

Expense Money Becomes Income Tax Payers' Headache During '58

WASHINGTON, Dec. 31 (AP) — Delegates to the annual meeting of the American Association of Taxpayers are going to take a personal interest in the expense accounts of millions of Americans.
So you might add this to your list of New Year's Resolutions: I will faithfully keep a record of all expense money paid me during 1958 and will carefully note my actual on-the-job expenses, whether greater or smaller than the amount I collect in reimbursement.
This information will be needed when you file your 1958 income tax return early in 1959. A spokesman for the Internal Revenue Service has put it this way: "The taxpayer is now on notice that he must henceforth keep records of his expense accounts."

African-Asian Delegation Denounces 'Imperialism'

CAIRO, Dec. 31 (AP) — Delegates to the African-Asian conference held in Cairo today denounced the United States, Britain and France as the villains today in repeated denunciations of "imperialism."
A delegate from Outer Mongolia, a virtually a Soviet colony, denounced Western colonialism.
One demand, by a Moroccan delegate not recognized by the government, was for withdrawal of the United States from its bases in North Africa.
The conference's anti-Western, extreme nationalist coloration, contrasted with a marked tolerance for the Soviet Union, was emphasized more than ever at a full dress session of the more than 400 delegates from 42 nations and colonies who assembled last Thursday. The conference ends tomorrow.
As delegate after delegate denounced the West, a Soviet government official proclaimed his country a "tireless champion of peace and an irreconcilable enemy of imperialism and colonialism."
The Soviet spokesman was Shafar R. Rashidov, vice president of the Soviet Parliament's Presidium. Although the delegates do not officially represent their countries and some are frowned upon by their governments, the Soviet delegates have spoken authoritatively in offering economic aid to all African and Asian countries.
Rashidov declared the United States seeks to enslave underdeveloped countries under the guise of offering them aid.

Cars Skid on Ice; 2 Saved From Water

Two cars skidded on Tuesday morning frost on South 12th Street, one of them flipping onto its back in Pringle Creek, state police said.
Occupants of the car that fell in the creek, Mr. and Mrs. Emanuel Perman of Salem, were rescued from possible drowning by a Greyhound bus driver, Officer Norman Johnson reported.
The two accidents occurred within minutes of each other about 7:45 a.m. A car driven by Miss Wilma S. Miller, 716 Lancaster Dr. SE, skidded into a power pole in the ditch beside the road with minor damage, Johnson said.
The Permans car plunged from the Pringle Creek culvert about five minutes later and landed on its top in about three feet of water.
Greyhound driver Buzz Quimby of Portland stopped his southbound bus, ran to the creek and pulled the Permans from the car through a rear window. The Permans, 4010 Pacific Highway SE, are both 37.
Mrs. Perman was treated by Willamette Ambulance Service attendants for leg abrasions. Neither she nor her husband was hospitalized and Miss Miller was apparently uninjured, police said.

Schrunk Suggests Public Agency to Run Transit Lines

PORTLAND, Dec. 31 (AP) — Portland Mayor Terry Schrunk today urged a mass transit authority for Portland unless the city is able to work out a new franchise with the Rose City Transit Co. "in the next few weeks."
The proposal for the public agency to procure and operate the city's mass transit system is one of 13 recommendations in the Mayor's year-end report.
The company has asked for a new franchise with a five-cent fare increase. This would raise fares to 25 cents. Schrunk said the present fare schedule should be maintained for the present.

Iraq to Aid Rebels

BAGHDAD, Dec. 31 (AP) — Finance Minister Nadim Al-Fayadh reports Iraq will appropriate \$700,000 for Algerian rebels in their war against the French. He plans to include this item in the budget presented to Parliament this week.

Harry replaces John Hodges, who has gone to work for the federal government.

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Marion County Jail Bookings Rose in 1957

Prisoner bookings at the Marion County Jail during 1957 increased about 10 per cent over last year, said Sheriff Denver Young. During the year 1,004 prisoners were tallied in at the courthouse.
Of these 612 were arrested by the sheriff's office, with the remainder being apprehended by city or state police forces.
Felonies, or crimes punishable by more than a year in prison, counted for 176 of those arrested by the office.
Misdemeanors, or smaller crimes, counted for 251, arrests for agencies outside the county added another 65, and 20 were parole violations, Young added.
The department also filed some 3,085 civil cases during the year, from which \$9,159 was recovered and turned over to the county treasurer. The suits include any matters not covered under criminal law, commented Young.
Courtroom facilities also housed 333 juveniles during the year.

Bids Asked on New Bridges

Bids will be taken Jan. 16 for a South Yamhill River bridge and Wallace Bridge overcrossing for a new Salmon River Highway route bypassing Sheridan and Willamina, the State Highway Commission announced Tuesday.
The new route will cross the river and the present highway near Wallace Bridge about five miles southwest of Sheridan.
Bids for a total of 16 projects costing an estimated \$4 million will be taken at the meeting in Portland.

Expense Money Aid to Income

Thus, if you collected \$25 on expense accounts during the year, you would add \$25 to your income. If your actual expenses were \$25 you'd immediately subtract this and be right back where you started.
If any taxpayer collects more expense money from his boss than he actually spends, his return would have to show this, and the excess would be treated as taxable income.
Your records will have to be detailed because, in addition to the figuring outlined above, you'll have to itemize your expenses separately. So much for taxis, mileage allowances, food, entertainment, etc.
Small Checks Unlikely
Uncle Sam wants this information so he can tell if someone is claiming an expense which isn't legitimate.
If your expense accounts don't add up to much, you probably needn't be fearful that a tax agent will come around questioning you about your tally.
Russell C. Harrington, director of IRS, has said "a revenue agent isn't going to spend a lot of time on small amounts."
Still, you never know when your tax return might be reviewed in one of the spot checks that are made to see how honest we Americans are about taxes.
It's best to be prepared—so make that New Year's resolution.

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Former Wool Mill Official Succumbs

Arthur R. Jones, of Menlo Park, California, former resident of Salem, died at his home Tuesday afternoon, according to word received by The Statesman. Death was attributed to heart trouble. He became ill Tuesday morning. Jones was superintendent of the Key Woolen Mills here for a number of years. He and Mrs. Jones removed to California about three years ago.

Arthur Rothwell Jones was born in Trumbull, Neb., in 1882. When he was about 10, his family moved to Skowhegan, Me., where he completed his education and entered the woolen mills industry. He rose rapidly in woolen manufacturing as an employee of the American Woolen Company and served as superintendent of their mills in various New England cities, including Skowhegan, and Dexter, Maine and Dover and Keene, New Hampshire. A staunch Republican, Mr. Jones became active in politics. He was mayor of Keene for three years and served as state senator in New Hampshire, one term as president of that body.

He was married in Skowhegan to Miss Mabel Witham, who survives. Other surviving relatives are a daughter, Mrs. Ruth Mitchell of Cincinnati, Ohio; two grandchildren, John and Elaine Mitchell; three sisters, Mrs. Robert A. Neal of Atherton, Cal., Mrs. Mary Smith of Dover, N.H., Mrs. Hiram Berry of Worcester, Mass. Mr. Jones was a member of Somerset lodge, A.F. & A.M. and the consistory, of Skowhegan. The funeral will be held Friday afternoon at Roller & Haggood, Funeral Directors, Palo Alto, Cal.

Man, Woman Return Voluntarily To Answer Count

Mrs. Emir Hackett, 28, and David Simpson, 22, both of Alderwood Manor, Wash., appeared voluntarily Tuesday afternoon to plead innocent in Marion County Circuit Court on charges of contributing to the delinquency of minors.
The former Salem residents are accused in a grand jury secret indictment returned Nov. 6 of "conducting themselves in an immoral manner" before four minor children on July 25.
The case was continued for trial. Bail was set at \$250 each.

Complaints Filed Against Delayed Lumber Shipments

WASHINGTON, Dec. 31 (AP) — The Interstate Commerce Commission today said it is seeking to stop what it terms the delayed lumber shipment practices of two major railroads.
Complaints against the Union Pacific and Northern Pacific railroads have been filed in Iowa and Minnesota, the ICC said.
The ICC asked that the railroads be prevented from delaying carloads of lumber on their lines while the shipper or broker seeks a market for the shipment.
ICC Chairman Owen Clarke said the delays in shipment often run as long as 20 days. "Such delay results in carriers assuming the storage costs of the lumber dealer... and contributes to the creation of car shortages during peak shipping periods," he said.

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Dimes Drive Will Begin Monday Night

The 1958 Marion County March of Dimes drive will begin with a kick-off dinner Monday at 7:30 at the Senator hotel. N. Thomas Stoddard, state March of Dimes chairman, will be the chief speaker of the no-host dinner.
The entire month of January has been set aside for the drive intended to aid polio victims. Last year during the drive approximately \$18,000 was collected, said Stanley Schofield, Marion County drive chairman.
Of this, half was sent to the national foundation. The county received more than \$20,000 back from the national group for rehabilitation programs, he pointed out.
Various activities to increase funds intake are planned during the drive including Saturday "block of dimes" contests between Salem service clubs. The contests, planned to be held on Liberty Street between State and Chemeketa, will be won by the competing club which manages to get the longest chain of coin contributions.
A Mother's March for contributions is also planned, as are other activities.
Salem chairman for the drive is Al Pfeiffer, North Salem chairman is Gerald Webster, and for South Salem is G. A. Schachtsick.

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Oregon Colleges Got Record Grants, Gifts Past Year

PORTLAND, Dec. 31 (AP) — The state Board of Higher Education today said Oregon's tax-supported colleges received \$2,924,651 in grants and gifts in the past six months.
The funds topped by \$100,000 the money received by the college in the previous year.
Oregon State received \$1,228,495, the University of Oregon Medical School \$1,082,396, University of Oregon \$497,278 and Oregon College of Education \$7,123.
Most of the money will be used in research projects.

It was a second chance for Pedersen on both counts. Last week the judge ordered Pedersen to have the train back by Christmas Eve. Pedersen gave no explanation for his failure but his attorney said his client will start the New Year right.

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
