British Press Dissatisfied With Ike Letter

LONDON, Monday, Jan. 13 (AP)—President Eisenhower's reply to Moscow's summit meeting proposal was weighed and found wanting by much of the British press today.

"There was no answering challenge. No inspiration," complained the Conservative Daily Mail. "No new proposals to fire the imagination or regain the initiative for the West."

The Laborite Daily Herald asserted that U. S. Secretary of State Dulles, "with his eternal 'no, no, no,' is becoming as great a menace to peace as was Mr. Molotov in the first years after the war."

The Independent Daily Express said the British public "will not be satisfied by declarations that the Russians must first of all demonstrate a sincere desire for peace."

"The Russians have said over and over again that peace is, in fact, their desire," the Express commented. "That repeated assertion should be taken at its face value until new facts prove it false."

The Communist Daily Worker summarized its view of the Eisenhower reply with the headline "The bars way to summit."

The Liberal News Chronicle felt that Eisenhower's expressed willingness to take part in top-level talks if the ground can first be prepared through diplomatic negotiations is at least "more realistic than Mr. Dulles showed himself in his first reactions."

"To get into a huff whenever the Russians ask for talks is starling," the newspaper declared. "There was growing support in the press and from some British political leaders for a summit conference with the Russians."

Vatican Rejects Moscow Peace Talk Proposal

VATICAN CITY, Jan. 12 (AP)—Vatican circles said tonight a rapprochement between the Vatican and the Soviet Union is impossible because of Russia's atheistic communism and bars to freedom of religion.

Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko was quoted in Moscow yesterday as saying the Soviet Union would welcome contact with the Vatican "on all questions concerning the defense of peace." Gromyko's statement was reported by a defrocked Catholic priest who is a member of an Italian "partisans for peace" delegation to the Soviet capital.

But Vatican sources recalled numerous statements by Roman Catholic churchmen, including Pope Pius XII, about the difficulties of reaching any kind of understanding with the Communists.

One source said: "The two parties—Russia and the Vatican—find themselves in a position where difference of language makes all conversation and contact impossible."

Don Gaggero, the defrocked priest, told reporters in Moscow Gromyko thought the Pope and the Kremlin substantially agree on the problems of preserving peace and this agreement "could serve as the basis for the establishment of future relations between the Soviet Union and the Vatican."

Senator Asks Probe Into UAW Violence

WASHINGTON, Jan. 12 (AP)—Sen. Butler (R-Ind.) said today he has asked the Senate Rackets Committee to investigate what he called acts of violence by "Walter Reuther's goons" during a strike against the Perfect Circle Corp. of Hagerstown, Ind.

The committee already has said it is investigating incidents in the strike as part of its probe of the United Auto Workers, which Reuther heads. Reuther also is a vice president of the AFL-CIO.

Schmidt Lauds College Credit Course Step

A program adopted last week by University of Oregon which will enable students to receive college credit for college-level courses taken in high school is welcome news to Salem School District. Supt. Charles D. Schmidt said Sunday.

The new program will be used in conjunction with the district's two-year-old educational advancement program now involving some 40 gifted children in studies beyond their normal age level, he said.

The oldest of the educationally advanced children will enter junior high school this fall. Plans have already been made for their junior high school work and the new move taken by the university now solves the heretofore unanswered question of how to hold their interest in high school Schmidt said.

Salem educators were hoping for such a plan but could do nothing about college credits until the university made its move, he explained.

The program is used by 133 colleges and universities but this is its first application in Oregon, Dean Robert D. Clark of the university's liberal arts college said.

Examinations will be given in fields of composition, literature, European and American history, French, German, Latin, Spanish, biology, chemistry, physics and mathematics.

They will be available immediately to high schools in which college-credit plans have been instituted with other colleges, Clark said. The program will be offered this fall to schools which introduce college-level courses.

Bombs Planted In 3 Canadian Movie Houses

TRAIL, B. C., Jan. 12 (CP)—Sixteen men in a vigil RCMP searched movie houses throughout the West Kootenays Saturday for explosives following discovery of home-made bombs in three theaters.

Staff Sgt. William J. Mackay, RCMP patrol sergeant for this district, said it was "just by the grace of God" that many people were not killed or mangled by the planted bombs. In each case the fuse had been ignited but apparently fizzled out.

The bombs, all identical, consisted of fruit cans containing five sticks of dynamite and stuffed inside a pasteboard carton. They were planted Friday night in the Odco Theater here, the Civic Theater in Nelson and the Castle Theater in Castlegar.

Those at Castlegar and Nelson were discovered after closing time Friday night. The Trail bomb was discovered Saturday morning.

Undoubtedly to be suspects are the Doukhobors, a sect which has been blamed for a number of bombings in the Kootenays in the past.

Ike, Nixon Off-Record Meet Re-Set

WASHINGTON, Jan. 12 (AP)—The Republican National Committee today rescheduled for Jan. 31 an off-the-record conference with President Eisenhower and Vice President Nixon on a "frank appraisal" of the party's prospects.

The meeting had been set for Dec. 6 but was postponed when Eisenhower suffered a mild stroke on Nov. 25.

GOP National Chairman Meade Alcorn said today the original arrangements will be followed on the new date.

Eisenhower will talk to committee members at a breakfast at the Hotel Statler. After an executive session of the committee the members will be addressed by Nixon at luncheon. All sessions will be closed to the press.
