

Marine Drill Instructors Charged In Money Dealings With Recruits

SAN DIEGO, Calif., Jan. 7 (AP)—General courts-martial have been ordered for seven drill instructors at the San Diego Marine Corps recruit depot on charges of having financial dealings with recruits, a depot spokesman disclosed today.

The spokesman also said that Sgt. James J. Housa, a "Drill Instructor of the Year" in 1957, is sought for questioning in connection with the disappearance of \$65 from the staff noncommissioned officers' quarters. Sgt. House, 28, is the son of Mrs. Florence L. Hammond, Dubuque, Iowa. The Marine spokesman said Sgt. House has been AWOL since Jan. 2.

In addition, the spokesman said, four other drill instructors are under investigation on charges involving financial dealings.

Seven charged

The seven drill instructors charged and awaiting the trial were identified as:

Sgt. James L. Shannon, 22, Santa Ana, Calif., charged on two counts of receiving \$326 from recruits and one count of mistreating a recruit.

Military Post Bank Robbed Of \$6,000

FT. CAMPBELL, Ky., Jan. 7 (AP)—A young gunman who preferred gestures to words robbed a branch bank at this military post today, crashed through a road block, and escaped with approximately \$6,000.

Two Army helicopters joined the FBI, state and local police in searching for the bandit, about 19, blond, and of medium build.

Not a word was spoken between the bandit and the manager, Donald Scott, 19, who was alone.

Scott said the gunman entered the Planters Bank & Trust Co. branch, located inside the Army hospital, and motioned with a gun for him to turn around.

"He walked behind the teller's window and emptied two cash drawers into a paper sack he carried," said Scott. "After replacing the drawers, the bandit, wearing a white handkerchief over his face, walked out the door and down the hall to the hospital entrance about 20 feet away."

Scott said he tried to follow but the gunman turned around and motioned for him to remain inside the bank.

A few minutes later, the getaway car roared through a military blockade at one gate and headed toward Hopkinsville.

The bank, one of two on the post, is used by personnel at the hospital.

Ike to Speak At GOP Fund Rally Dinner

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7 (AP)—President Eisenhower lifted the morale of Republican fund-raisers today with a definite decision to speak at a \$100-a-plate party rally in Chicago on the night of Jan. 20.

The White House had expressed some doubt last weekend whether the president's busy schedule this month would permit him to keep the Chicago date as planned in November. Dinner arrangers foresaw a big drop in ticket sales if their top drawing card begged off.

Today's announcement was received with cheers by Illinois leaders.

Edward F. Moore, GOP Cook County chairman, said in Chicago that the president's appearance is settled. "I'm sure we'll have the biggest kickoff ever."

The Eisenhower talk, at the start of his sixth year in office and in the same hall where he was nominated for his first term July 11, 1952, will open the party's 1958 drive to recapture control of Congress in the Nov. 4 elections. The president will speak in Chicago's International Amphitheater.

Several score party dinners will be held in other cities the same night. The president's speech will be carried by television to all the dinners and the public generally.

Vice President Nixon, speaking from New York, will be on the telecast ahead of Eisenhower. At least six Cabinet officers are scheduled to address other dinners, along with many other party bigwigs and White House staff members.

Public Quickly Accepts Free Polio Vaccine

"Public acceptance of free Salk polio vaccine is high and probably all 10,000 of our available shots will be given," it was predicted Tuesday by Dr. Willard Stone, Marion County Health Department director.

Nineteen pre-school children, approximately half of those brought to the regular Silverton well-child clinic Tuesday, were given the vaccine.

This was the first clinic of a six-week series being conducted at schools and county health centers. Shots will be given today at Station and Brooks.

Health department offices were also busy Monday giving 36 polio shots to Salem pre-school children or those unable to get shots at the regular school clinics, Dr. Stone added.

Vaccine for the clinics has been purchased by the Oregon State Board of Health from funds provided by the federal government for people under the age of 20 and pregnant women, Dr. Stone said. Clinics are being conducted by the health department with volunteer doctors and workers.

Bill Introduced For Purchase of Klamath Land

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7 (AP)—Federal purchase of the 700,000-acre Klamath Indian Reservation in Oregon was proposed today in a bill introduced by Rep. Ullman (D-Ore.).

Payment of tribal members would be made over a 20-year period. The price would be determined by an appraisal to be made by representatives of the tribe, the state and the federal government.

Ullman said the bill provides for a continued sustained-yield program under the Forest Service for the estimated four billion board feet of merchantable timber which comprises the Klamath's major assets.
