There, perhaps, or elsewhere in those fertile, gentle hills, lay the goal of Luke's search—the story of God's descent to man, of the coming of the Messiah, a stroke of providence that arches over all history.

Could the curious, one-time pagan physician, even with his disciplined skills of diagnosis, pierce this marvel?

It had been long ago, Luke, in Jesus' days, had been only a boy, not yet in his teens, and in his distant heathen city, heard nothing of Him. But now in his middle years, a fervent believer, he hunted more enlightenment.

Well-filled Pouch Over Luke's shoulder hung a worn pouch, laden with ointments, instruments and salves, jars of sedative aconite, purging casta, aloes...

At road fork, he took the southerly loop that avoided the easterly crossing of the Kishon River, and thence traveled on north into the rolling homeland of Jesus.

Along the way, at the towns of Shumen, Chesuluth, Japha and Sepphoris, he spoke with whom he met, the patriarchs in the village squares, the old smiths, potters, tanners, farmers flailing wheat on a threshing floor.

"Did you know him? Did you see him? What incidents do you recall?"

Most of them were old, their hair white, their eyes cased in wrinkles, their limbs thin and dry. But Luke found their memories of Jesus vivid and undimmed. He carried a wax tablet, its sheets fastened with rings and held apart by metal studs to prevent blurring of the notes he made with his stylus.

No Hearsay He discounted the loose prattle, legends and hearsay. He relied, as he wrote later, only on those who "from the beginning were eyewitnesses and ministers of the word."

Its snowy marble towers, walled terraces and gold-embossed gates shimmered high above the city. The series of huge concentric courts, trobbing with voices and music of harp and flutes, could contain 210,000 people.

On the return trip, when the Galilee group halted after a day's journey, possibly at Sichein, Jesus could not be found. His parents returned to the city, searching three days before finding him.

Amazes Listeners There, in a cluster of learned rabbis at the Temple, he sat listening, asking questions and amazing all with his understanding and answers. As Luke learned, the boy's mother, half relieved, half reproachful, hurried to him, saying: "Son, why have you treated us so? Behold, your father and I have been looking for you anxiously."

New Haven Rail Silverton Churches Line Joins in Passenger Cuts Ready Yule Service

NEW YORK, Dec. 20 (AP)—The flight of the railroads from the passenger business gathered speed today when the New Haven Railroad said it would cut passenger service 30 per cent on Jan. 2.

The New Haven joined the New York Central, which is attempting to abandon all passenger service on some of its western lines, and the Baltimore and Ohio, which wants to eliminate service between Baltimore and New York.

Along the same retreating line, the Chicago and Northwestern yesterday asked the Illinois Commerce Commission for permission to revamp its commuter service, including the elimination of 23 of the 49 stations on the road's three commuter lines into Chicago.

The New Haven said it will drop five trains in each direction between New York and Boston from among the 28 trains now operated. Two trains in each direction will be dropped from the 32 trains a day which now run between New York and Springfield.

In addition, two round trips between New Haven and Springfield, and one round trip between New Haven and New York, will be dropped.

Among trains to be eliminated are the Mayflower, the Senator, the New Yorker and the advance Merchants Limited on Fridays and Sundays only.

The road said it has notified the public utilities commissions in each state it serves of its plans but said approval of the commissions is not needed.

Reason for the cutback, the road said, was a falling off in passenger service. The New Haven also will curtail the number of freight trains it operates.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 20 (AP)—Sen. Dworshak (R-Idaho) said today that Sen. Neuberger (D-Ore) has come up with a "mulish" proposal to "put a deep freeze on dam sites" in Idaho.

Dworshak said Neuberger proposed recently that no Columbia River dams be constructed above Grand Coulee until the problem of moving migratory fish over high dams is solved, and then that only federal projects be built.

Declaring that this is an example of "mulish thinking," Dworshak said "this is typical of the Oregon senator's approach... all dams in the lower basin are fine but don't build anything in Idaho."

Dworshak said Neuberger has opposed the proposed 500-foot high Bruce's Eddy Dam on the Clearwater River on grounds it would block fish runs, "yet he worked with a derisive" for the proposed 700-foot high Hell's Canyon Dam in the Snake River.

"The inconsistency of the Oregon senator's allegiances points to the fact that he is opposed to federal dams if they are in Idaho and private dams if they are in the Northwest," Dworshak said.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 20 (AP)—The Army said today it has looked over a model of a "proposed space vehicle" developed by Otis T. Carr of Baltimore, but has no interest in the project.

In reply to a question, a spokesman said Army representatives met with Carr in Baltimore on Monday to investigate his model.

The spokesman said: "The model shown does not present or foreseeable needs of the Army and the Army has no further interest in the project as presented."

Carr's OTC Enterprises Inc. said when it announced its plans Oct. 22, said it had developed a method of using gravity in circular motion machines capable of powering everything from hearing aids to space cruisers.

The firm claimed it could build a "free energy circular foil" space craft to hedge-pool among the planets in controlled flight if enough money were made available. Carr officials did not specify how much money was needed.

When it announced its claims, the Carr firm said it had sent rough outlines of them to government officials.
