, Ill., livestock farmer, president by acclamation. Shuman is completing his third year as president.

BECK LARCENY TRIAL RESUMES

SEATTLE, Dec. 12 (AP)—Dave Beck's grand larceny trial resumed this afternoon after a half day delay that touched off speculation the case had taken an unexpected turn.

However, when Superior Judge George H. Reville convened court at 1:30 p. m. he made only passing reference to an all-morning meeting with opposing attorneys as a "conference on instructions."

Beck, 63-year-old Teamsters' president, is accused of keeping \$1,900 from the sale of a union-owned 1952 Cadillac. He was indicted last summer by a King County grand jury.

Both sides rested yesterday in the ninth day of the trial and it had been expected the case would go to the Superior Court jury of seven men and five women late today.
