

U.S. Colleges Caught In Financial Squeeze

NEW YORK, Jan. 12 (AP)—American colleges and universities are in a worse financial squeeze than they have ever been before, the president of the Ford Foundation said today.

"Higher education is beset today by financial difficulties greater than those of any other period in American history," said Henry T. Head.

Body of Girl Found Behind Apartment

CHICAGO, Jan. 12 (AP)—The body of a 12-year-old Negro girl was found sprawled on a porch landing behind her west side apartment today and police were trying to determine if she was the victim of foul play.

The victim was Rosemary Banks, who came with her sister to Chicago to live after their mother died in their Birmingham, Ala., home, Dec. 31.

Police said preliminary investigation failed to bear out their earlier report the girl was beaten, stabbed and raped. They said there were no marks of violence on the body.

The coroner's office said a post-mortem would be necessary to determine the cause of death. It added this would take several days.

The girl apparently died, police said, a few minutes after she left the apartment of her aunt, Mrs. Dorothy Jones, with whom she lived, to visit her grandmother, Mrs. Gertrude Snipe.

The Snipe apartment is diagonally across the alley from Mrs. Jones' apartment at 2059 W. Madison St. The girl's sister, Georgia Lee, 14, told police that Rosemary was afraid to go alone, and that she walked her across the alley and to the stairs of their grandmother's apartment.

The girl never arrived at her grandmother's one floor above. However, her absence was not noted because both the aunt and grandmother assumed she was at the other's home, they told police.

Police said the girl's clothing was in disarray.

Technicians from the police crime laboratory searched for fingerprints while police questioned residents of the area.

Red China, Arabs Sign Trade Pact

HONG KONG, Jan. 12 (AP)—Communist China and the Arab nation of Yemen signed today a commerce treaty and an agreement for scientific, technical and cultural cooperation, Peiping radio reported.

The broadcast said Premier Chou En-lai signed the pact for Red China and Crown Prince Seif al Islam al Badr, Yemen's deputy premier, signed for the Arab nation.

Details of the agreements were not disclosed.

Ike Trying to Discourage GOP Attacks on Demos Supporting Trade, Aid Programs

WASHINGTON, Jan. 12 (AP)—The Eisenhower administration is quietly offering to try to discourage Republican campaign opponents from attacking Democrats for their support of the reciprocal trade and foreign aid programs.

This offer, confirmed by a top rank administration spokesman who referred to remain anonymous, illustrates the plight in which the White House finds itself in trying to push these two key programs through Congress.

As administration officials view the situation, Republican opposition is such they must enlist strong Democratic support for even minimum success toward extending the Reciprocity Trade Act for five years and for preventing drastic cuts in a foreign aid program expected to run around four billion dollars.

Inside TV Ballet Team Makes Hit at Las Vegas

LAS VEGAS, Jan. 12—The Dunes Hotel here, which has made a rather remarkable name for itself since Mayor Riddle took over as president and Bob Rice as secretary a year ago (Major is Mr. Riddle's first name, incidentally, not his military rank), is currently featuring the indestructible acrobatic team of Chiquita and Johnson as a feature of its "Treats of Paris" in the Miniskit tradition.

It helps to be indestructible, for their rehearsal schedule for a recent "Shower of Stars" had them flying out of Las Vegas at 2:30 in the morning, catching a quick nap at their Malibu home, driving into CBS Television City for all-day rehearsals and then flying back to Las Vegas in time for the supper show.

Chiquita is a tiny little thing, standing only 5'2" on tiptoe. Born in Hungary, she started dancing (classical Russian ballet) when she was 5. Johnson was an old friend of her family's. Long a team, they got out of Hungary just two weeks before the Communists took over. Her sister, Kvetta, called Kay for short, who now plays the organ for their act (and stands 5'8" in contrast to Chiquita), stayed on and saw two of her friends killed while trying to escape from the Russians.

But like so many Europeans, they've found both success and happiness in America. They command good money, are constantly in demand and have no problems other than keeping in shape for their difficult dance routines.

They're current buzz, like everyone else up here, about Riddle's \$6,000,000 300-room 18-story addition to the Dunes, which will make it the tallest building in Las Vegas, the tallest in Nevada and one of the tallest in the entire West.

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Solon Attacks Secrecy Tactics Of White House

WASHINGTON, Jan. 12 (AP)—Sen. Hennings (D-Mo.) said today the administration's refusal to release the Gaither report is in line with what he called its assertion of virtually unlimited power to withhold information from Congress.

The report, recently submitted to the President by a group of prominent citizens after a lengthy study of national security requirements, reportedly was that the United States faces its gravest peril in history.

Hennings said the administration's refusal to release the report either to Congress or the public is "deplorable" but not surprising.

He added in a statement: "Withholding of information from both the public and Congress unfortunately seems to have become rather commonplace in recent years, so it really shouldn't surprise anyone that the administration insists on keeping secret a document as embarrassing and explosive as the Gaither report is reputed to be."

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Indonesia Leader Pays Egypt Call

CAIRO, Egypt, Jan. 12 (AP)—President Sukarno of Indonesia arrived here today for an unofficial visit on the second leg of his six-week tour of African-Asian countries. He had been in India.

President Nasser, diplomatic representatives and Egyptian officials greeted him at the airport.

Sukarno, who is believed to be seeking the support of African-Asian countries to oust the Dutch from West New Guinea, had been scheduled to leave here Friday for Pakistan, but there was talk he might stay until Sunday and then go to Syria.

Spellman Urges India, Americans Work Together

BOMBAY, India, Jan. 12 (AP)—Francis Cardinal Spellman, archbishop of New York, today urged that the peoples of India and America work together for the peace and prosperity of the world.

The cardinal made the appeal during mass at Bombay cathedral. He said Roman Catholics have a special responsibility in preserving world peace.

The New York archbishop announced a donation of \$10,000 to the archbishop of Bombay for use in Catholic charities.

Valerian Cardinal Gracias, Bombay's archbishop, was host to Cardinal Spellman, who is heading homeward after his annual Christmas visit with U.S. troops in Korea.

Reorganizing Complex Defense Department Will Not Be Easy

WASHINGTON, Jan. 12 (AP)—President Eisenhower's proposal to reorganize the Defense Department into a form for "decisive central direction" must begin with the fact that there are 28 civilian secretaries, deputy secretaries and assistant secretaries running the department and the three military services.

And there are dozens of general and admirals.

The office of the Secretary of Defense alone has about 2,300 persons on its staff, of whom about 1,600 are civilians, the others military personnel assigned to the office.

This 2,300-man staff of the office of the secretary — which is the Defense Department as distinguished from the departments of the Army, Navy and Air Force — does not include thousands of others who wear the uniform of work in civilian capacity for the services but whose operations are directly related to the over-all Defense Department.

Three of these agencies alone have a combined personnel roll of about 135,000, directed by administrative chiefs.

The three agencies are part of the unified system, under the control of the Defense Department instead of the separate services. The Armed Forces Special Weapons Project, concerned primarily with the development of nuclear weapons, has about 9,000 personnel, military and civilian. The Military Sea Transport Service has about 14,934. The Military Air Transport Service has approximately 121,000, of whom more than 100,000 are military personnel comprising the air and ground crews for operating the globe-girdling system.

Eisenhower, in his State of the Union message Thursday, said he has under way a special study of the Pentagon organization, that he expects to reach conclusions soon, and that he then "shall promptly take such executive action as is necessary and, in a separate message, I shall present appropriate recommendations to the Congress."

He said, too, that decisive central direction is needed to end interservice disputes.

But in his Thursday message the President did not indicate whether he thought the structural organization of the Defense Department is satisfactory as it stands or should be changed.

Some critics have contended there are too many administrators, that the department has drifted far from its original idea.

Dan A. Kimball, former secretary of the Navy, blasted at the present setup in a recent address. He said the late James Forrestal, first secretary of defense, visualized "a small organization of perhaps 100 persons who would set policy for the military departments." But, said Kimball, "it has grown into a supergroup of more than 5,000 persons and if we don't stop it, it will go to 25,000 and then we'll really be in confusion."

Actually, the office of secretary of defense started off with more than the 100 persons that Kimball said Forrestal planned.
