Insurance Executive Forecasts Brighter Days

With 1957 closing on a high note of a 50 per cent business increase over last year, Prudential Insurance Company of America is pretty sure Salem, Oregon, and the nation have bright days ahead.

That was the word brought Tuesday by J. Edward Day of Los Angeles, vice president of Prudential's western operations, who talked here with businessmen, bankers and staff managers of his Salem office under J. G. (Woody) Sorenson.

Day, who was "impressed with Salem's buildings and wide streets," agreed with Sorenson there probably would be a 50 per cent increase in Prudential's overall present staff of 31 persons in Salem within the next year.

A decline in business capital expenditures but an increase in housing starts, inventory purchases and government spending, with consumer purchases turning more toward durable goods, were included in Day's business forecasts.

Prudential has \$2,000,000 in residential and farm mortgage loans in the Salem area, \$60,000,000 in Oregon and more than a billion dollars in western United States alone, Day said. The company holds the mortgage loan for the projected \$24,000,000 Lloyd's Center in Portland, and is building a \$100,000,000 office, apartment and shopping center development in Boston.

Corporations Department Moves Today

Salem Pair See Amazon Jungle Life

The wild jungles along the Amazon River in South America lack many of the comforts that make life easy, but they're high on a Salem couple's list of what to give the world traveler who's seen everything.

Mr. and Mrs. Donald J. Madison, 1565 24th St. NE, who have skinned over a good part of the earth hunting adventure, returned Thursday from a 24,000-mile, 80-day jaunt through the mountains, tangles and river country of upper South America.

Madison recalls watching a native tot go wading in the Amazon. "Fish-eating fish ate off a foot," he said.

Life is fairly casual in the jungle, he said, and people don't seem concerned about "North American" standards. Drinking water on the river boat on which they spent five days came straight from the river. "It was like a sewer," Madison said.

"We lived on a case of soda water we had brought along," he said, "and on fruit bought from vendors on shore."

"I guess the other 23 passengers must have thought we were kind of choosy," he said.

Poker was a welcome bit of civilization, Madison recalls. "We used to play on a boat constrictor's cage," he said, "with him inside."

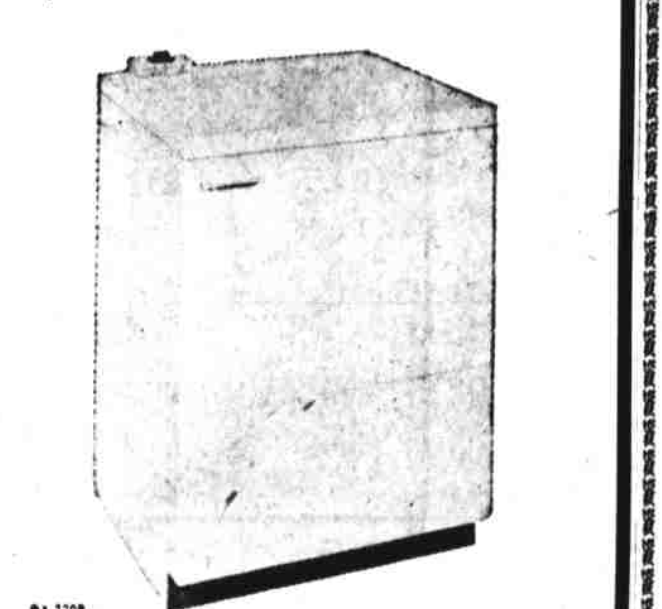
