

Explosion Ruins Yacht; Trio Hurt

SAN PEDRO, Calif., Jan. 5 (AP)—A terrific explosion today destroyed the \$85,000 luxury yacht Gosling and seriously injured three persons. The 78-foot craft's forward deck house was blown 100 feet into the air over Fish Harbor. Aboard were Lazard Lippman, 51, Redlands, Calif., building contractor and owner of the yacht; his nurse, Muriel Bergsater, 51, Alhambra, Calif.; and Cecil Hooten, 31, Long Beach, Calif. They were taken to a hospital where they were found to have been burned over most of their bodies. A Dachshund puppy was found unharmed in a box floating amidst the wreckage.

Final Tribute Paid to Grand Coulee Builder

COULEE DAM, Wash., Jan. 5 (AP)—Final tribute to Frank Arthur Banks, engineer who supervised construction of the giant Grand Coulee Dam, was paid today by 500 persons who filled this eastern Washington town's community church.

Robert J. Newell of Boise, Idaho, retired regional director of the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation, reviewed Banks' life. Newell honored Banks as "the man from Maine who invaded the West to help make deserts bloom in Washington, Idaho and Montana."

Banks, who took up permanent residence in this community after he drove the first stake for the dam in July, 1933, died while vacationing in California last Dec. 14. He was 74.

Police said the blast apparently came from a butane gas tank in the galley. Joe Scalo of San Pedro, on a nearby boat, barely escaped injury from parts of the yacht descending after the deafening blast. "The force of the explosion almost knocked me down," said Scalo. "The deck house almost hit me as it sailed by. I looked into the water and saw Hooten holding Lippman up by his head. Lippman was unconscious. I saw Mrs. Bergsater come staggering out of the wreckage amidst ships. She was badly burned."

Area Catholics To Discontinue Fund-Raising Bingo

PORTLAND, Jan. 5 (AP)—The Oregonian said today it had learned that bingo games and raffles are on the way out as a means of raising funds in Catholic parishes of the Portland Archdiocese.

There has been no official announcement of a ban on such money-raising activities, but the paper said Archbishop Edward D. Howard had indicated his wish that parishes discontinue games of chance.

Soviets Report Big Diamond Find In East Siberia

LONDON, Jan. 5 (AP)—Moscow radio said today a big diamond field has been discovered in the upper reaches of the Aldan River in the Yakut Republic in Eastern Siberia.

"In quality the Yakut diamonds are superior to those in Africa," said Moscow radio. Another diamond field was reported discovered recently west of the Lena River in the same area. Pyotr Antropov, Soviet Minister of Geology, was quoted as saying all Yakut is "a potential source of rare metals." He said oil prospects are also favorable.

Cyprus Commie Leader Returns

NICOSIA, Cyprus, Jan. 5 (AP)—Ezekys Papaioannou, secretary of Cyprus' banned Communist party, returned today after an absence of six months. He was given a tumultuous welcome by 2,000 cheering Cypriot Communist and left-wing trade union officials arrested when the party was banned in December 1955. He escaped a few months in prison and remained in hiding until last summer, when all the officials were released.

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 5 (AP)—Time sneaked back 30 years today at the famed Coconut Grove.

But 1,000 buyers from throughout the nation attending the California fashion creators' spring showing knew better.

The models wearing upside-down flower pot hats, no-waist gowns and other flapper-like apparel were circa 1928, not the rip-roaring Twenties.

The 139 gowns, swim and playsuits previewed indicated that 1958 will be a year of the unfitted sheath, the middy look—the straight up and down look.

Swim suits will have plunging backs and jeweled decorations, with elasticized fabrics, cotton and synthetics.

Wards Clerks Urge Boycott In Strike Call

Retail Clerks Union Local 992 will mark the start of a strike on a national level against Montgomery Ward Co. today by distributing handbills to company employees explaining the union's stand in thepute, local secretary Don E. Hatteburg said Sunday night.

The handbills have been printed and leaflets also are being prepared for public distribution explaining the union's argument and urging a store boycott, he said.

The Retail Clerks Union has called a strike against the company today in several areas of the nation, and in other areas stores and warehouses are to be picketed. The union is not represented in the four company stores in the local district at Salem, Albany, Corvallis and McMinnville.

Hatteburg said no picketing is planned by the local at present.

India, Red Czechs Ask A-Test End, Disarm Confab

NEW DELHI, Jan. 5 (AP)—The prime ministers of India and Communist Czechoslovakia tonight issued a joint call for immediate cessation of nuclear tests and suggested summit talks to achieve disarmament.

The statement was issued at the end of Czech Premier Vilem Siroky's three-day stay in the Indian capital.

He and Prime Minister Nehru said the "most urgent and vital problem is disarmament and an immediate cessation of nuclear and thermonuclear tests would be a first concrete step."

Dutch Official Visits

THE HAGUE, Jan. 5 (AP)—Social Affairs Minister Jacob Suurhoff is visiting South Africa and Rhodesia later this month to discuss Dutch immigration possibilities, notably for Dutch evacuees from Indonesia.

7 Hunters Killed in State During 1957

Seven hunters died from gunshot wounds in Oregon in 1957 and heart attacks took the lives of perhaps a score of others.

The first victim of the season, but not listed by the Game Commission as a direct hunting fatality, was Joseph Johns, 11.

He died Sept. 11 on the Warm Springs Reservation when he fell off the bicycle on which he was carrying a loaded deer hunting rifle to his father.

Only two of the victims were deer hunters: Richard Grafton, 23, Astoria, killed Oct. 4 in the Olney area south of Astoria by a hunting companion, and Emerie McKinley, 45, Portland, killed near Bend Oct. 30 by a bullet from another hunter's gun.

Lewis Ira Dickinson, 61, Portland, died Oct. 27 when a companion's gun fired as they were tracking a cougar near Mulline.

Carrying loaded guns in their cars resulted in the deaths of Donald Olson, 17, Rieth, on Oct. 19, and William Mickelson, 17, Estacada, on Nov. 26.

Bruce C. Rolston, 14, Tillamook, was shot fatally Oct. 27 when a shotgun carried by his brother charged on a duck hunting trip.

Modesto Godinez, 13, of the Stanfield, area, was the final fatality of the year. He was killed when a gun held by his brother accidentally fired.

Birth Control Centers Win Approval in India

NEW DELHI, Jan. 5 (AP)—India's government has provided \$80,000 to open 107 birth control centers, mostly in rural areas. The population, now 300 million, is rising at the rate of 5 million a year.

Queen Elizabeth Considers Visit To India, Pakistan

LONDON, Jan. 5 (AP)—Queen Elizabeth II was reported today to be considering a visit to India and Pakistan—possibly next December.

The independent Sunday Empire News said both the Queen and Prime Minister Macmillan feel a royal trip to India would help Britain strengthen its Commonwealth ties with that country. A trip to Pakistan, the paper added, might help heal the breach between India and Pakistan on the Kashmir issue.

Sweet Potato Payment

MIYASAKI, Japan, Jan. 5 (AP)—Payment in sweet potatoes accounted for more than half the \$70,000 tax revenues of this village district in 1957. A tax official explained farmers find it easier to pay in goods than in cash. The village sells the potatoes to a commercial operator.

Japanese TV Sets Near Million Mark

TOKYO, Jan. 5 (AP)—The number of television set owners in Japan is expected to pass the million mark during the first months of 1958.
